Allora Led Steer Reserve Champion at Ekka

A local steer, owned by Michael & Toni Dwan of Elwanvale Stockhorses & Limousins, has won Reserve Champion heavyweight steer at the Ekka this year.

There were over 400 led steers at this year's

Ekka. It was certainly a sight to see that many top quality steers at one show.

The steer, named Elwanvale Mars Bar, was bred and fed on their property. He is a black limousin. He weighed 624kg at 13 months old and dressed 369.8kg (59.2%). Meat yield was 62.8%. Eye muscle area was 118mm with full points awarded for meat colour and fat colour. 4 points out of a possible 5 for marbling.

Elwanvale Mars Bar was specifically with the aim of participating at the led steer show at Ekka. He is out of a cow called Chocolate. He is by a bull called Stetson who is a leading carcass sire in North America.

A limousin heifer from Elwanvale also came second in her class and their bull came 5th out of a strong class of 17.

SDRC REJECTS FEEDLOT APPLICATION

The application for a 3150 feedlot on Colliery Park Road Allora was rejected by the Council on Wednesday, 23rd August. Residents are pleased with the outcome.

Several assessment criteria were not met by the applicant. Some of these related to soil quality, values of community members, Colliery Park Road not up to standard, insufficient truck access, significantly larger than the recommended 150 SCU as in planning scheme and the interpretation of "small scale" intensive animal industry, nuisance to other properties, proximity of 4.2 kilometres from Clifton when distance required is 6 kilometres.

Fifty-three submissions were received with concerns relating to buffer zones, water, odour, incompatibility with current land use, proposed traffic routes, impact to residents, impact on environment, organic farm concerns, conflict with character of the area, to name a few.

around 12.8, with very remote areas having a rate of 21.5.2 "A range of circumstances specific to remote areas place rural Australians at greater risk of self-harm, including greater vulnerability to weather events and economic change, isolation and loneliness, social stigma and stoicism, and reduced access to support services," says Georgie Harman, CEO of beyondblue.

These statistics have prompted an ongoing partnership between leading animal health company, Zoetis, and national, not-for-profit organisation, beyondblue. work through a structured safety plan. While everyone's plan will be unique to them, the process and structure are the same – it prompts you to work through the steps until you feel safe. So far, the app has already been downloaded almost 17,000 times.

beyondblue's online forums bring together people affected by mental health conditions, including carers and friends, so they can talk to others in similar circumstances at any time. This can be done anonymously and safely in the online forums which are moderated by a combination of professionals and community champions.

The best place to start is to begin a conversation about mental health – asking how a mate or relative is travelling – can often be the first step in a journey to recovery.

Allora Rural Watch: Rural Area Police Report (03/06/17 – 20/07/17)

3rd June: A 64 year-old Rosenthal Heights woman was charged with low range drink driving after being intercepted in Forde St, Allora. She appeared in Warwick Magistrates Court on 5th July and was fined \$500 and disqualified from driving for 4 months.

9th June: A 25 year-old Allora man was arrested in Forde Street for public nuisance and placed in the rear of the police vehicle. He then proceeded to kick out the passenger window of the vehicle and attempt to escape. He was charged with public nuisance, wilful damage of police property and obstruct police. He was transported to Warwick watch house and bailed to appear on 5th July. He was fined \$1000 and ordered to pay \$1016.63 restitution to Queensland Police Service to cover the damage to the vehicle.

11th June: Two juveniles committed a public nuisance offence outside the Blue Care facility in Darling Street Allora when they yelled threats and abuse to two of the female staff there. The male juvenile was given a move on direction on the day and later charged and officially cautioned over the matter. The other juvenile was charged and appeared in Warwick Children's Court on 4th July where she was given a reprimand by the Magistrate.

16th June: A 37 year-old Warwick man was intercepted for speeding along Warwick Allora Road at Massie for riding his motorcycle at 174km/hr. He was issued a \$1177 fine and 8 demerit points and is now subject to vehicle immobilisation should he commit any similar offences in the next 5 years.

24th June: A male person in a stolen silver Holden Commodore stole petrol from the Freedom Fuels service station Allora. Police believe the same male then attended Bunnings in Warwick and stole a number of power tools. The vehicle was then involved in 2 evade police incidents in Warwick. An arrest warrant has been issued for a 38 year-old Toowoomba male.

27th June: About 4:30am a vehicle left the New England Hwy at Glengallan into Glengallan Creek. The driver was not located. Vehicle was towed from the scene to determine that there were no injured or deceased persons in the vehicle. Investigations are continuing.

2nd July: A 28 year-old Birnam man was charged with trespass after a West Talgai property owner complained to Police about persons shooting on his property without permission. The man appeared in Warwick Magistrates Court on 16th August and was fined \$800.

8th July: A 41 year-old Hendon female was charged with low range drink driving after being intercepted in Forde St, Allora. She appeared in Warwick Magistrates Court on 3rd August and was fined \$400 and disqualified from driving for 1 month

12th July: An unknown middle aged bald male attempted to steal goods from the Allora IGA. When confronted by the store owner he threw the goods down and ran out of the store. Police are still investigating.

13th July: A 23 year-old Elbow Valley female was intercepted for repeat unlicensed driving on the New England Hwy, Allora. She appeared in Warwick Magistrates Court on 16th August and was fined \$500 and was disqualified for a further 3 months. As this was her 4th offence in 5 years her car was seized and is subject to forfeiture.
