At a special meeting of the Allora Shire Council on Monday, a petition signed by 133 names was received asking for the repeal of the by-law imposing a tax on dogs. After a long discussion on a motion that the by-law be abolished, the motion was defeated on the casting vote of the chairman.

Allora's Past 125 years ago October 1892

Fire at Allora

The flour mill owned by Messrs Gisler Bros. of Toowoomba was destroyed by fire yesterday morning. The fire was noticed shortly after 4 o'clock by which time it had obtained a strong hold on the interior of the building. A crowd soon gathered with buckets but there was no chance of saving the mill. The heat was intense but fortunately the wind blew the flames away from adjacent buildings, and a heavy downpour of rain shortly afterwards removed all fear of the fire spreading. In about an hour the building was completely destroyed and nothing remains but a heap of fire blasted machinery and galvanised roofing iron. The origin of the fire is unknown but incendiarism is suspected. Gisler brothers arrived from Toowoomba this morning. Great sympathy is felt for them and the destruction of the mill is felt to be a misfortune for the whole district.

(The flour mill was built by Francis Kates in 1871 on land in Drayton Street adjoining the now Commercial Hotel. In the photo of Drayton Street looking east from Forde Street taken in 1894, the smoke stack which was all that was left following the fire, can be seen behind the hotel)

pulled up outside the Allora State School to drop their children off. The woman appeared in the Warwick Magistrates Court on 6th September and received a \$300 fine.

14/8/17: A 13 year-old Hendon boy was charged with unlawfully taking wildlife and dangerous conduct with a weapon after shooting a galah with a bow and arrow and leaving it to die on the road. The youth was also charged with unrelated liquor offences and placed on strict bail conditions, including exclusion from Allora and a curfew. He remains on those bail conditions until his next mention in Warwick Children's Court on 7th November.

24/8/17: A 77 year-old Deuchar man was charged with contravening a domestic violence order after an incident occurred in Allora. His matter is mentioned in Warwick Magistrates Court on 6th November.

30/8/17: An elderly couple from Stanthorpe both died from a single vehicle crash northbound on the New England Highway near Spring Creek. Speed was a major contributing factor. Police urge all road users to drive responsibly and to the prevailing conditions.

23/8/17: A Goomburra couple were both charged under the provisions of the Education Act for wilfully disturbing the good order of an educational facility after a meeting with the Allora School Principal deteriorated into aggressive abuse and threats towards the Principal disturbing the whole administration block. They both re-appear in Warwick Magistrates Court on 29th November.

2/9/17: a 40 year-old Allora female was intercepted by Warwick Road Policing Unit in Warwick Street, Allora for the purpose of a drug test. The test revealed a positive result. Police are now waiting on the results of laboratory blood tests before taking any further action.

10/9/17: Police were called out at 5am to reports that a vehicle had run off the road while attempting to pass a very wide load under Police escort on the New England Highway. An unlicensed 17 year-old Warwick male, driving an unregistered and uninsured vehicle panicked when he saw an oncoming police escort car directing him to pull over and stop. Instead of stopping for the wide load he evaded the direction of the police vehicle and drove past it, and a second police vehicle which also directed the driver to stop, heading straight for the wide load. The police vehicle turned around and drove up alongside the driver and shone his torch in the vehicle telling the driver to stop. Police observed that the driver had jumped out of the driver's seat onto his passengers lap and was attempting to control the vehicle from there, thus running off the road. The man was charged with evade police, dangerous operation of a motor vehicle, driving unlicensed, unregistered and uninsured plus driving with a relevant drug present in his blood. He was bailed to attend Warwick Magistrates Court on 25th October.

18/9/17: A 35 year-old Warwick man was issued and traffic infringement notice and had his plates confiscated for 7 days after being caught on Warwick Allora Road with an expired driver's license.

23/9/17: A 22 year-old male and an 18 year old male both suffered serious injuries after a vehicle they were passengers in left Hendon Deuchar Rd, Deuchar and collided with a tree. The driver was uninjured. Police are still investigating the cause of the crash. No other vehicles were involved.

23/9/17: A 49 year-old Deuchar man was charged with high range drink driving for driving his quad bike on his property while intoxicated in the presence of Police. He will attend Warwick Magistrates Court on 25th October.

27/9/17: A 30 year-old Yangan man was charged with driving with a prescribed drug present in the blood after being intercepted by Warwick Road Policing Unit in Warwick St, Allora. He will attend Warwick Magistrates Court on the 8th of November.

09/10/2017 – Traffic Crash with injury that occurred on Arnold Street where an Australia Post worker was injured. Other driver to be dealt with at a later date.

In summing up, we are seeing too many traffic related incidents occurring, and we need to implore Allora residents to demonstrate more vigilance and care when driving.



First release of new utility notices issued to ratepayers

Dam De-Silting

Ratepayers in the Southern Downs region should now have received, or will soon receive, the first of the two new-look utility notices for the 2017/2018 financial year.

Those who have registered for notices by email or BPAY View will have received their utility notices earlier in the month and paper notices should have reached ratepayers' mailboxes with an issue date of October 11.

The due date for payment of the utility charges is 5pm, Friday, 10 November 2017.

Southern Downs Regional Council made the decision in June to split the General Rates and the Utility Charges and issue them in three separate notices in an effort to alleviate the financial load on ratepayers in the region.

Southern Downs Mayor Tracy Dobie said that this decision spreads the financial load for residents across the year.

"Council is aware that residents face financial constraints. This decision recognises that and aims to reduce the financial burden as much as possible," she said.

"Council has moved the Water and Wastewater Access charges off the annual Rate Notice and these have now been combined with the Water Consumption Charges to make the new utility notice.

"The utility notice will be issued six monthly, in October and April each financial year and each utility notice will account for half of the annual Water and Wastewater Access Charge," noted the Mayor.

If a ratepayer is having difficulties paying their notices by the due date, they are urged to contact Council to organise a confidential payment agreement. An approved payment agreement can:

- Allow the full balance of rates and charges (including Water and Wastewater Access charges) to be paid by 30 June 2018 by spreading the payments throughout the year in the form of regular instalments of weekly, fortnightly or monthly;
- If there are no rate arrears from a previous financial year (an opening arrears balance on the annual Rate Notice), halt any interest charges being incurred;
- Avoid recovery action and associated costs. For further information about the changes to your utility notice, or to discuss the details of a

confidential payment agreement, contact Council on 1300 MYSDRC (1300 697 372).

If you have a query about the water meter readings on your utility notice, the first step you should take is read your water meter. Information about how to read your meter is included with the utility notice, and can be accessed from Council's website: -












Scots Presbyterian Church Mens Breakfast Guest Speaker - Brad Dewson
