

Successful Show



The produce exhibits in the pavilion were not large in number but were of excellent quality. Patrons were welcomed to the grounds by Showgirl quest winner Fiona Hoey, Charity Showgirl winner Nadine May, and Miss Junior Showgirl Shannon Lyons.

Allora's Past 100 years ago February 1920

Show Postponed

Mr. W. A. Dean (President) presided over a splendid attendance of the Central Downs Agricultural and Horticultural Association during which a lengthy discussion took place on the advisability of postponing the show in view of the protracted dry weather conditions, together with the unsettled state of affairs in connection with the dreaded pneumonic influenza outbreak at present threatening in

the State. It was finally decided that the show be postponed indefinitely.

Allora's Past 150 years ago February 1870

Dud Cheque

Joseph Harrison and Thomas Cussens were charged before His Honour Mr. Justice Lutwyche in the Toowoomba Circuit Court with forging and uttering a valueless cheque for £5/6/0 at the Railway Terminus, Allora. Sergeant Robert Grayson of Allora gave evidence that Harrison presented the cheque to Mr. Ewen McMillan, proprietor of the Hendon Hotel, in payment for a bottle of brandy and had been given the balance in change. The defendants were charged when the cheque was dishonoured at the bank. Michael Culhane, hotel proprietor at the railway terminus, and Elizabeth Farrell who conducted a small store at

Glengallan Swamp, gave evidence that that they had been offered, and rejected, the same cheque. The men were found not guilty of the charge.

Allora's Past 75 years ago February 1945

Operational Tour

Pilot Officer Ralph Roberton, of Allora, completed an Operational Tour as navigator in a Mitchell bomber squadron in the R.A.F. An operational tour involved 50 operational sorties over enemy held territory. 27 sorties were completed in the first two months of operations, sometimes flying 2 and 3 trips in a day. At one stage 5 bombing raids were made from England to France in 48 hours. After one of the trips a crew member counted 150 splinter holes in the aircraft.

Big signings strengthen Wattles side

The new acquisitions don't come without losses however, with the Warriors waving goodbye to centre pairing Nick Van Der Poel and Jake Hargreaves.

President Amanda O'Halloran extended thanks

"We're all very excited," she said.

With trial games cancelled last weekend, all eyes will be on the Barrett Shield to be played on March 7.
