

Southern Downs chosen to host Cameroon in lead-up to **2018 Commonwealth Games**

It's taken more than a vear of dedication and hard work but on 7th December the Cameroon Commonwealth Games Team made it official: The Rose City is where they'll train in the lead-up to the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games.

Cameroon's 78 athletes along with a number of team officials will arrive in Warwick in early March for a two week, pregames training camp before the games officially kick-off on April 4.

Bordered by Nigeria to the west and located on Central Africa's west coast, Cameroon is a country of around 22 million people and while its population is similar to Australia's, it only has a land size the same as Papua New Guinea.

Southern Downs Regional Council Mayor Tracy Dobie said the announcement was fantastic news for the Southern Region. Downs encourage all Southern Downs residents to adopt the Cameroonian athletes and support them in the Commonwealth Games."

"The Southern Downs is in the swing of the Commonwealth Games already. We had the

practice run for the Queen's Baton Relay last Saturday [2nd December], which was wonderful, and now we have the Cameroonians coming," she said.

"Our officers are also working hard to attract some hockey nations for their pre-games training.

"We are looking forward to hosting the team here on the Southern Downs. The team's management has indicated they are keen to engage with

the community, local participate in some civic activities and see some kangaroos."

Local sports clubs and facilities, including Warwick Boxing Club and Warwick Indoor Recreation and Aquatic Centre (WIRAC), will host competitors across a variety of sports including men's and women's boxing, basketball, badminton, weight lifting, wrestling and track and field

This announcement comes almost 18 months after Council launched its Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games Pre-event Training Destination Proposal, in a bid to increase the profile of the Southern Downs on the international stage.

Council's Economic Development and Tourism team is now working with Cameroon Team Management to confirm details and finalise dates for the training camp.

in July 2019. It will be 150 vears since Allora was proclaimed a municipally. The residents of Allora celebrated both the 50th anniversary in 1919 and 100th vear anniversary in 1969. It is hoped that the Southern Downs Regional Council will acknowledge such important occasion by supporting a celebration of Allora's 150 years.

Members of the research team have been compiling the personal and military history of the men from the Allora and Clifton districts volunteered to fight in the Boer War.
