



"We all saw a need to energise our community creatives, connect residents, re-connect with neighbours and engage visitors imagery and storytelling are powerful tools to do this," said Amy.


"By sharing their stories and collaborating on ideas together, our creative crew took the first step toward creating a digital footprint for Allora and the greater region.

#### **Lister takes local border closure** problems to the Premier

"The border closure put in place at 01:00 AM Saturday morning, although necessary, has again hit the border communities of our electorate hard", State Member for Southern Downs, Mr James Lister said on Monday.

"My Southern Downs Electorate staff and I have been inundated with phone calls and emails. Constituents on both sides of the border have discovered on Monday morning that they can not send their children to school, can not buy groceries, can not go to work, service clients or tend to their animals. My office has been working with the Premier's office to flag these urgent issues on behalf of people on both sides of the border. I've already written to the Premier with concerns about the border closure's

Southern Downs, and I'll be writing to her again and speaking in Parliament this week to formalise our most recent concerns".

"The border closure is a necessary move to protect Queensland from coronavirus and I think that everyone understands this. But my job is to represent those workers. communities, farmers and small businesses who have disproportionately impacted by the latest closure. If Queensland is to be safe from coronavirus, the burden mustn't fall on our people alone. From veterinary surgeons to tyre shops, from teachers to farmers, our people living and working along the border on both sides are having a rough time."



#### **Wrecked Machine**

Orders were received by Lieutenant Garth Elwyn and Air Mechanic White from Melbourne to disassemble the wrecked Peace Loan aeroplane and truck it to Melbourne. Both the airmen and the plane left by today's train. In conversation with the mechanic he stated that before landing they expected the plane to crash and both said goodbye to each other. It was miraculous how they escaped from serious injury. Lieut. Elwyn expects to

bring another plane up when he reaches Melbourne.

Allora's Past 150 years ago August 1870

#### **District Court**

The Mayor and the Corporation of Allora sued Mr C. H. Green, owner of Goomburra Station, for £200 for breach of the bye-laws of the municipality by depasturing sheep within the boundaries of the municipality. Evidence was given that two separate mobs of 800 sheep were seen grazing on the burial grounds, the camping reserve, around the Weslevan Church and on public streets. Mr Green claimed that the sheep were grazing on his own land within the town boundaries and that the bye-laws had not been properly constituted. The judge ruled a non-suit and the case was dismissed.

#### Landholders urged to take caution this fire season

Ergon Energy is urging property owners to take extra precautions if they're conducting controlled burns near the electricity network ahead of fire season.

Queensland bushfire season traditionally starts this month.

Ergon Energy Network Manager Dingle said Queensland landholders needed to be aware of the dangers associated with power poles being damaged or destroyed by fire.

"We've had significant damage in areas right across regional Queensland the past two fire seasons,' Mr Dingle said.

Fires can customers and the poles and wires that supply them with power - some for up to

"Just as concerning is a pole that is only partially burnt because it could be significantly weakened and fail at a later date, bringing down high-voltage wires. he said.

Landholders are urged to be aware of their surrounds and remain vigilant to themselves and their property safe while conducting any bushfire mitigation work.

Property owners should trim or clear any long grass, foliage and rubbish within a three-metre radius of their poles and closely monitor any controlled burns they carry out.

Anyone seeing a fire close to power poles or if they see a pole on fire, should call 000.




