## Allora QCWA: Oktoberfest – the German festival

Allora CWA's country of study this year is Germany: Oktoberfest, the largest folk festival in the world, began as a public celebration of the wedding of Bavarian Crown Prince Ludwig to Princess Theresa of Von Sachsen-Hidburghausen in 1810. The original celebration featured a gruelling horse race, games, music, food, rides, and nonalcoholic drinks. celebration was held in a large meadow which became known as Theresa's Meadow near the city of Munich and the horse race was viewed from a low hill nearby.

Now in its 182nd year, Oktoberfest in Munich is a major tourist event, renowned throughout the world and copied by many other cities including Brisbane. The actual date for the festival begins in September around the 19th and runs for 16 to 17 days, usually finishing on the 3rd or 4th of October. This is to take advantage of the usually warmer weather in September rather than the coolness of October.

The Festival area covers 420,000 sq. metres and is still held on the original meadows although this site is now in the middle of the city. Every year, in mid- July, this area is transformed with the arrival of the construction teams which set about building 14 major and 15 minor beer tents, mainly made of timber and set on newly made concrete slabs. The most famous of the beer tents, the Schottenhamel Tent began as a small beer booth seating 50 people in 1867, and now has 10,000 seats. Each of the 6 breweries of Munich has a beer tent. The beer served at Munich Oktoberfest must be locally brewed and pass the strict "purity" test according to the law of 1516, which allows only water, hops, and malt in beer. The festival follows a set pattern every year with a 12

beer is the Minister- President of Bavaria. During the days that follow between 6 and 7 million people mostly from Bavaria, attend the festival. There is a brass band concert, a traditional dress and rifleman's parade and a traditional religious mass. Lively music, mouth-watering amusement rides, and lots of beer are common staples of the festival. Especially for the

children, there is a flea circus with 60 fleas performing! At the end of Oktoberfest, it takes 5 weeks to dismantle

the tents which are stored in warehouses to be erected the next year. Theresa's Meadow is returned to its usual state.



## My Health Record places your health in your hand

My Health Record is here and by the end of 2018, a record will be created for every person with a Medicare or Department of Veterans' Affairs card, unless they choose not to have one.

My Health Record is an online summary of a person's key health information such as allergies, current conditions and treatments, medicine details, as well as pathology and diagnostic imaging reports. It allows your nominated healthcare providers access to a summary of your health record when they need to.

Local community member Craig Lewis has a number of health concerns and knows first-hand the importance of having a My Health Record he can keep all of his health information online in one place and can choose which medical professionals can see it.

"My Health Record has been greatly beneficial to me and to the health professionals that I am in contact with. I see a wide variety of doctors both in hospital and private practice and it allows both me and them to easily see what
