



#### Decision on the request to relocate the Gates from Leslie Park to Glengallan Homestead deferred

Council has deferred consideration of the request from the Glengallan Homestead Trust to relocate the Leslie Centenary Memorial Gates to Glengallan Homestead.

The Gates, which are also known as the Glengallan Gates, are located at the south-western entrance to Leslie Park in Warwick. The four sandstone pillars and the iron gates were gifted to Council by the then owner of Glengallan Homestead, Oswald Slade, in 1940 to mark the centenary of the Leslie Brothers settling in the area. Council undertook public consultation in regards to the proposed relocation of the Gates and received 246 submissions in relation to the proposal to relocate the Gates, 76 of which were in support of the relocation and 170 objecting to the proposal.

Early last week, Council received advice from the Department of Environment and Heritage Protection that they had received an application to enter the Leslie Centenary Memorial Gates in to the Queensland Heritage Register.

All of Leslie Park is included on the Queensland Heritage

Register, but the listing is specifically for the Warwick War Memorial and Gates. There is no information in the current heritage register entry relating to the Leslie Centenary Memorial Gates.

Council determined that until such time as the Department has dealt with the application to State heritage list the Gates, they were unable to decide this matter.

This year he is hoping to go one better when the Queensland side takes on NSW in the curtain raiser to the third Ashes Test against Great Britain.

Sergeant R. G. Deacon, Corporals W. Marshall, J. Gilmore, R. Ellis, W. Petersen, and Privates Head, G. Neale, E. Stent, S. Carney, P. George, J. Brown and R. Lippett who are spending time with their families in the Allora district, and who returned recently from the Middle East, were given a welcome home in the Central Hall on Tuesday evening. At the same function a farewell was tendered to Sergeant Pilot L. Morris and Private J. Marshall. Of the men who are returning to Allora, Corporal W. Marshall saw service in the first Libyan campaign and later in Greece and Crete. Sergeant Deacon was

taken prisoner of war during the campaign and released at the Armistice. The men were enthusiastically welcomed by 400 people who thronged the Central Hall and who were representative of all parts of Allora and neighbouring districts.

#### Allora's Past 100 years ago May 1917

Lieutenant J. Burge

On page 64 of the Anzac School Paper for the 5th and 6th classes, 1917, appears an illustration showing four Anzacs in a trench on Gallipoli. Although no definite information is yet to hand, the soldier using the periscope with his back against the trench is universally taken to be the late Lieutenant J. Burge, of Allora, who was killed in action at Quinn's Post in August, 1915. All those who have seen the illustration and who knew the late officer, are decided in their opinion that it is "Joe Burge". The writer, who was an intimate friend, is of that opinion also.

#### Allora's Past 150 years ago May 1867 Fatal Accident

It is regret that we have to chronicle the death by accident of Mr. Charles H. Bullock, the recently appointed pound keeper at Allora. While racing on Tuesday evening at about 6 o'clock along the Spring Creek road, with a man named Ferguson, a groom in the employ of Cobb & Co, his horse fell, from some, as yet unknown cause, striking Bullock on the head while on the ground. He was senseless until his death on the next evening. Every possible attention was paid to him in the Spring Creek Hotel, into which he was taken immediately after the accident, under the supervision of Dr. Labatt. The unfortunate deceased was much respected in the neighbourhood, and has only held his appointment for about two months.

To a standing room only audience in the school hall, Principal Shaun Kanowski welcomed all and presided over the official ceremony in which the celebration cake was cut, the school song sung and honour boards unveiled. Past students Rae Masters, Jim Deacon, Gayle (Telford) McAlpin, Jo Denny and Gretta (Hentschel) Barton and past principal Barry Finch assisted in the ceremony, along with the school's youngest student, Jay Saylor-Smith.

Later in the morning there was the ceremonial opening of the time capsule which was located, buried in 1981 and celebrating Queensland Day and following that the packing and sealing of the time capsule to mark this occasion. This time capsule, beautifully encased in silver canister will take pride of place alongside trophies and shields in the trophy cabinet and in 25 years should easily be located for the 175th.

Glorious weather enhanced the convivial atmosphere which surrounded the day as past students and staff returned to the place of school and work to reminisce with old friends about the wonderful times had at Allora State School. Memories were jogged by the displays



of photos and memorabilia and there was no shortage of excited conversation amongst those gathered.







Allora State School celebrated 5 generations enrolled over the past 150 years, dating back to the 1900's. Doris Masters (nee Holmes) first attended the school when it was located in Herbert Street, Allora. The school was then relocated and opened in 1911 at Warwick Street, Allora, where it is still located today.

Following Doris was her daughter Rae who enrolled in 1930 and her son Keith in 1934.

The third generation to attend was Keith's son and







daughter, Neil enrolled in 1961 followed by his sister Linda in 1963.

Neil's children also enrolled, Allison, Cameron and Stuart, continuing the tradition and becoming the 4th generation to enrol. Linda's 2 sons, David and Robert also attended.

Allison May's (nee Masters) oldest son Lewis May became the 5th generation to enrol in Prep in 2012, he was later followed by his brothers Marty in 2014 and Jonte in 2016 along side, Cameron's eldest daughter Sophie Masters who is still carrying on the Masters name.

Next year will see Dustyn, Allison's 4th child and Chelsea, Cameron's 2nd daughter following in their sibling's footsteps.






