

Police pursuit through Allora

Allora was the final destination for a 71-yearsold Brisbane man who has been charged with more than 10 serious domestic violence related offences following a dramatic police pursuit through Warwick and Allora early Monday morning.

Wednesday, 15th July 2020

Shortly after 10pm on Sunday night, it was alleged the man attended a Chandler residence and forced entry before assaulting a 68-yearold woman known to him with a wooden club.

It is also alleged the man then threatened the woman before leaving the residence.

Police attended and observed the man leaving

Officers patrolling the Cunningham Highway observed the man's ute heading towards Warwick where a pursuit was authorised.

Crews from Warwick and Brisbane were involved in the pursuit.

The man was arrested by the Police Dog Squad after allegedly attempting to reverse the ute out of a dead-end street in Allora.

He has been charged with 13 offences including deprivation of liberty, common assault, enter dwelling, contravention of a domestic violence order and unlawful stalking.

The man appeared in the Warwick Magistrates Court

This week Principal of St Patrick's School Allora Tyronne Maher welcomed back students to another term of learning.

Wednesday, 15th July 2020

While the whole of Queensland is heading into 'Stage 3' in easing restrictions, some things will remain.

- Social distancing adults are to maintain a distance of 1.5m from one another. Children in schools are exempt from this however we still attempt to do so where possible;
- · Staying home when we are unwell - keeping your child at home when they are presenting with cold and flu like symptoms continues to be important. Children will be sent home if we observe these symptoms;
- Hygiene Coughing and sneezing etiquette continues to be taught and encouraged along with regular washing of hands using soap and (where

70th WEDDING ANNIVERSARY

Alan and Marylyn Ferguson were married at Sandgate on 15th July, 1950.

"We've got to know each other fairly well," Alan said.

He is now 91 and his wife

Alan, whose family had a property at Bowenville and Marylyn, a city girl, met at a dance at Sandgate.

After they were married, the couple went west, where Alan worked as a jackaroo at Surat and later became a property manager at Wandoan.

Marylyn had never been out of Brisbane but, being an animal lover, she learned to ride a horse within weeks and was mustering within a few weeks of that.

In 1956 they moved to Dirranbandi where Alan worked for the Crothers family on "Booligar", before he was sent to manage a nearby property owned by the Crothers

They enjoyed working for the Crothers family and recently attended an event to mark the 150th anniversary of "Booligar" - there were 165 guests and Alan and Marylyn were the oldest there.

The place Alan was managing was on the Balonne River, which flooded in 1956 and for six months the couple were isolated by floodwaters.

At the end of the flood, a light aircraft dropped big bundles of papers and mail onto the property.

That's when he would learn to fly. The couple went to Brisbane where Alan gained his pilot's licence before returning to the bush, working on stations and eventually managing a station at Wandoan.

He picked up a job with McTaggarts in Brisbane and the firm sent him to Clermont

to open a branch, where Marylyn managed the office and Alan managed the branch.

In 1967, he became the company's full-time pilot and was based at Rockhampton from 1967 to 1994 when he retired, having also served as manager of McTaggart's stud stock section.

After retiring Alan and Marylyn moved to Allora where they still live on the land.

During their lifetime they were also into racing and had a team of horses at Rockhampton for 25 years as well as a

team at Toowoomba for 15

"Over those years we never put a bridle on a horse that didn't win its races," Alan said.



One of their horses won the prestigious 2-Year-Old Classic at Rockhampton around 1994.

Alan and Marylyn are planning a quiet celebration for their 70th anniversary - probably with a few of their neighbours.

New trade era with Indonesia

A new trade arrangement with one of the world's fastest growing economies is now in place as part of the Indonesia-Australia Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (IA-CEPA).

Wednesday, 15th July 2020

Agriculture Minister David Littleproud said almost 100 per cent of Australian goods exported to Indonesia will now enter duty free or under significantly improved and preferential arrangements.

"By 2050 Indonesia is projected to be the world's fourth largest economy, with per person consumption predicted to be greater than China for key commodities such as cereals and beef," Minister Littleproud said.

"With many restrictive tariff requirements for our exporters being eliminated under this agreement, Indonesia represents a game-changing opportunity for our farmers.

"Securing this breakthrough with our sixth largest agricultural export market will help turbo charge trade opportunities in both countries and propel our post pandemic recovery.

"More dollars will flow into the hip pockets of our beef, cattle, grains and horticultural producers,

and into their rural and regional economies on the back of this agreement

"The benefits will be across the board and are a reminder of how our farmers and the agriculture sector will continue to be the bedrock of our recovery from the COVID-19 crisis."

A quota of 575,000 live Australian male cattle per year will enter Indonesia duty free. The quota will increase to 700,000 per year by 2026. Previously, live male cattle had a five per cent tariff.

There will be a 2.5pc tariff cut for frozen beef, which previously had a five per cent tariff. After five years the 2.5pc tariff will be eliminated.

Australian exporters of feed grains such as wheat, barley and sorghum will enjoy duty free access for up to 500,000 tonnes per year into Indonesia. The quota will increase by five per cent per year.

Horticulture exporters will also benefit, with reduced tariffs and improved access across a range of commodities including citrus, carrots and potatoes.

"Our dairy farmers will benefit from the elimination of a five per

cent tariff on concentrated and sweetened milk and cream," Minister Littleproud said.

"The nation's farmers have been calmly going about feeding Australia during COVID-19 and exporting to the world.

"The Australian Government stands by our farmers and continues to work to find new and expand existing markets to give them a competitive edge."

After demanding an explanation she was told that the station master had received instructions from the Minister for Works that no females of a certain class were to be allowed to travel on the Queensland railroads. On advice the lady employed local vehicles to convey her to Allora.







Many people would not be aware that the Andersons are a pioneering Allora family and Jimmy's ancestors actually accompanied famed explorer Allan Cunningham out on his exploration to discover the Darling Downs in 1827. Apparently they

were all keen golfers and at the end of the expedition Cunningham gave Jimmy's ancestors a dozen golf balls. Jimmy is still using those golf balls today. Runner up was Benny Duff, part of the well known Duff sporting dynasty, who scored 22 points which is not bad considering Ben is not playing golf all that often.
