

Allora Poice Report - 18 May 2020

Traffic Crash / Stolen Car: At around 9pm Wednesday night 13th May, Warwick Police were called to attend a single vehicle traffic crash in Chappel Road, Willowvale. At time of Police arrival, the car was abandoned; the driver of the vehicle (and any potential occupants) were nowhere to be seen. The involved Mazda 3 hatchback was a write-off as a result of the crash. During subsequent inquiries made, it was determined that the car had in fact, only been stolen within the previous hour, from the backyard of a Darling Street, Allora address. Until Police arrival at their doorstep, the owner of the car was not aware that the car had actually been taken.

Wednesday, 20th May 2020

It has since been ascertained that similarly and prior to stealing the car, the offenders had also taken a child's "Thumpster" minibike from the yard of a nearby address in William Street. That theft was not noticed until the afternoon of Thursday 14th May, when the property owner noticed that her rear garden shed, in which the bike had been stored, was open. To date,

the red/orange Thumpster bike has not been located.

Follow-up investigations undertaken by Allora Police with the assistance of local Allora businesses, identified several, potential juvenile offenders Warwick. The Warwick Child Protection and Investigation Unit (CPIU) have since taken carriage of the investigation, with two male juvenile offenders now spoken with and dealt with under the provisions of the Youth Justice Act. these Arising from

incidents, Allora Officers would once-again, like to remind and warn Allora residents in terms of their vehicle and property security. These were not targeted crimes, but simply ones of opportunity, committed by offenders from other towns and areas passing through Allora. Even if you're home, please lock and secure your vehicles, your sheds and secure anything within or from the yard that may be easily stolen. If you see something that is not right, or someone "hanging around" in circumstances that are suspect, please contact Policelink 131 444; Policing response whether our Officers are off-duty or patrolling in other parts of the area.

Hoons Caught in the Act: At about 5:10pm on the 15th day of May 2020, Allora Police along with several members of the public had their attention drawn to the sound of two vehicles performing burnouts between Allora State School and Freedom Fuels Service Station. Thanks to the prompt and accurate descriptions and directions provided by witnesses, both vehicles were tracked and intercepted on the New England Highway south of Allora only minutes after the incident.

It was identified that the vehicles were travelling in convoy, and that the two females and three males from the vehicles were associates from Loganlea.

The driver of one vehicle, a 20 year old man, was charged for wilfully creating unnecessary noise/smoke by way of a burnout, driving and unregistered and uninsured vehicle, attaching false number plates, failing


to display L plates, and driving without a supervisor.

The driver of the second vehicle, a 21 year old man, was served with infringement notices for disobeying the speed limit, and attaching false number plates.

In addition, all five persons were fined \$1,334 each for contravening the Chief Health Officer's Direction (COVID-19) in relation to their non-essential travel outside of 50 kilometres from their residential addresses.

Police are committed to protecting and maintaining the health and safety of the community, and ensuring that offenders from other localities are quickly deterred from bringing unlawful or undesirable behaviour to our town.

Tight controls continue at Warwick saleyards

While some COVID-19 restrictions will ease across the region, tight control measures will continue at the Warwick Saleyards for the foreseeable future to ensure the yard's ongoing essential operation during the pandemic.

Wednesday, 20th May 2020

Southern Downs Regional Council representative to the yards Advisory Committee Councillor Marco Gliori said that by and large. the livestock agents and permanent buyers had respected the guidelines and he acknowledged the importance that the guidelines played in keeping the saleyards operational as an essential service for the region during COVID-19.

One important change is the process of including additional buyers outside of the permanent buyers list through a weekly preregistration process by 5pm the day prior to the sales. If they are not on the permanent buyers list then they will need to pre-register

through their preferred agent.

The following rules for attending the saleyards will continue until further notice:

- · Only agents, essential staff and permanent buyers will be allowed entry.
- · Additional buyers will need to pre-register by 5pm the day prior to the sale through their preferred agent. There will be a limit to the number of additional buyers allowed to enter the sale and they must have genuine intent to purchase.
- · The main access gate will be manned and each person entering will need to provide their name and contact details and sign a health declaration.
- · Only one buyer representative will be permitted on the premises.
- · Persons observed to be unwell may be refused entry.
- · Social distancing will be monitored and enforced by Council staff

Ekka Led Steer Competition

Entries are now open for the Royal Queensland Show's (Ekka) Led Steer Competition, which will run in a modified format in 2020 due to the covid-19 pandemic.

This year the competition will feature all Hook classes with double the prize money on offer - a total of more than \$13,000 up for grabs.

Judging will be carried out by qualified Aus-Meat chiller assessors on Wednesday 5 August.

Reserve Champions and Champions will also have their carcasses auctioned to the highest bidder via a livestream.

RNA Beef Committee Chair Gary Noller said it was important the RNA found a way to continue to

run the competition in some capacity.


"The carcass information helps exhibitors to promote their bull sales from late August to October during spring bull sale season."






