# **Activists face jail**

Member for Maranoa, David Littleproud has welcomed new laws that will protect farming families from activist invasions.

Criminal Code The Amendment (Agricultural Protection) 2019 introduces new offences for using the internet to incite trespass. theft or property damage on agricultural land.

"Aussie Farms organisers have a choice, take your attack map down or go to Minister Littleproud said.

"They need to respect the privacy of farmers or they could spend five years in a cell reflecting on what they've done.

"These invasions are dangerous and intimidating, like when 20 activists broke into the Carey Bros abattoir in Warwick or when 100 activists invaded Lemon Tree feedlot in Millmerran.

"These have not just been farm invasions, they're also home invasions.

"Aussie Farms encouraged large numbers of people

# Allora Rural Neighbourhood Watch disbands after 26 years



Rural Neighbourhood Watch was officially launched on 23rd February 1993 with over 130 people in attendance. It was felt the Allora Police District. which is quite a large area, was in need on this service, thus making the Allora Rural NHW the 10th largest area in Queensland. Unfortunately, due to our age and the demographics of NHW, the remaining volunteers voted to disband the group as of the 5th September 2019.

Since the beginning. there have been 6 Area Co-ordinators, 86 Zone Coordinators and 11 Police Liaison Officers involved. At least 40 zone co-ordinators at a time voluntarily serviced approximately 1300 homes, delivering the bi-monthly newsletters with crime reports incorporated. For many years, funds to



#### **Return Home**

Corporal Harold Pain, son of Dr. Francis and Mrs. Pain, returned to Allora following military service which extended over 5 years. Allora born medical student, Harold Pain, enlisted in the Australian Army Medical Corps

on the 28th September 1914. He served with the 1st Australian Casualty Clearing Station at Gallipoli and was amongst the very last party to be evacuated at dawn on the 20th December 1915. He was returned to Australia in 1916 to complete his medical studies.

On the 12th March 1917 Harold Pain re-enlisted with the Field Artillery Reinforcements and saw service in England where he was struck down with bouts of meningitis and influenza, narrowly avoiding death. During the eight weeks that he was incapacitated the armistice was signed. He served with the Australian Army Service Corps in Cologne, Germany, after the conclusion of the war.

Allora's Past 150 years ago September 1869

#### **Sudden Death**

On Saturday last Mr. John Scott, wool sorter of Allora, died rather suddenly from the effects of a rupture he sustained on the previous Tuesday whilst riding from Allora to Goomburra. The deceased was well known in most

wool sheds on the Downs, and for many years was sorter at Rosenthal, Goomburra, etc. On the day of the election for aldermen in the new Municipality of Allora, the deceased who was working at Goomburra, attended the election. On returning home he put his horse into a rather smart gallop, during which time he suffered the rupture. Dr. Headlev was called in and recommended his patient be moved to the Warwick Hospital. He was taken there on Friday but never recovered and he died on Saturday evening. The deceased was a man highly respected on the stations and had a thorough knowledge of the business he followed.

# Iowa Speedway - Oshkosh Air Venture - Indianapolis Motor Speedway & Much More


this has been an incredible few weeks in the life of overly enthusiastic seventy five year old. Many boyhood dreams & bucket list adventures have been ticked off this trip. Bringing the ninety seven year old Wikner Ford Special to the USA has proved to be a great move. The overall hospitality and welcome we have received by our fellow enthusiasts and the speedway fans has been far beyond my expectations.

We, my young buddy Ted Klepinger & my Ipswich good friend Paul Casos set off for the Iowa Speedway with time to enjoy some attractions on the way. We detoured via Milwaukee Wisconsin to spend a day at the Harley Davidson Museum, a great choice. It was a Saturday & literally thousands of Harley riders were there for an owners ride in where the factory people organized events & hospitality. Yours truly even had the opportunity to test ride a new Harley Sportster around local streets.

Next day we visited what is reputedly the world's largest truck stop on lowa's highway 80. It features a wonderful & free truck museum plus more truck candy (chrome) & Truckee facilities than are imaginable.

As Paul (a Model T owner) had not been to Speedy Bills Museum of American Speed we made another detour this time in a rented Dodge Charger; Paul who has a long history in Australian drag racing was like we all are mesmerized by the museums displays.

We overnighted at beautiful Winterset lowa B&B the Heavenly Habitat. Winterset is where the movie "The Bridges of Madison County" was filmed starring Clint Eastwood & Merrill Streep. It is also the birthplace of the legendry John Wayne.





Somehow, we also fitted in a visit to the National Sprint car Hall of Fame in Knoxville Iowa before setting up at the Iowa Speedway at Newton Iowa. The reception we received was wonderful & as it was also a modern Indy Car race weekend, excitement was on the schedule. The Sprint Car museum is eager to feature the Wikner before it returns home to Allora.

Toowoomba, s Indy car star Will Power flew in the next day so we were able to have a brief catch up (what a wonderful sporting ambassador for Australia Will is), we also caught up with another Aussie, Indy Car announcer Leigh Diffey.

On track, lowa Speedway is a WOW raceway just seven eights of a mile around with speeds approaching 200 mph, the Wikner & I were happy at about an 80mph top speed. Over the 2 day event we must have clocked up 50 laps, great stuff running with other old cars including one of the Turbine cars that ran at Indianapolis in the 1970,s.

We had planed a nonmotor racing car adventure with a 2-day visit to the worlds largest air show "Air Venture" at Oshkosh Wisconsin. Oshkosh control tower is the worlds busiest for one week per year controlling 11,000 plus visiting aircraft. We now numbered 4 with Model T owning friend Dave of Milwaukee our host ioining us while we walked & walked in an effort to see it all. We took the opportunity to take

a flight in one of 2 vintage Ford Trimotor airliners offering rides. We all flew in the 1929 Ford 5AT 12/15 seater, which slowly showed us the entire grounds and the seaplane base on Lake Winnebago.

Among the highlights were a number of special war birds including numerous Mustangs several B25, s 2 B17, s and a magnificent 4-engined B29 "Doc"similar to the aircraft that bombed Hiroshima to end WW11.

Air Venture is organized by the EAA the Experimental Aircraft Association & is a most definite bucket list item & allow at least 5 days. It was now time to return to our Ohio base & prepare for the Wikner, s run on the world famous Indianapolis Motor Speedway Oval. The oval is 2.5 miles around with 4 corners & it takes 200 laps to complete the annual 500-mile race. We had experienced some oil surge issues at lowa so it was time to take stock & prepare carefully.

It was genuinely hard to believe as we towed our precious cargo into the world's most famous Speedway, a boyhood dream was coming true. When I first bought the Wikner as a 14 year old I had often dreamt of this day & here wow it was. The vintage races this time was organized by the "Ragtime Racers" group as part of the annual historic sports car event. Once again a fantastic reception was received & over the next few
