Days for Girls Celebrates an Anniversary



The Allora Days for Girls group held a special morning tea during its Sewathon last Thursday to mark ten years since the project began internationally.

While the local group has been working for only four years it has made its mark, having distributed 4,000 kits in that time.

Internationally, Days for Girls has distributed 1,100,000 kits across its decade of existence.

Thursday also saw the presentation of a Certificate of Appreciation to the Catholic Parish Council, which has allowed the use of space at Mary MacKillop House, including a recently refurbished storeroom area.

Group leader Rosemary Easton said over the four years kits from Allora have been distributed to girls in Vanuatu, the Philippines, Papua New Guinea, the Solomon Islands, Laos, Nepal, Sudan and India.

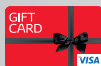

Allora now on high water restrictions

Residents of Allora, in line with other residents in the Southern Downs region are now subject to high water restrictions.

Southern Downs Regional Council moved to the new restrictions last Thursday, 1st November.

Under the new restrictions residents will need to reduce their water use to 170 litres per day from the previous target of 200 litres per day.

The move to high water restrictions means residents can no longer use sprinklers and fixed irrigation systems, wash vehicles with a trigger hose or top up pools, spas, fountains and ponds.

Residents are now only allowed to use water outdoors on their allocated days between 6pm and 7pm.

The new restrictions mean residents may only use water outdoors for the following:

- Hand held hosing of gardens only (not lawns).
- Watering gardens using buckets.
- Washing vehicles with a bucket on grassed areas.

Allocated days for outdoor water use remains unchanged and are as follows:

- Odd house numbers and no house numbers—odd calendar dates only.
- Even house numbers—

even calendar dates only. Cleaning windows and vehicle windows, mirrors and lights with a bucket is allowed at any time.

Coordinated 1080 Baiting for wild dogs, foxes and feral pigs

Southern Downs Regional Council is undertaking a further round of coordinated 1080 baiting in November.

Council provides the coordinated 1080 baiting program as a free service and encourages all landholders to participate in order to effectively control pests in the region.

Councillor for Agriculture, Environment and Sustainability, Cameron Gow said that coordinated baiting, along with trapping and shooting, is the best method for reducing pest numbers.

"Wild dogs, foxes and feral pigs destroy our region's natural environment and pose a threat to crops and livestock, with wild dogs estimated to cost the Queensland livestock industry \$67 million annually," Cr Gow said.

"The best way to control these pests is for all landholders to work together and take advantage of Council's coordinated baiting program.

"More landholders participating in the program helps close any gaps where these pests might thrive and multiply."

Council's coordinated 1080 baiting program will register landholders in the

Goomburra area at the Goomburra Hall at 8am on Wednesday 14th November, for Maryvale district residents on 14th November next to the Maryvale-Gladfield Rural Fire Shed from 10am and in the Willowvale/Bony Mountain area at the corner of Wheatvale and Lawler Rodas from 8am on Thursday 15th November.

To be part of the programme landholders must take reasonable humane steps to control pests and comply with firearms and poisons legislation.

Landholders participating in Council's coordinated 1080 baiting program must notify neighbours 72 hours in advance of baiting, supply their own baiting material and provide recent rates notices for the land they plan to bait.

All landholders participating in the coordinated 1080 baiting program must comply with the conditions set out in 'Toxin 1080', a guide to safe and responsible use of sodium fluoroacetate in Queensland.

Landholders can find the 'Toxin 1080' guide and appropriate forms from the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries website on www.daf.qld.gov.au.

"This is a good venue and we're so thrilled about the catering," she said.

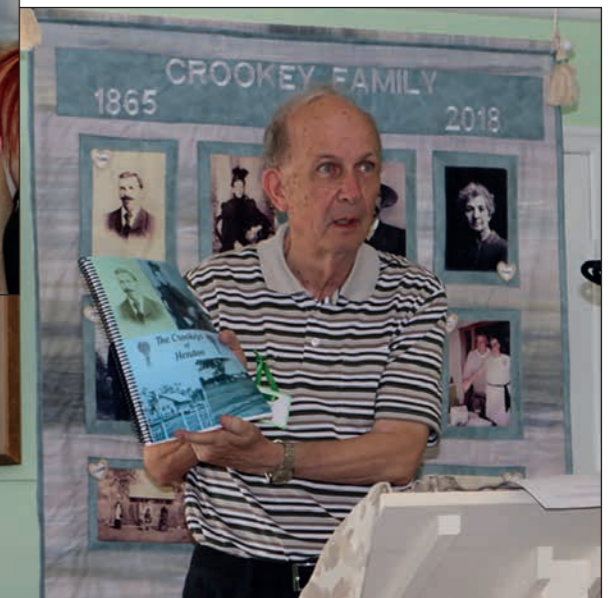

Allora & District Historical Society - Today is Tomorrow's History

The Allora & District Historical Society was formed in 1969 after the 100 year celebration of Allora township becoming a municipality. People from the area were asked to donate items for display. These items form what is now known as the "School of Arts" museum in Drayton Street. Roy Neale a keen historian collected information from families throughout the district for the family history files. Roy's scrawled notes were painstakingly transcribed by Colin Newport to form the valuable accounts of family history that are now used by people wanting to do family research.

As part of the 150 year celebration the Historical Society would like local people to scrawl, type or verbally record their history. Several families have taken the time to tell their story. Their stories give a background of their lives and answer the question "why we live in Allora". Your family history is Allora's history and we want you to contribute to our ongoing family history collection. The following is extracts of the story of Rod and Lynn

"We built our dream home at Mt. Marshall in 1985" ... "In 1999 we bought 'Roseneath' at auction from the Stay Estate, with the idea to run as a Bed & Breakfast. It has been the best thing we have done and 19 years later we have grown it to be a very

successful business." ... "The garden mostly roses, over 300 now, and I love every part of it. The guests and friends we have made through the B & B and being in our chosen home town have made our life a very fulfilling one with much more to come".

The Historical Society is hoping to publish a book incorporating your interesting family stories with significant dates (history) which will be for sale at or

after our 150th Anniversary weekend of 20th and 21st July 2019. There was a book published on the history of Allora and district in the first 100 years after municipality. 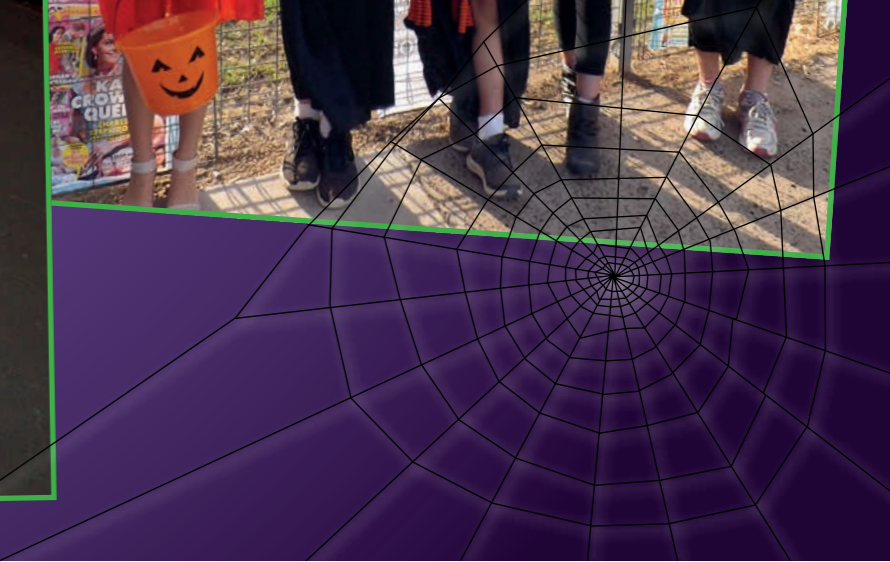

Memorial Hall

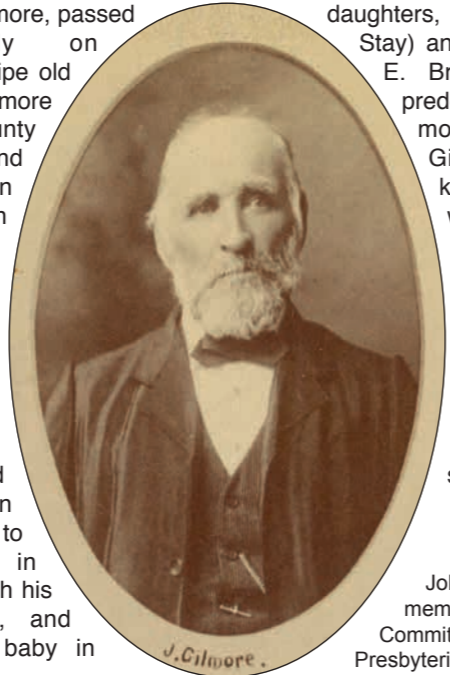
The Allora and District Patriotic Fund had received a letter from Mr. W. A. Deacon M.L.A. stating that he had made representations through Mr. Nicklin on the committee's request to obtain information for the building of a Soldiers' Memorial Hall at Allora. Information received from Mr. Nicklin

confirmed the information contained in the letter from the Chief Secretary's Department, and stated that there was no provision under the Act controlling patriotic funds for them to utilize money collected for patriotic purposes for the erection of a Soldiers' Memorial Hall. *(The Allora Sub-Branch of the R.S.A.I.L.A. owned a 1 acre allotment in Forde Street where they intended to build a Memorial Hall. At the back of the allotment, on the water lane (Neale Ave) was the Diggers' tennis court (later St. David's tennis court). The R.S.L. Memorial Hall was built on part of the War Memorial Park in 1954)*

Obituary

One of the oldest residents in the district, Mr. John Gilmore, passed away peacefully on Wednesday at the ripe old age of 84. Mr. Gilmore was born in County Antrim, Ireland, and came to Australia in 1860 taking part in the Bendigo gold rush. Having no luck on the field, he went into station life in N.S.W. After seven years in Australia he returned to Ireland and married. After remaining in Ireland for another seven years, he returned to Australia, landing in Brisbane in 1874 with his wife, son William, and daughter Mary, a baby in



arms. On the encouragement of fellow Irishman and resident of Allora, Mr. James Graham, the Gilmore family came to the Allora district where Mr. Gilmore took up work as a groom for Mr. Charles Clark at Talgai. After 12 months Mr. Gilmore took a job on Goomburra Station as a boundary rider. After a short time he selected a 160 acre farm in the Goomburra Homestead Area. He added to this area considerably over the years and at the time of his retirement to Allora he owned 3,000 acres of freehold land and 2,000 acres leasehold. Mr. Gilmore was a staunch supporter of the Presbyterian Church and was on the building committees for both the old and new St. Andrew's Churches. He leaves a family of two sons, William and John and two daughters, Mary (Mrs. H. W. Stay) and Agnes (Mrs. J. E. Brodie). His wife predeceased him 10 months ago. Mr. Gilmore took a keen interest in the war and it was his desire to live to see peace. Upon being told on Monday night that the armistice had been signed he said "Thank God, I am satisfied now".
