Bolzan's Farm Irrigation Dam


Friday evening 14th February the Local Disaster Management Group advises of a dam break on a private property on Dalrymple Creek Road, Talgai. The Farm Irrigation Dam is owned by Talgai businessman Joe Bolzan who spotted the hole and alerted the Southern Downs Regional Council to the situation.

SDRC, consulting Eng-Qld Fire & ineers, Emergency Service & Qld Police Service attended the site to assess the damage to the wall. evacuate residents identified to be at risk and to close roads potentially affected by excessive water.

The dam being full has a capacity of 350 ml and estimated to be 2 to 3 metres deep. A significant hole approximately 3.5m x 1.5m in size had developed at the base with water gushing from this hole, compromising the wall of the dam.

However a large paddock below the dam wall in which the water first impacted, allowed for a broader dispersal should the dam wall fully fail.

By Sunday morning Dam Inspectors identified that the water was continuing to flow in a controlled manner from the dam. At

As we progress through another summer with another unique challenge, I ask readers to seriously consider spending your holidays throughout Queensland, to help turn tourism around.



Pipeline Concerns

Member for Southern Downs, James Lister MP has questioned the cost of building a water pipeline from Toowoomba to Warwick.

Mr Lister is concerned that the State Government doesn't know what it will cost the people of Southern Downs.

He noted that Toowoomba residents are charged an additional amount of up to \$1,000 per annum to pay for the city's pipeline from Wivenhoe Dam.

Further improvements to **Farm Household Allowance**

More red tape will be slashed for Farm Household Allowance applications with new legislation introduced into Parliament.

Minister for Agriculture and Drought David said the Government was committed to making sure farmers could access the allowance

"I don't want farmers jumping through hoops when it's not needed,' Minister Littleproud said.

"We've taken several recommendations from a farmer-led panel to make the FHA applications more straightforward.

"These changes are another step in simplifying the Farm Allowance.






