Keith 'K.O. Masters' to be honoured

The Allora Cricket Club are organising to take a significant step in recognising one of their favourite sons and the only Life Member of the Club reformed in 2006. The tranguil Allora Cricket Ground, the venue for so many white flannelled battles over so many decades will be officially named the 'Keith (K. O.) Masters Memorial Oval'.

The official naming will occur on Sunday October 25th at the Allora Cricket Grounds where Keith's widow Mrs. Maureen Masters will unveil the sign announcing the cricket oval's new title. The official naming will be followed by a 20/20 cricket match between a Masters family Invitational side and the Allora Cricket Club.

Allora community members are invited to the naming ceremony and the following celebrations that recognise the tremendous contribution made by Keith Masters to the sport of cricket locally and across the Darling Downs.

A well respected and instantly recognised gentleman in the Allora community, and throughout much of the wider area, Keith Masters passed away aged 84 on September 14th, 2013, after a lengthy period of illness. Keith, popularly known as 'K.O.' has many family members in the Allora area, being a father, Grandfather & Great Grandfather.

Since the reforming of the Allora Cricket Club, Keith was a regular at the Allora Oval for weekend fixtures with his remarkable wit and amazing knowledge of the game of cricket. He himself played countless games over his sporting life at the Allora Oval.

He was a long serving Patron of the Warwick Cricket Association until his passing, a Life Member of the Eastern Downs Cricket Association (Toowoomba, Warwick etc), an organisation he presided over for many years, a delegate to the Queensland Country Cricket Association and is the only Life Member of the reformed Allora Cricket Club.

In his younger years he loved playing sport around the district. His sports were cricket of course, hockey and tennis, gifted at all of them, but his great love was cricket. He was an outstanding batsman, and excellent wicketkeeper, and was a member of Allora, Warwick and Toowoomba representative teams, and led Allora to three premiership wins as captain.

After his playing years he became a highly regarded umpire. On one occasion, he was selected in a composite representative cricket side that played against a team that contained Richie Benaud (later Aust. Captain) Ray Lindwall, the feared Test fast bowler. Arthur Morris the great left-handed opening batsman for Australia, Jim Bourke also an Australian Test player and Tom Brook NSW representative bowler and later a famous Test



ALLORA'S ANZACS REMEMBERED: A project by the Allora Historical Society

PRIVATE SETH THOMAS

William and Mary Ann Elizabeth Thomas (nee Cox) were married in Tenterfield in 1877. In the early 1890s they came to Allora where Seth was born in 1897. When Seth was only nine

years old, his father drowned in Dalrymple Creek. William was aged seventy-one years, and had a history of depression. Mary worked as a domestic to support her two youngest children. After her husband died, Mary resided at their Warwick Street home and remarried E. H. Gregory.

Three Thomas brothers enlisted for active service. Charles Arthur enlisted in 1915 and became a driver with 'B' Company 49th Battalion. He served at Gallipoli and in France. Henry Joseph enlisted in Marrickville, New South Wales, and served as driver with the 27th Cov ASC. Seth enlisted in Toowoomba at the Darling Downs Central Recruiting Depot. He was nineteen years old and working as a labourer when he signed up on 14th September 1916. He had previously held a three year exemption from military service.

Private Seth Thomas, regimental number 2989, became a member of the 7th Reinforcement of the 52nd Battalion. The reinforcements left from Brisbane aboard A74 "Marathon" on 27th October 1916, and on landing at Plymouth started training at the 13th Training Battalion, before leaving for France on 25th June 1917. Seth became sick at sea and during this time spent some time in hospital suffering from bronchitis. His Casualty Form shows that he was taken on strength with the 52nd Battalion in the field at Harve on 16th July. Over the next few

months he had recurring health problems and had a hernia operation at the 53rd General Hospital. On recovery, he re-joined the battalion in the line at Messines. On the 11th May 1918 he was shot in the chest. He died of his wounds the next day at 3.50 am at the 12th Australian Field Hospital. Seth was buried by Rev. H. H. Harper near Amiens in the Longeau British Cemetery, Picardie, France

The Red Cross Wounded and Missing Files show that as well as Charles and Seth, two nephews were also serving in France. William John Skinner (son of Fanny Elizabeth Skinner nee Thomas) and William Hodson (son of Mary Ann Eliza Hodson nee Thomas) made contact enquiring about the circumstance of his death and the whereabouts of his grave and wanting a photo for their respective mothers. William Hodson had heard of his uncle's death from Australia, he wrote (that) "I may have the chance some day of standing beside the graveside of one who was a very close relative to me". A witness had reported that Seth was wounded at Villers Brenonneax at 8.30pm. They were holding a line in front of the trenches. Four men were making their way to the advanced listening post, Seth was last in the line. He was sniped through the chest. It was a bad wound but Seth was conscious. He was treated and carried back to the Regimental Aid Post before being transferred to the 12th Australian Field Hospital where he died.

Base Records sent the details of Seth's death to his mother. brothers and nephews and also to Miss L. Crouch of Dundee, NSW, and advised that a 'durable wooden cross bearing Seth's name and full regimental particulars was erected over

Seth's medals, the memorial scroll and plaque, and two parcels containing his personal effects were sent to Mary.




