Re: Uncertain Future for Allora Pool

It is my understanding that the Southern Downs Regional Council wish to change the future lease agreements for the Allora, Killarney and Stanthorpe pools.

They wish to put the cost of maintaining the pool onto the vendors.

They also wish for vendors to give a percentage of their takings to the council.

In the Daily News (06 Jan 2018) MAYOR Tracy Dobie states:

'Council sets the fees...Council will continue to set the fees and charges based on operating costs.3

If the pool vendors are required to take on additional costs then I have no doubt fees will increase. If fees increase, many in our community will be unable to afford to use the pool - which in turn will lead to further increases.

Once a 'business minded' vendor takes over, the focus will be on generating a return in addition to covering the maintenance and maintenance material cost, as well as possibly giving the facility an upgrade and covering the cost of staff. This all costs money and most of our community members, (currently paying \$2.90 entry to Allora pool), will not be able to afford the fees found at 'business focussed pools,' such as Milne Bay (\$6 entry) or WIRAC (Warwick Pool costs \$5.70 for entry).

One of my concerns would be the negative impact on Allora community activities. What will our community do if we allow our pool to be business focused? Where will our Allora State School P&C hold fundraisers during the holidays, such as the movie pool night held on 06 Jan? or the Aquathon fundraiser, held on 14 Jan, to raise funds for the Allora State School Year 10 trip to Canberra. Both these activities charged no fees to enter the pool and are 100% community focused.

An increase in fees means access to our community pool may not be feasible for half our community.

My concern is that it is the more disadvantaged people who will be most affected.

I am also concerned our community, particularly our youth will become restless with an unaffordable pool. They will find more destructive ways to entertain themselves around our beautiful town. This would affect the whole community.

The pool is currently a community hub. I personally have made many friends and visit the pool regularly with my children. Allora children from both local schools attend lessons and happily pay the \$1.90 entry fee. Will some local children not be given the opportunity to learn to swim, because of a fee increase?



Make your health your priority this year

Darling Downs Hospital and Health Service mobile women's health nurse Kathryn Anning will visit a variety of locations in February to conduct free clinics.

The service is free and confidential and is available to all women.

"From 1 December 2017, cervical screening changed in Australia as the pap test was replaced with a new cervical screening test every five years," Ms Anning said.

"Cervical cancer is one of the most preventable cancers. The new cervical screening test is more accurate, needs to be done less often, and is expected to protect up to 30 per cent more women.

"The test is a simple procedure to check the health of the cervix. It looks and feels the same as the pap test, but tests for the human papillomavirus (known as HPV).

"A woman's first cervical screening test is due two years after her last pap test. After that, women will only need to have the test every five years if her results are normal.

"Regular cervical screening is your best protection against cervical cancer."

Ms Anning also provides a range of other services including breast awareness and sexual health testing as well as advice for issues such as continence, menopause, contraception and general wellbeing.

A simple step to prevent stroke in 2018

We hear so much at this time of year about New Year's resolutions - eat healthy, guit smoking, get more exercise, drink more water. The list goes on and on and on.

While these are all valid and well intentioned goals, I am urging you to do one simple thing for your health in 2018 which could save your life. Have your blood pressure

High blood pressure is a key risk factor for stroke and one that can be managed.

Stroke is a devastating disease that will impact one in six of us. There is one stroke every nine minutes in Australia. Stroke attacks the human control centre - the brain - it happens in an instant

and changes lives forever. In 2018 it's estimated there will be more than 56,000 strokes across the country. Stroke will kill more women than breast cancer and more men than prostate cancer this vear.

But the good news is that it does not need to be this way. Up to 80 percent of strokes are preventable, and research has shown the number of strokes would be practically cut in half (48 percent) if high blood pressure alone was eliminated

Allora Rugby League Centenary

While Central Downs based rugby league club the Wattles Warriors have launched their 2018 season campaign within the Toowoomba Rugby League recently, the club will be recognising their region's sporting history this year with an event to celebrate a century of rugby league.

While the Wattles club itself was formed 53 years ago when the Allora & Clifton Rugby League Clubs combined, rugby league had been the rural area's winter sport of choice since the latter 1910's.

Rugby union had been played in the Allora area from the late 1800's, however a meeting hosted at Allora's Andronico's refreshment rooms of a little over thirty interested folk in May 1918 resulted in the formation of a rugby league club, the Allora Junior Boomerang Club.

The Allora Rugby League Club formed on May 8th, 1918 and existed until February 18th, 1966 before combining with the Clifton Rugby League Club to form the Allora-Clifton Rugby League Club who adopted the name of Wattles in 1969.

While the Wattles club will celebrate the centenary of



rugby league in the Allora area in May, the club is also looking to uncover information on the formation of the Clifton Rugby League Club. Thanks to some kind assistance from the Clifton Courier, we have learned that a meeting of the Pioneer Football Club (rugby league) was held at Clifton's Commercial Hotel on May 15th, and an invite of members and intending members to

The sale this week of the historic Glengallan Homestead, opens the way to having the 126 year old building restored and preserved for future generations. The current owners of the Glengallan property, the Smith family partnership, have agreed to sell the homestead and five acres of land with access to the highway. Spokesmen for the Smith family. Roy and Jim Smith, said that the family had agreed to sell the homestead under the condition that it would be administered by a trust that would restore the building and ensure public accessibility.

Allora's Past 100 years ago January 1918

Death of a Horse A valuable horse, the property of Mr.

August Kaiser, a farmer residing near



Glengallan Homestead in October 1993 before restoration commenced.

Allora, met its death in an extraordinary manner on Monday afternoon. Mr. Kaiser rode into Allora and tied his horse up to a fence at the rear of the Roval Hotel. Back from the horse was a disused covered-in well. 40 feet deep. Something startled the horse and it broke away from the fence, and getting on top of the well, fell through the planking. A rope was procured and an attempt was made to haul the horse up. but when a few feet from the top the rope slipped and the noose tightened around the horse's neck. A dead horse was finally brought to the surface.

Allora's Past 150 years ago January 1868

Magisterial Inquiry

Information had been received that a man had been found dead on the ridge between Allora and Glengallan. The Police Magistrate proceeded at once to the spot to view the body and institute an enquiry into the cause of death. It

appeared from the evidence of the superintendant and others at Glengallan that the deceased was a man named John Munro who had been employed at the station but had left on New Year's Day to celebrate the festive season at Allora. As he did not return to the Station on Saturday, Mr. McIntosh rode over to Allora to make enquiries about him, and he was informed that he had left there on Friday morning carrying with him three bottles of rum. He could get no further tidings of him until last Tuesday when his remains were found in a gully in the range dividing Glengallan from Goomburra. There could be no doubt that death resulted from the combined effects of the rum and the fierce ravs of a vertical sun to which he was probably exposed to for a day or two before he provided another victim to the prevalent and destructive custom among the working classes of drinking their hard earned wages. 
