It was a big undertaking for a small group, but with the assistance of many individuals and local organisations, the Allora and District Historical Society organised a very successful 150 Year Celebration. The outcome was the culmination of over twelve months of planning. It was well worth the effort with over 3.000 people in attendance, wide ranging publicity for the Allora district and heightened interest in the history of area and a boost to our bank balance. I want to record my thanks to Wendy our Secretary, who worked tirelessly to coordinate every aspect of the planning, including applying for grants, and insurance cover, road closures, donations, sponsors, bookings not forgetting arranging the Governor's visit and the many other details of running an event such as this. Thank you also to Jim and Kaye who attended all meetings and took on extra responsibilities. Most of the 150 Year Celebration committee members paid their membership fees to the society to ensure that their public liability was covered. We appreciate their interest and

hope they continue to be members

The official opening of our 150 Year Celebration was held at the Old Shire Chambers to acknowledge the restoration of the building funded by a State Government grant. 150 years ago on 21st July, the Governor proclaimed Allora a municipality. On 20th July 2019, Governor Paul de Jersey declared our celebration open and unveiled a plague to mark the completion of renovations. I sincerely hope that as trustee of the building, the Southern Downs Regional Council will now maintain it as a

Again thanks to the effort of Wendy, we were successful in receiving a grant to paint the outside of the museum building and the school building in Drayton Street, carry out repairs and upgrade the lighting and install a new power box. Paul and Lorraine Morris carried out a very professional painting job and donated materials to carry out some of the repairs.

On looking back over the minutes of our meetings during the vear. I realise that we have to face

many challenges this coming year. We have to refocus on assessing our collection to create a collection that significantly reflects the history of our district. To this end, changes in the form of by-laws (as previously suggested by Trevor Neale) will have to be made to our constitution to give us that option.

We need to focus more attention on applying for grants offered by the State Government and the Southern Downs Regional Council. We are unable to generate income to meet fixed costs or to make improvements as a small town museum and historical society. Over the past few years we used up any monies that had been saved in paying annual costs of rates, water, insurance and general maintenance. We now have some funds to set aside but we need to take advantage of every grant that is offered.

Our other challenge is the future of the Allora & District Historical Society in that there are no young members to carry on. Who are going to be the custodians of the collection and who is going to be interested

enough in the history of Allora to maintain the family history records and carry out research. I want to acknowledge the

work that Colin Newport has done for this historical society. He has been a member for 50 years and has held every executive position as well as being research officer for many years. It was Colin who created our family files and over the past few years has spent many many hours making sure our family research files have been recorded

Every one of our members steps up when there is work to do. How many boxes did we carry down the stairs and load up into car boots and utes to clear the Old Shire Hall before the renovations were carried out. The day is looming when we have to sort out how we are going to re-establish the display of our collection. That is the immediate challenge, to create an interesting space in the hall.

Story of the Trough in Dalrymple Reserve



It all started with the late Jack Busiko. Born in 1917, the ninth of ten children for Dave and Anne Busiko. Jack left home when he was about ten years old and went to work and live with Watty Stark. They worked clearing and planting the Pechey Forestry. In their spare time cleared and built a farm out of virgin scrub.

Jack lived with the Starks at Pechey then moved to Talgai with them, working the farms and helping to raise their family.

When Jack married lvy Sparksman from Talgai in 1943 they moved back to Pechey eventually to a small farm where Jack was to spend the rest of his life.

Jack built his house out of a tree that fell across the road at the Hampton Pub and the Lady Publican asked him to cart it away. When she found out that he had it cut up for timber he received a bill for ten pounds.

Jack's real love was the

forestry and timber industry so he set himself up with an old army blitz as a timber jinker to cart logs out of the forestry to the mills. Using cross-cut saws and his own invention where he used the tailshaft of his truck to winch the huge logs onto it.

Back in 1948, Jack & Bill Blocksidge built the 1200 gallon wooden trough that stands in Dalrymple Reserve. Cut from a dead bloodwood tree from the Pechey State Forest the trough was a birthday present to Watty Stark for his cattle yard at Ellinthorpe. The entire dairy herd watered from the trough at the one time and carp were placed in the trough to keep the mosquitos down.

The Stark family sold the property in 1980 to Don and Margaret Duff who donated the trough to the Allora Shire Council where the Chairman Cr Jim Deacon accepted the trough on behalf on the Shire.

Looking Back...

A Sad, Sad, Story

The Rev. John Watson was called to the charge of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Allora, from Goondiwindi in 1894. He came to Allora at a time of financial hardship within the Allora Presbyterian congregation, a time which reflected the financial turmoil occurring throughout Australia in the mid 1890's.

The Scottish born Rev. Watson and his wife Benjeanie (nee Steel) had, in 1896, three sons aged 5, 4 and 1. The Rev. Watson had a falling out with some of the elders of St. Andrew's Church and his hardships were compounded by the death of his wife in childbirth on the 15th April 1896. Benjeanie Watson, age 32, was buried in the Allora cemetery on the 16th April

The female baby named Benjeanie Elizabeth was cared for by a local childless couple. The Rev. John Watson resigned from the Allora Charge in 1897, only after the church was mortgaged to pay out his stipend. In 1898 he took up an appointment at the parish church in Dunolly, Victoria. When the Rev. Watson remarried in The sad story continues with the death
