ALLORA'S MILITARY HISTORY

1888 - 1902


The Queensland Defence Force gave approval for a rifle corps to be established in Allora in December 1888. Captain Ken Hutchison of the Warwick unit called a meeting of those men who were interested to sign a Service Roll book and have their measurements taken for uniforms.

In January 1889, Dr Francis Pain was appointed captain, and Patrick Donovan, lieutenant of the E Company at Allora. 20 acres (8ha) was purchased from James Stewart for the establishment of a rifle range.

The Allora Rifle Range was on the site of the Dalrymple Landscape Haulage. It was used up until the 1960s. Well known champion shooters from Allora were William Moulday who won the King's Prize: Tom Maher Snr. picked for the Australian team to go to Western Australia but had to pull out due to work commitments: Eric Earlandson and Queen's Prize (Queensland Champion) winner Percy Gartner.

There was an attempt to form an infantry corps at a meeting in 1892, but insufficient numbers were received. Those present at the meeting suggested that a mounted infantry should be substituted.

An appeal in the Allora Guardian in July 1897, "To Young Men of Allora and District" to attend a public meeting at the Allora State School, to consider the desirability of forming a mounted infantry corps in Allora. The forty men

who attended the meeting, were told the details of the privileges and duties. They would have to provide their own horse but would receive an allowance for forage. The term of service was three years and payment was based on the number of drills attended. The recruits had the cost of uniforms deducted from their pay. Thirty-two men at the meeting gave their names as being interested in enrollina.

In November 1898, a detachment of G Company Queensland Infantry, Warwick, was formed in Allora with twentyone enrolled. Drill was held weekly in Allora and the men had to travel to Warwick for muster and musketry

When the Queensland

Government voted to send a Queensland Contingent of Mounted Infantry to South Africa in 1899, a special muster of G Company was held in Allora. The enrolling officer Captain Chauvel explained the rates of pay and conditions of pay and asked for volunteers. Eleven members of the company gave their names for service - J Banks, C Bourne, J Burge, A A Cameron, G Hutton, T Kennedy, W Stewart, C R Stewart, R S Thompson, S Washbourne and W White.

The Allora Guardian reported that no other Q.M.I. Company in Queensland had a higher number of volunteers.

The Boer War continued over the years 1899 to 1902. All volunteers were required to serve for one year.

all over 50 men Allora-Clifton area enlisted during that period. The first eleven enlistments in 1899 were part of the 1st Contingent. The others were members of either the 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th Contingents. Those who ioined the final Commonwealth Contingent in 1902 arrived in Durban in June 1902 after peace had been declared.

Four men from the district died. Lieut. L J Caskev. Corporal G B Conley, Private J H Anderson and Private M

Over the next few weeks leading up to the Anzac Day 2020, the stories of some of the men from the district whose names are etched on the Boer War Monument in the Memorial Park will be featured.

Park Name Retained


Warwick Shire Councillors voted to retain the name Dalrymple Creek Park despite two petitions calling for the renaming of the park. One of the petitions containing 83 signatures called for the name to be changed to the Eric Ireland Memorial Parklands in honour of the late Eric Ireland "who devoted 16 hard-toiled vears and 450 trees to beautify the area of the park in a township that he loved." The second petition containing 222 signatures called for the park to be renamed Dalrymple Creek Reserve - Eric Ireland

Memorial Parklands. Acting CEO Jim Stacey pointed out that none of the signatories on the first petition listed their address as Allora and a large number on the second petition did not live in Allora. Mayor Bruce Green said that the issue had divided Allora unnecessarily and the matter was now closed.

Allora's Past 75 years ago March

St. Patrick's Ball

The lead up to St. Patrick's Day took the form of a ball in the Central Hall. The function was very successful. Door takings were £58. Ball arrangements were done efficiently by a committee comprising of the following: President, Rev. Father M. Mahon; Chairman, J. Hilton; Secretary-treasurer, Ray Marshall, Supper convenor, Mrs. J. E. Marshall. The Children of Mary were

responsible for the attractive decorative scheme, while the ladies of the parish gave able assistance to Mrs. Marshall in providing and serving the supper. Mr. Tom Cowley was MC and Mr. George Thompson was in the box office.

Allora's Past 100 years ago March 1920

Diptheria Outbreak

In consequence of receiving a report of cases of diphtheria in the town, the Commissioner for Health directed that swabs be taken from the children attending the State School. This was done last week by a representative of the Health Department. As a consequence of this action the Shire Council was notified by telegram that there were 43 carriers of the disease attending the school. The necessary precautions have accordingly been taken and the school closed.

Allora's Past 150 years ago March 1870

Church of England

A large and influential meeting was held in the English Church for the purpose of securing the services of the Rev. C. J. Clayton as the resident clergyman for Allora and surrounding stations. It is proposed to guarantee a stipend of £200 per annum and judging from appearances, there will be very little difficulty in obtaining it. Mr. George Clark, who was present, promised £50 p.a. absolutely and £80 if required, other gentlemen present promised sums amounting to the aggregate of £30. I hear that this amount has been largely augmented since with the assistance of Goomburra. Clifton and Pilton. No fears need be entertained for the success of the movement.
