Allora P-10 State School Principal Shaun Kanowski, who conducted the service, made mention of the 72 men from the district who died during WW1.



"This is great news, because that's the big picture behind men's sheds - men working together on projects that benefit the local community.


"To stay healthy, we need to do regular activities and stay connected with the people around us and this is why Men's Sheds have become an important part of communities across Maranoa.

A State of Fire Emergency has been declared across 42 Local Government Areas in Queensland. following a period of significantly heightened fire weather conditions expected to continue into next week. Southern Downs The Region and Toowoomba Region are included in this declaration and locals need to be aware of the dangers.

The State of Fire Emergency prohibits the lighting of all types of outdoor fires, and bans certain activities that can cause fires to ignite.

The declaration overrides all existing permits or authorities to light fires, sugar cane burning notifications, fireworks, and the lighting of any outdoor cooking fires.

It also prohibits welding, grinding and the use of oxy acetylene cutting or heating outdoors; and any device or activity that incorporates a naked flame or can be a source of ignition.

The declaration orders any person finding a fire burning in the open air to take all possible steps to extinguish it and, as soon as practicable, report the existence and locality of the fire to QFES.

Substantial penalties could be issued to those who breach this declaration, including fines of up to 25 penalty units or two years imprisonment.

The declaration commenced on 9 November 2019 and remains in force until cancelled. amended or revoked.



The Lands Department has advised the Warwick Shire Council that approval has been given for the establishment of a reserve next to Dalrymple Park to accommodate the Allora Apex Club's proposed golf course. The Council has been appointed trustee of the reserve and is in a position to lease the land to the Apex Club. "Work on the course can start as soon as the lease agreement is initiated," CEO Jim Stacey said. The proposed nine-hole course would be situated between the New England Highway and the town of Allora with two access bridges across Dalrymple Creek planned.

#### Wheat Harvest

During the past week the reaper and binder and stripping machines have been at work on the wheat paddocks left to come to maturity, the binders being generally used on paddocks on which sufficient arowth

has been made to allow binding, on

account of the value of the straw. In a few instances fair yields of grain have been harvested amounting to an average of 6 to 7 bags per acre. Such paddocks, however, are the exception and generally the yield reaches from 2 to 3 bags per acre. The grain is of excellent quality and most of the farmers fortunate enough to reap any wheat are inclined to hold on to it anticipating a good price owing to the greater part of the crop being required for seed.

#### Allora Burial Ground


To the Editor of the Examiner & Times Sir, Will you allow me through medium of your valuable paper to make a few

The sessions will be chaired by the Southern Downs Regional Council Mayor Tracy Dobie and attended by Councillors, the Chief Executive Officer David Keenan, directors, and managers where appropriate.

Mayor Tracy Dobie said the Q&A Sessions were the most appropriate and pertinent platform for the community to ask questions, voice concerns and receive accurate and up-to-date information from Councillors and staff.

"We invite and encourage residents and businesses to attend Council's Q&A Sessions and bring their

questions and feedback,' said Mayor Dobie.

"Going into a potentially hot and excessively dry summer season. the sessions are timely with the expected completion of construction and trials of the new emergency water infrastructure at Storm King Dam. I am certain that the community will have many questions surrounding the logistics of how Council will roll out the supply of water to Stanthorpe should it be required.'

The sessions will also focus on the recently adopted 18/19 Annual Report, Council's planned Capital Works program and financial position.


