Stuart Puts Down The Gavel After 40+ Years One of the longest-

serving supporters of the annual Allora Community Auction took his last bids on Sunday.

Auctioneer Stuart Bond from Warwick has been a familiar face at the auction for 43 of the 44 years since it started.

"I wasn't at the first one but I've done every auction since." Mr Bond said.

The auction was started by Allora Apex Club and three men organised it - Jim Leeson, Keith Masters (who are both deceased) and Barry Geitz, who now lives in North Queensland.

"Jim Leeson asked me to come along the second year," Mr Bond said.

"We used to get over 3,000 people - one year I think there were about 4,000 here, and we had as many as 3.000 lots.

"We were selling from 8 in the morning until 8 at night.

"I've seen the ground when you couldn't walk between the people and lots."

This year, about 1,700 lots were on offer. Although he is stepping

back from the Allora Community Auction, Stuart Bond is still in business at Warwick.

Huge Capital Works program plans for the future in Council's 2019-2020 Budget

Southern Regional Council is looking to the future with one of its largest ever Capital Works programs after adopting its 2019-2020 Annual Budget. Council has dedicated

Wednesday, 12th June 2019

\$35.8 million towards Capital Works in the Budget to maintain and upgrade key infrastructure throughout the region.

A highlight of the Capital Works program includes \$12.59 million on the region's roads, bridges. drainage and footpaths.

Council will also deliver an \$833.000 extension of footpath from Quart the Pot Creek to Maryland Street in Stanthorpe. а \$790.000 transport link from East Street in Warwick and a \$652,000 upgrade to Bourkes Road Bridge in Freestone, while more than \$280,000 has been budgeted for the replacement of the roof on the Allora Reservoir.

Deputy Mayor Jo McNally said renewing the region's ageing infrastructure is vital for long-term planning and ensuring the region's continual growth and prosperity.

"This Budget about strong financial management and reducing the debt to ensure SDRC is financially sustainable into the future and we have been very successful in achieving that goal," Cr McNally said.



An SDRC spokesperson commented that SDRC has removed the damaged roof and the Allora Reservoir is currently offline. Council has conducted a condition assessment on the reservoir as well as work to repair any damage. SDRC has allocated funds in next year's budget to replace the roof, and Council will return the reservoir to full service once this has occurred. Allora's urban water supply is sourced from Leslie Dam, so the reservoir being offline has not impacted the supply of water to Allora residents.



Sister Bervl Sharpe – Pioneer No. 31 – Matron of Mirrabooka Private Hospital

Bervl Tanslev Sharpe known as Bee, born in 1898, was the second daughter of five children born to parents Joseph Tansley and Grace Sharpe.

In 1918 when she was aged twenty, Beryl taught art at the Technical College. At aged thirty she commenced her training as a nurse at the Warwick General Hospital. She ran a private hospital named Mirrabooka in Forde Street. This building is in use today as a private residence. A search in Warwick newspapers on Trove reveal some stories about the patients who were treated at Mirrabooka. On 24th March 1934, Joseph Lynam farmer was admitted. He had been thrown by his horse, lay unconscious overnight until found by a school boy the next day. Joseph was taken to Warwick hospital and an x-ray showed fractured bones in his neck. His condition was reported as serious. Another patient admitted to Mirrabooka in April the same year was Mrs Rothwell, the wife of the Reverend Rothwell. She slipped down the bank of the creek while cray fishing with a party near the Allora Golf Links. Mrs Rothwell was reported as sustaining a fracture of the left leg below the knee.

One newspaper clipping tells of Sister Snowball taking leave of her nursing duties at Mirrabooka at Toowoomba. In 1936 a group of local women passed their First Aid examinations. In order to complete their first aid course they were to be instructed in home nursing at Mirrabooka

Of the births found recorded in the Births columns of these newspapers - 1944 - Peter Robert, son of Peter and Beth Easton, 1934 -Rhondda June, daughter of Mr & Mrs Kent (nee Muriel Phillips): Bruce Peter, son of Monica (Hilton) and Captain E G Williams A.I.F (brother to Tony and Alan);

To Daphne and Rev. A E. Loxton St David's Rectory, a son; A son, David to (nee Simpson) Shiela and Flight Sergeant H J Thornburn R.A.A.F. (Many Allora and district babies were born at Mirrabooka, the few mentioned were just the ones found on Trove in Warwick newspapers)

In a notice of the death of Edgar Cockburn, the Doctor. Matron and Staff of Mirrabooka were thanked. Bervl's mother Grace died in Mirrabooka on 9th July 1934

Beryl Sharpe ran the Mirrabooka Hospital until 1947. Bervl died in 1969 and is buried in the Allora cemetery.

Other Allora nurses on the Last Man Standing Raffle Pioneer list are No. 48 - Sister Ada Pricilla Smith (Farnsworth). Ada trained at the Warwick Base Hospital. She enlisted at the outbreak of WW1 and served in Cairo and France; No. 49 - Sister Amy Louise

Nagel. Amy served in WW1 on troop ships, England and France; No. 81 - Nurse Elizabeth Roberts; No. 84 - Sister Christina Stewart (Chandler) and No. 85 -Sister Alma Gallev (Hoev). Chris and Alma were the first nursing sisters at the Dalrymple Private Hospital which was operated by the Allora and District Co-Operative Hospital. Chris and Alma were the only staff, working for half pay. They cooked, cleaned as well as nursing the patients under difficult conditions and scant amenities. (Taken from Olive Shooter's book Allora District Co-Operative Hospital Society Ltd. 1949 -1999)

Stolen Car

Leslie Leonard Carpenter (21), a soldier from N.S.W., was fined £15 in default 2 months imprisonment in the Warwick Police Court for the unlawful use of a motor vehicle, the property of William Major Holmes of Allora. Mr. Holmes had parked his car temporarily outside his place of business in Allora. Just after entering the shop he heard the car being started and saw three Australian soldiers driving away in the direction of Warwick. He notified the Allora police who advised the Warwick police. The car was located in Pratten Street, Warwick, where it was kept under observation by Constable Croker of Allora and members of the Provost Corps. Carpenter was arrested when he returned to the car and attempted to start it.


ALLORA From a Correspondent






