J.K. (Jack) Cameron in 1901. He was inspired to write the poem "A Welcome Home to Our Sons." on the return of the servicemen who returned from the war in South Africa. Jack's brother, Arthur, was a member of the 1st Contingent. A short poem by Jack is also etched on the Boer War monument honouring the men who died during the war.

J K Cameron's poems along with the poetry of other local poets were printed in the 'Allora Guardian' under the heading ORIGINAL POETRY in the July 1891 edition of the paper. His poem 'The Rain' conveys the sentiments of us all when we hear rain –

The rain! the rain! the beautiful rain

Who is not pleased to see it again –

As it falls so gently and runs so free

From dropping boughs of the willow tree.

The poems of many other local residents are recorded and held in the Allora & District Historical Society's collection. The family of George Spencer Briggs printed a collection of his poems. His poem 'The Shepherd's Song' won a competition conducted by the Town and Country Journal, Sydney in March 1889. The poem was set to music and the 'arranger', Mr Churchill Fisher also won a prize.

Brenda Hamill from Goomburra was another very well known local poet. She wrote some very topical poems describing the way things were or local events. The Historical Society have a collection of her poems – "The Berat Tennis Court", written when the local court was opened; "A Goomburra Turn Out",

about a horse named Melba: "The Pilton Players-The Governor's Cup" - Pilton won the Cup in 1923. Other teams in the competition were Cressbrook, Glen Innes. Newstead. Goondiwindi. West Haldon and Toowoomba: "Nobby v All Blues" about a football match (see below): "Two Victims of the Great War" about two local servicemen who died during WW1. She son, Cyril Ryan will be reciting one of her poems at the Poet's Breakfast. This poem describes very well the life and times of the people of Brenda's era and Cvril recites it with feeling.

The greatest scandal that ever was seen

On the Allora Football Field Was when Nobby defeated the Allora Blues

In a contest for the shield (First verse of poem Nobby v All Blues written in 1922)

The poem, "The Holmes-Wright Collision" was written by Brenda in 1935. This poem describes in graphic detail a horrific crash on Kital Road, Berat, on 1st April 1935, between Milton Holmes and Tom Wright driving his father, Santon's Overlander motor truck. Five passengers, Santon, Jack, Dorrie and Ev Wright and a friend were in the vehicle.

The Historical Society has a book of poetry compiled by Lawrie Herron. His poem "In Timber Further Out" mentions an ancestor Anna Black, - " Four generations back. Shannon and Saal, Muirs, Marshalls, Herrons, all were kin right back to Anna Black". He also writes that Lizzie Herron married Harry Hall who was said to have "black blood in the Black bloodline".

Lawrie Herron and Cyril Ryan,



along with locals Alan Hoey, Ken Gillam and Graham Kirkland will be reciting their poetry. Maybe they will write a new poem in reference to our 150 year history.

Profile of Robert Grayson – Pioneer No. 40

Robert Grayson was born in County Amagh, Ireland in 1831. He married Eleanor Jane Allen in November 1854. They embarked aboard the "Cambodia" at Plymouth six months later, arriving in Moreton Bay in July 1855.

Robert joined the New South Wales Police Force in July 1858 and was stationed at Warwick. He is recorded as purchasing land in Warwick and land in Allora.

He was the District Constable for the Warwick Police District. He was regularly called to Allora particularly during the shearing season at Goomburra from November to February.

Robert was sworn in to the Queensland Police Force on 1st January in 1864. He was posted to Allora on 1st September as Acting Sergeant.

He established a police barracks and lock up in Yap Yan's cottage. The cottage was situated on a block of land on the corner of Drayton and Forde Streets. (Site 11 on Allora's Historic Heritage Trail) It was reported that, it was not unusual to see drunks handcuffed to the verandah post.

Robert and Eleanor Grayson built a house on their land on the corner of Warwick and Herbert Streets in 1866. (Site of present I.G.A.) Their children were among the first pupils of the Allora School. They resided in Allora until 1870 when Robert was promoted to Sergeant in Warwick. He was appointed Inspector of slaughter houses and cattle intended for slaughter. He rose to the rank of Sub-Inspector and resided in Stanthorpe in 1876. He retired to Warwick in 1884.

On the 7th July 1888, Robert Grayson went missing after leaving the Sportsman's Arms at 11pm. His body was found ten days later, floating in the Condamine River near Queens Park. During an enquiry, his friend of 26 years said he had had no more than five or six drinks.

Recently, during Heritage Week, the SDRC Information centre ran a cemetery walk. The headstone of Robert Grayson's wife was featured. The wording on her headstone is intriguing — Sacred To the Memory of Eleanor Jane

The beloved and most regretted wife of Robert Grayson

Died 27th April 1880, Aged 41 years

Robert was not buried in the family grave plot with his wife and four of their children. His grave was separated by a walkway. His

two grandchildren, children of his daughter Margaret Campbell are buried there also.

Exciting winger Braydon Wilson ran in a hat trick of tries as he filed a five star performance at Platz Oval on Sunday, inspiring local league heroes the 'Railway Hotel, Allora' Wattles Warriors A Grade side to a 30 - 16 victory over the Goondiwindi Boars.

Reserve Grade Toowoomba Giant former representative forward Tyrone Jowett was the driving force behind the 'South East Engineering services. Clifton' Wattles Warriors reserve grade side's 32 - 16 success over Goondiwindi on Sunday.

The win keeps Wattles balancing on the top rung of the TRL Reserve Grade premiership ladder.

While it wasn't panic stations for Wattles prematch, an existing injury list of key players along with the loss of star fullback Dale McAntee in the lead up to the game and crafty five-eight Josh Henry elevated to A Grade caused captain/coach Brenden Wilson some concerns.

Wilson was more than happy with the end result though, and filled in admirably at five eight himself.


