



Now's the time to check your water meter

In the lead-up to the next round of water meter reads, and with the number of residential requests for water rates relief due to excessive consumption from water leaks on the rise, Council is urging residents to check their water meter regularly.

Southern Downs Regional Council's Manager Water and Wastewater. Mr Tendekai Mapeza said residents should regularly check their water meter to detect any leaks and should also check that there are no leaks around water meters and other water infrastructure on their properties such as tap connections

"Property owners need to be aware that they are responsible for the water infrastructure on their property's side of the water meter, including the repairs of any leaks in pipes or fixtures.

"It's also their responsibility to keep the water meter boxes free from debris, grass, garden mulch, soil and other obstacles such as ant nests.

"Undertaking occasional clearing of debris, grass and dirt from around and within the water meter box saves money by reducing the time taken to locate and read a meter.

"Now is also the time to make sure your water consumption is on track, your meter is reading correctly and you don't have any leaks around the meter itself or elsewhere on your property. "By checking the numeric display regularly, you will be able to determine whether excessive amounts of water are being used." said Mr Mapeza.

It is recommended that residents perform an overnight leakage test to check for any leakage at pipes and taps.

If you read your water meter last thing at night and then first thing in the morning you can calculate how much water is being lost through leakage. The volume of water 'lost' overnight is the difference between the morning reading and previous night's reading. For this to be accurate, you must not use any water during the night.

If you lose more than one litre per hour, you should tightly close off taps and or check for dripping taps, faulty toilet cisterns or other forms of leakage.

Any more than 10 litres lost per hour is very significant and should definitely be investigated by a plumber.

Water meter readings will start on February 29. Water rates notices are due to be issued on 13 April 2016, with payment due by 13 May 2016.


