Upper Forest Springs Road Bridge Replacement

A number of Southern Downs councillors were also in attendendce for the opening of the Upper Forest Springs Road Bridge Replacement.

Wednesday, 19th August 2020

Mayor Pennisi said the bridge upgrades will make a "big difference" to Forest Spring residents and other commuters.

"This bridge services not only residents, but farmers and producers, and is a vital piece of infrastructure that keeps the local community connected and moving," he said.

"Council will continue to seek funding opportunities to replace a number of old timber bridges within our road network and undertake important bridge repairs.

"While road safety is everyone's responsibility, council is committed to building better, safer bridges across our region for all road users, whether they are locals or visitors who travel here to enjoy everything that our unique locality has to offer."

Whilst at the opening of the bridge, before moving on to the opening of Palmer Bridge in Freestone, Member for Maranoa David



Littleproud spoke of the nations reliance on small towns such as Clifton, Allora and Forest Springs in the resurgance from COVID-19.

He said it was upgrades like these that are vital for small towns.

"While this may be a smaller one than Palmer Bridge. let me say this is just as important to these people behind us and on the other side and you only have to look into the paddocks around us to see how important this bridge will be to these people that are going to get us out of the COVID-19 recession." Mr Littleproud said.

"This is where it will happen, it won't be in the cities, it will be in the regions, and this piece of infrastructure will be the infrastructure that empowers

them and empowers our nation to get out of the recession."

The Federal Government

committed \$301,400 to the project whilst the Southern Downs Regional Council committed \$441,000.

llora Police New

Over the past few weeks Allora and Leyburn Police have been pro-actively targeting the possession and transportation of dangerous drugs on our roads within the local area. In 5 days alone, 10 persons have been charged with 16 offences, stemming from the location methylamphetamine, cannabis, and other drugrelated items - including one man being in possession of over 6 ounces (168 grams) of cannabis hidden in his vehicle. The subsequent charges preferred, include multiple

counts of supplying methylamphetamine (ice) and 3,4-methylenedioxymethamphetamine (MDMA / Ecstasy), as well as possession of methylamphetamine and cannabis, possession of drug utensils and disqualified driving. All persons were residents of Warwick, Allora and Clifton, and will appear before the Warwick Magistrates Court later this year.

Road Safety Month

It's Road Safety Month until Sunday 6th September and while Police focus is always on the "Fatal 5" of Drink & Drug Driving, Speeding, Driver Inattention, Seatbelts and Fatique this year's attention will be further directed toward "Dangerous Driving Habits".

Although the "Fatal Five" contributed to over one-third of all serious crashes where people were killed or seriously injured on Queensland roads, behaviours like tailgating, not giving way, running red lights, and breaking a range of other road rules contributed to half of all serious crashes

This campaign's focus is on tailgating and failing to give way because, apart from the Fatal Five, they are the two of the most frequent contributors to serious crashes in Queensland.

Rural road fatalities made up two thirds of last vear's national road toll. 835 people tragically lost their lives on regional roads last vear

A staggering 78% of city and regional drivers admit to risky driver behaviour generally, while one in five confess to being more likely to break a road rule in rural areas.

Worryingly, speed is the number one dangerous driving act that all Australians are prepared to risk on rural roads, while speed, fatigue and drunk driving are the top behaviours found to most likely impact rural drivers

Allora Police are asking all local and district road users to concentrate while driving, adhere to the road rules and especially, to drive to the conditions of the road at the time. "We just want to make sure that all road users, get to where they're going safely, each and every time". Sergeant Damian F. Grace said.

Southern Downs Regional Council has appointed Mr David Burges as the new Chief Executive Officer.



New Bigger, Stronger Palmer Bridge

The upgraded Palmer Bridge in Freestone was opened at the weekend, benefiting residents and the agriculture industry in the Southern Downs town.

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Infrastructure, Transport and Regional Development Michael McCormack said the newly opened concrete single-span structure, which replaced the former timber bridge, would make a meaningful difference to the community.

"The new bridge has a 100-year lifespan with a significant increase in load capacity as it now can carry 166-tonnes which will be of great benefit for local primary producers and transport companies.

"The new bridge supported 26 jobs during construction and is a great local example of how the Australian Government's investment in infrastructure nationwide is supporting jobs and communities at a time when it's needed most." Mr McCormack said.

Minister for Agriculture, Drought and Emergency Management and Federal Member for Maranoa David Littleproud, who attended the opening, said the new bridge offered oversize access and a detour when the Cunningham Highway is closed.

"The bridge's approaches have been realigned to better integrate with Freestone Road, which improves safety for all motorists including agricultural workers in the area," Mr Littleproud said.

"The bridge has been widened from 5.5 metres to 9.2 metres and the height has risen from 4.8 metres to 6.15 metres, which means the bridge will close less often during flooding."

Southern Downs Mayor Vic Pennisi said he was thrilled to see the region's important assets updated.

"Palmer Bridge has been a part of our region since the 1960s and it's heartening to see it receive this attention and care."

Palmer Bridge, which spans the Freestone Creek, was built in 1964 and named in honour of Freestone's Palmer Brothers. One was Mr W L Palmer, who was Deputy Chairman of Glengallan Shire Council (1957-64), having served on Council from 1939. Glengallan Shire was

absorbed into Warwick Shire in 1994, which in turn merged with Stanthorpe Shire to form Southern Downs Regional Council in 2008 The project was jointly funded with the Australian Government committing \$1.494 million and Southern Downs Regional Council \$1.504 million.

Methodist Church at 34 Herbert Street

Hvmn Numbers Board

An historic item was returned to Allora last week when the hymn numbers board from the Allora Methodist Church was given to the Allora and District Historical Society and hung on the wall of the Warwick Street museum.

The original Wesley Chapel was opened in Allora on Christmas Dav 1866. In 1896 the old building was replaced by the new Methodist Church on the site that is now 34 Herbert Street. This building served the Allora Methodist congregation until 1977 when the Uniting Church was formed with the amalgamation of the Methodist, Presbyterian and Congregational Churches in Australia. The Methodist Church building was sold and the Uniting Church congregation moved into the former St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Warwick Street. Some years later the decision was made to sell the St. Andrew's Church manse. The new owner found the hymn board in the ceiling and contacted former Upper Forest Springs resident Graham Hoey who is a senior member of the Allora Uniting Church. Graham also happens to be a great nephew of George Richard Tickle who the hymn board was dedicated to.

George senior and Caroline Tickle

came to the Darling Downs in 1863 and in the early 1870's selected the farm "Beulah" at Upper Forest Springs. The Tickle family valued became members of the Allora Methodist congregation. Their second son George

Richard Tickle was on the building committee of the new Methodist Church in 1896. G. R. Tickle conducted the Excelsior Bakery at what is now 48 Herbert Street from 1902 until his retirement in the early 1940's.

Graham Hoey spent a great deal of time restoring the silky oak hymn

board at the Warwick Street museum

numbers board and in consultation with his cousin the late Ian "Kookie" Tickle decided to donate it to the Allora and District Historical Society.

(If anyone knows of the whereabouts of the Methodist Church WWI honour board the Historical Society would be keen to hear about it).
