The current Goomburra Town Hall Committee Inc. has been very active in the past year, holding a Christmas Party in December, Trivia Nights and recently, High Tea in conjunction with the Jumpers and Jazz Festival and catering at local auctions.

The Hall has been hired for use for meetings and police events, voting and private functions.

Members of the Committee have given their time in the usual tidy-ups, maintenance, lawn mowing and tree removal.

Secretary Toni Williamson said the Hall was successful in receiving grants from Condamine Headwaters Landcare Group inc. and the Southern Downs Regional Council through the Drought Communities Grants Programme to fund new playground equipment, upgrading and repairs to the building, replacement of toilets and the floor has been entirely sanded and resurfaced.

"We would like to hold a 'Back to Goomburra Day' to raise the 26-year-old buried time capsule and have a Bush Dance to celebrate the new floor," Ms Williamson said.

water on September 14 and delivering them on the same dav.


Wattles Junior Rugby League and Wild Sage Wellness Studio will be teaming up to create care packages for families of the Stanthorpe Junior Rugby League.



Well done to all the Players on a great season and the hard work to get to a Grand Final. Enjoy the day Lads, be proud of your season and the Warriors jersey.


