Take it Slow, Take it Slow, Take it Slow

The State's peak motoring body has urged Queenslanders to 'Take it slow' on the roads this festive season as data revealed the shocking number of lives lost during Christmas periods over the past decade.

RACQ spokesperson Clare Hunter said 10 people had lost their lives at Christmas 2017, which brought the 10-year Christmas road death toll to 71 fatalities.

"We're asking people to reflect on those 71 people before they get behind the wheel this festive season and to remember, for their families, Christmas is now and forever a time of awful sadness," Ms Hunter said.

"As the end of the year fast approaches, our message this Christmas is simple: since we've all got places to go, take it slow, take it slow, take it slow."

As RACQ has launched

its 'Take it slow' Christmas road safety campaign in Brisbane, Ms Hunter called on all motorists to ensure they slowed down and remembered the Fatal Five causes of crashes on Queensland roads.

"We're calling on all Queenslanders to take the Fatal Five - Speed, Drug and Drink Driving, Fatigue, Seatbelts and Distraction - very seriously to avoid senseless tragedy on our roads," she said.

"Every life lost on our roads is heartbreaking and has a devastating ripple effect on the victim's immediate and extended family."

RACQ's Christmas road safety campaign would continue throughout the busy holiday period with Queenslanders encouraged to take part on social media using the hashtag #TakeItSlow.

SDRC has more than \$155,000 available to award to successful individual and not-for-profit grant applicants through the following funding programs.

- The **Fast Grant for Not-For-Profit Organisations Only** - is capped at \$2,000 per applicant per financial year.
- The **Fast Grant for Individuals Only** - is capped at \$1,000 per applicant per financial year. Both Fast Grants are open now and will close on 14 June 2019.
- The **Community Grant – Round Two (2) for Not-For-Profit Organisations Only** - is capped at \$10,000 per applicant per financial year. Round Two (2) will **open** on 26 December 2018 and **close** on 23 January 2019.

Tradition, according to my old dictionary means "a long established custom or belief that has been passed on from one generation to another". When you live on your own somewhat later in life, some traditions are carried on, others just form part of our memories.

Back in 1973 a group of young Anglican women here in Allora met to share time, stories and support each other. Here in our smaller town we know more closely our elderly citizens and, when Meals on Wheels folded in 1974, this group, guided by Phyllis Shooter then and now, decided to commence a luncheon that would provide a hot meal of meat and vegetables and dessert. Just as importantly, the chance to leave their

homes for company and conversation for those in our midst who were over 75 and lived on their own. Forty four years later and, once a month, this tradition still continues. Some of our guests have been attending for well over 20 years and ages at this Christmas Dinner last week ranged from 75 to 95!

The lunch is prepared and served by a very small band of women to these lovely souls. Last week was no different, Christmas fare with hats, ham and lollies and pudding and custard and punch and the requisite laughter! Carols followed, under the guidance of Ken Gillam on his button accordion, and there was no memory loss amongst the guests for the words of

the carols, they sang with great gusto and smiles! A surprise Christmas package of St David's Guild ladies' home-made biscuits was presented to each guest to take home and some delivered to those unable to make it on the day.

As with many organizations, those who

carry on this tradition are almost as old as the guests themselves and, our request is, if you have about 3 or 4 hours on the first Thursday of the month, once every 3 months to join a team of 4 who prepare and serve lunch at St.David's Anglican Hall, these lovely guests will continue to come to

Allora's Past 25 years ago
December 1993

Amalgamation On

Warwick City, Glengallan, Rosenthal and Allora Shires will amalgamate into the one large shire to be called Warwick Shire. This decision has been made by State Cabinet following its acceptance of recommendations made by the Local Government Commissioner, Greg Hoffman. Local Government Minister, Terry Mackenroth, said however, the implementation will be delayed by legal proceedings commenced by Allora and Rosenthal Shire Councils. Mr. Mackenroth said that he was disappointed in the attitude of the two shire councils in their attempt to frustrate the amalgamation decision. "The Government is committed to the process of review by the independent commissioner and will take any action necessary to see that the process is not impeded," he said.

Allora Air Ace

Flight Sergeant Lionel Morris (21), the eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. C. H. M. Morris of Darling Street, Allora, by shooting down a Focke-Wulf 190 and damaging another, last month helped to bring his Spitfire wing's kills to a record overseas total of 300 in one year. Flight Sgt. Morris claimed his victories during a morning sweep on Saturday, November 13. His Spitfire wing has been on operations in the Mediterranean since the Allied landing in North Africa last November. Lionel was educated at the Allora State School and prior to the war was a clerk with Thomas Brown & Sons of Brisbane. He enlisted in the R.A.A.F. in Brisbane

in 1940 and was in the first group to graduate at Amberley. His father, who is employed at the Allora Butter Factory, served in the last war. (Lionel Morris survived the war with the rank of Flying Officer and was the recipient of a Distinguished Flying Cross).

Obituary

Rather sad circumstances surround the death of Colin Patrick Long, the 10 year old son of Mr. and Mrs. P. J. Long of Goomburra, which took place at Mygunyah private hospital. It appears that a piece of stubble pierced the sole of the little fellow's foot, and he was brought to the hospital on Friday last. Upon examination by Dr. Pain it was found that the dread disease tetanus (lock-jaw) had gripped the boy. Every effort was made to save the boy's life but without success. The funeral, which was largely attended, moved from the hospital to St. Patrick's Church. Upon the remains being taken into the church the children of the Convent school sang "The Souls of the Faithful" and as the remains were being carried out the children sang "O'Paradise, O'Paradise". From the church the cortege moved to the Allora cemetery, the Rev. Father Carroll officiated at the graveside. We extend our sympathy to the sorrowing parents who have been unfortunate enough to lose four other children.

(The Long family story is one of Allora's saddest stories. Philip James and Esther Long came to a farm at Goomburra from Uralla N.S.W. about 1910. They have six children buried in the Allora cemetery: Kevin Thomas 1910, age 10 months; Mary Veronica 1912, 8 months; Francis Bridget 1915, 4 years; Josephine Veronica 1916, 1 month; Colin Patrick 1918, 10 years; and Audrey Frances 1922, age unknown. Their father, Philip James Long, died in 1926 at the age of 44 and is buried in the Allora cemetery as is his brother Martin Long who died in 1912 at the age of 37. Martin was the father of six small children, one of whom was born on the night before his father died).
