

Military History of Ellis Family

Henry George Augustus Ellis aged twenty one years and ten months enlisted in the A.I.F at Toowoomba on 13th September 1915. His brother William Charles Lonsdale Ellis enlisted on the 28th November 1915 aged nineteen years and nine months. They were sons of Augustus Lonsdale and Annie (nee Slatter) Ellis. They both worked on the family dairy farm.

The brothers who were known as George and Charlie were given a send-off at the Royal Hotel when they were home on leave from Enoggera Camp. George Ellis senior had recently become proprietor of the hotel and with his wife entertained a number of townspeople to honour them in volunteering for the front. The Chairman of the Allora Shire Council, Mr T Muir presided and proposed a toast to them. The Allora Guardian reported on the function saying that all who knew the lads will wish them well. They left by mail train the next day.

Henry George Augustus Ellis

George Ellis was initially assigned to the 26th Battalion but on arrival overseas from Brisbane aboard HMAT "Wandilla' A62 was taken on strength with the 31st Battalion at Duntroon Plateau, Egypt on 6th April 1916 with the Regiment No. 3799 with the rank of private.

The 31st Battalion was raised as part of the 8th Brigade at Enoggera. They joined the 5th Australian Division in Egypt

Allora's Past 100 years ago October 1915

Allora Convent

The foundation block of the Allora convent-to-be was laid out and solemnly blessed by the Rev. Father Carroll after 10 o'clock mass on Sunday last. Thanks to the energy of Father Carroll and his very zealous band of workers, sufficient funds are in hand to justify the laying of the block. Considering that it is a very

short while since the fine new Presbytery and other church improvements were completed this is a very gratifying result, and one extremely creditable to the Roman Catholic congregation. The parish has certainly made remarkable strides since Father Carroll took charge less than 18 months ago.

Tenders are called in this issue for the erection of the convent.

Allora's Past 125 years ago October 1890

New Q. N. Bank

Mr. H. Hack has commenced operations at the new Queensland National Bank which has a frontage of 64ft to Drayton Street and a depth of 110ft. Mr. J. Sharpe, the foreman, informs me that he intends putting on a numerous staff of hands in order that the premises will be completed without delay.

the Germans retreated to the Hindenburg Line.

George was to suffer from the harsh winter conditions in the trenches. He was treated for trench feet at the 5th General Hospital at Rouen. He re-joined the unit for a couple of months before being admitted to the Casualty Clearing Station in the field with bronchitis. George had been gassed while in the trenches. He was transferred back to England and admitted to the London General Hospital. He spent some time recuperating at Weymouth until he returned to Australia aboard HT "Euripides" on 30th January 1918. He was discharged from the army with chronic deafness to both ears. His discharge papers show that he served abroad for two years and fifty-four days due to "being medically unfit, not due to misconduct". He was awarded the British War Medal and the Victory Medal.

George married Olive Emily Neal in 1919. They had a family of ten children. When World War Two broke out, George volunteered for service. He was then forty five years old. He was not accepted but joined the Voluntary Defence Force in Allora.

George was a member of the Allora branch of the R.S.L. Olive continued her work with the Ladies Auxiliary after George died in 1968. George had suffered emphysema since his war



service.

William Charles Lonsdale Ellis

Charles Ellis had served in the Darling Downs Light Horse. He left Australia aboard the "Seang Choon" on 19th September 1916 assigned to the 31st Battalion. The ship landed at Plymouth, England on 9th December 1916. Charles did not fulfil his wish to fight for his country, he contracted meningitis and returned to Australia on 4th May 1917. Charles was awarded the British War Medal and the Victory Medal.

The names of Privates G Ellis and W C L Ellis are honoured on Allora's WW1 Memorial as having served their country.

Ronald George Ellis – Son served Airforce (Supplier Planes Transport Unit) – "Biscuit Bombers" in Middle East WW2

Alfred Roland (Rolly) Ellis – Son served with the 1st Royal Australian Regiment in Korea and Japan

Athol Neal Ellis - Son served with Airforce in Singapore

Kevin Collins – Son-in-law served with Airforce Iwakuni Air Base Japan WW2

Ronald Kelly – Grandson served in army in Vietnam

Danielle Collins – Great granddaughter served with Airforce in Afghanistan

Shikira Wilson – Great great granddaughter served in Naval Cadets

Our region on NBN's plan for superfast internet

NBN recently released its accelerated three-year rollout plan for superfast broadband internet and our Federal MP Bruce Scott made sure our region was on the list with 22 other localities listed in the Maranoa electorate.

In Queensland about 1.9 million homes and businesses have NBN access or will have construction underway by September 2018.

"In the Maranoa, about 38,900 premises are set to be connected including 500 premises in Allora and 700 in Clifton," Mr Scott said

"The release of this plan is an important milestone as NBN Co works to speed up the rollout's progress and construct the network as cost-effective as possible.

"This new rollout plan - which extends to September 2018 provides a breakdown of when the network will start to be constructed in specific locations.

"The Maranoa electorate covers about 42% of Queensland and I have long-fought for better communication outcomes and infrastructure in the bush and my advocacy is represented in the Coalition Government's NBN Policy.

"The majority of Queensland's agricultural wealth is generated in rural areas and we have much to gain by accessing reliable, high-speed internet."

All services over the NBN will allow families to stream movies, surf the web and complete schoolwork online - all at one time and small businesses are to benefit from the large bandwidth increase.

"These rural and remote areas in the Maranoa will greatly benefit from e-learning, tele-medicine, video conferencing, tourism and business opportunities which a faster internet connection will provide," Mr Scott said.

"Rollout progress under the former Labor Government was slow and costly and that's why this Coalition Government is committed to the regions by closing the digital divide."

New helmet laws for Queensland quad bikers

The State's peak motoring body has alerted guad bike riders and passengers to new laws which would soon make it compulsory for them to wear helmets when using public roads or related spaces.

RACQ Executive Manager Technical and Safety Policy Steve Spalding said new mandatory helmet rules which come into effect on 1 November would help save lives.

"Too many Queenslanders are being killed and seriously injured in quad bike incidents, so this is a good first step in improving quad bike safety," Mr Spalding said.

"However we'd encourage the use of helmets wherever

possible, particularly when it comes to off-road recreational riders.

"We know quad bikes are an essential part of life on many farms, and it's vital that all quad biker riders are fully aware of the dangers these very capable machines pose if used incorrectly or unsafely."

Mr Spalding said the law change was a direct result of recommendations from the State Coroner's investigation into guad bike related deaths.

"The Coroner's report shows head injuries account for a third of quad bike fatalities, and in 84 percent of those cases people weren't wearing helmets," he said.

CareFlight Critical Care Doctor C Juni Jobson said RACQ CareFlight Rescue crews flew to the aid of 87 people injured in recreational vehicle accidents in 2014-15.

"Severe injuries are mainly caused by lack of helmets or other protective equipment, rider inexperience or dangerous behaviour," Dr Jobson said.

"Often riders assume four wheels offer better stability than a two-wheeled motorbike, however, at moderate speeds and on slopes quad bikes are prone to tipping and rolling.



Bantams are an ideal pet for kids. They teach them responsibility in the care of an animal, they are gentle & love being picked up


