

Keep Our Posties and Drivers Safe

Australia Post is encouraging Australians to do their bit in the lead up to Christmas and help keep our posties and delivery drivers safe, as they ramp up to their busiest part of the vear

From the road to the front vard, posties and delivery drivers can often face unexpected safety risks, from the dog that hasn't been secured, to drivers that zip out of their driveway.

There were more than 370 incidents involving injuries caused by dogs in the 2019 financial year, and for the same period, more than two posties were injured in motorcycle accidents every workday.

One injury or near-miss is one too many, so Australia Post is asking the public to be alert, slow down and remove distractions when drivina

Drivers are asked to slow down, toot their horns and be wary of posties and pedestrians by carefully checking all directions before reversing from their driveway

some top tips to help avoid accidents with its posties and drivers:

- Put your mobile phone out of reach when driving
- · Use your mirrors and check your blind sports for motorcycles and cyclists before turning or changing lanes
- · When reversing out of your driveway, toot your horn and move slowly
- · Keep your dog confined to your property

Local Fire Ban Remains

Queensland Fire and Emergency Services (QF ES) has extended a local fire ban for parts of South Western region.

The local fire ban will remain in place until 2359hrs on Friday 20 December 2019 for residents in the Toowoomba and Southern Downs local government areas.

Heightened fire conditions are perfect for bushfires to ignite and spread quickly.

Under a local fire ban all open fires are prohibited and all Permits to Light Fire which have been issued in

the designated areas have been cancelled.

Fires lit for the purpose of cooking are permitted under a local fire ban provided they are not left unattended, are within a properly constructed barbeque, smoker or oven and managed appropriately.

This may include having a person available to watch out for any ignitions that occur.

Extension available to access water tank rebate

During October Southern Downs Regional Council amended the way in which the water tank rebate is calculated.

Previously residential ratepayers installing tanks with a capacity greater than or equal to 5,000 litres were eligible to receive a rebate of the cost of the tank or \$2,500 whichever is the lesser amount. Under the new changes to the tank rebate scheme, tanks with capacity greater than or equal to 5,000 litres will receive the rebate at 10 cents/litre of the capacity of the tank, up to \$2,500.

In response to extended

Council is allowing a transitional arrangement for those who have ordered their tank prior to 1 December but are still awaiting delivery or installation. This transitional arrangement will allow access to the former rebate scheme which allows for the lesser of the cost of the tank or \$2,500.

Residents who have purchased their tank prior to 1 December will need to provide evidence by way of a confirmation from the supplier or an invoice dated prior to 1 December when they submit their application.

Why shop at Coles anymore?

Minister for Drought David Littleproud has slammed Coles for its low act of skimming millions off the top of its 10 cent milk levy.

The ACCC has ordered Coles pay farmers and processor Norco \$5.25 million it failed to pass on from its 'drought levy'.

"Coles promised me when I negotiated the deal that all the money would go to farmers," Minister Littleproud said.

"They told their customers they were helping farmers, then tried keeping the money. Coles has shown its true colours and needs to put things right. Coles should now lead the way and put at least 20 cents a litre right across its dairy range, not just on milk to show they really do care about dairy farmers. They owe it to dairy farmers and the public for failing to live up to their promises and it will allow time for government reforms such as the Dairy Code of Conduct to come into effect. Australians should show their support for dairy farmers by boycotting Coles until it comes good with this.'


For those who may not have not purchased a water tank but wish to access this rebate scheme, Council encourages you to act fast as the scheme will be winding up at the end of this financial year.

Southern Downs Regional Council Mayor Tracy Dobie said she had seen many residents taking extra steps towards even more sustainable homes.



Allora's Past 25 years ago December 1994


Cricket Championships

Allora's Past 100 years ago December 1919

Thunderstorm

Accounts coming in from the outside districts show that Wednesday's thunderstorm was widespread, considerable damage being caused by the high winds. In the town itself several windmills were blown down and trees torn up. A high board fence around the R.C. Church was blown down in several places and the Convent school was shifted considerably out of plumb. In the vicinity of the town the houses of several farmers were completely demolished and sheds unroofed; the heaviest sufferers in this respect being Messrs J. Tickle and E. S. Maher. At Hendon the residence of Mr. A. Masters was partially unroofed and much damage done to outbuildings. The storm passed on up the Goomburra

Wheat Harvest

Reaping operations in our immediate neighbourhood are drawing to a close. I was informed by Mr. Andrew Dougall of Spring Creek, that he had cut 220 acres in 18 days, giving an average of 12 acres a day. The best work being done by the machine being 30 acres in two days with two horses. This is great work, and the machine itself appears to be the least complex and liable to get out of order of any reaper that I have seen. Its principal drawback is that it will not act when the wheat is laid down by the wind or rain: but this is a disadvantage under which, understand, all machines must labour to a greater or lesser extent. (Warwick Examiner & Times 18th

December 1869).
