
Police Pipes & Drums In Allora

Allora's Past 25 years ago January 1994 **Show Preparations**



Allora's Past 75 years ago January 1944 Obituary

The death occurred in Rosemount Military Hospital of Captain Robert William Brown, a well known Allora businessman. Robert (Bob) Brown was born in Allora and was the grandson of Spring Creek pioneers Thomas and Ellen Brown. At the outbreak of WWI he enlisted as a trooper with the 2nd Australian Light Horse and attained the rank of Lieutenant. He was awarded the M.B.E. (Military Division) for his service in the Imperial Camel Corps. On his return to Allora he started business as a tobacconist which he carried on successfully until his enlistment in WW2. He had been promoted to the rank of Captain when ill health had caused him to resign from the services. Bob Brown was survived by his wife and one

Allora's Past 100 years ago January 1919 **Shocking Accident**

A terrible tragedy occurred on the railway line between Hendon and Ellinthorp when a hand trolley occupied by two men and two boys was struck by a fully laden goods train travelling between Toowoomba and Warwick. Killed were John Alfred Paskins, age 34, and his son John Ivor Paskins, age 8. Railway lengthsman, Henry Dries, saved the life of 7 year old Alfred Paskins

The reasons for declining to send the exhibit here are held to be wholly insufficient.
