Grants Allocated For Local Shows


Queensland Local Government Minister Stirling Hinchliffe has announced that Show Societies on the Southern Downs will receive Grants to assist with operating costs associated with conducting a local Show. These grants have come at a time when smaller show societies are finding it extremely difficult to conduct their local show.

Local Show Societies to receive grants include -

• Allora Show Society Inc - \$9,524

- Killarney Show & Rodeo
 Society Inc \$6,150
- Warwick Show & Rodeo Society - \$17,084

The Show Societies Grants Program provides financial support for running Agricultural Shows and costs towards the construction and maintenance of showground assets. When Show Societies own their grounds they may use up to 50% of their funding towards new infrastructure works that meet the required timeframe and program objectives.



New Golf Course Bridge To Be Named After Local Legend

Construction of a bridge across Dalrymple Creek on the Allora Golf Course is well underway. The new bridge will allow golfers to cross the creek more safely when playing the 9th and 18th holes and mean that the old weir crossing will no longer be used.

At the monthly Sports Club meeting last week it was decided unanimously to dedicate the bridge to local sporting and business icon Mr Tommy Maher Junior. Tommy Maher commenced playing golf in 1934 at the Sunshine Golf Links in Hendon, a club that was established in 1932 with Tommy's father Tom Maher Senior being a foundation member.

In quick time, Tommy reduced his handicap from 36 to 20 and in his very first year of golf as a ten year old won the Mrs A C Lickiss award for Best Junior Golfer.

Five years later, on the 15th August 1939, then fifteen years of age and playing off a handicap of 9, Tommy entered the Queensland Country Championships to be played at Royal Queensland Golf Course in Brisbane.

Tommy was the youngest

ever player to contest the title which was decided over 36 holes of stroke play. A record 50 golfers contested the event and Tommy finished thirteenth. One can only imagine the difference between playing on the sandy fairways and greens at Hendon to the lush fairways and manicured greens of Royal Queensland Golf Course.

To prove that his sporting prowess extended beyond golf, in 1940 and having just turned sixteen, Tommy played five eight in the Allora Rugby League team that won the Hosking Cup against Clifton with a score of six to nil.

Tommy went on to win many local golfing championships as well as a Queensland Country Championship.

In 1950 as a member of the Warwick Golf Club, Tommy won the Club Championship, a feat that our good friends in Warwick would have been none too pleased about - an Allora lad beating their finest golfers, particularly as Tommy would have been such a humble champion.

Many Allora locals will remember Tommy Maher

and his wife Mary running the Golden Fleece fuel business on the corner of Warwick and Forde Streets with Tommy also running a sand and gravel business which son Michael continues to run today. The Maher family have always been highly regarded business and community people who treat all their customers and friends with respect and

dignity.

When the bridge is completed, it will be officially opened by Michael Maher and on that day the Sports Club committee would like to invite the community to join them to celebrate what will be a special moment in the history of our town. Further details of the official opening will follow

The Back

Return to rainfall good news for farmers

forecast of above average rainfall and average summer temperatures has many Australian farmers hopeful for a bumper summer cropping season.

Wednesday, 23rd September 2020

The Bureau of Meteorology has reported a 70 per cent chance of La Niña developing in Australia, indicating a promising rainfall prediction for many areas of the country.

Andrew Short from Pacific Seeds said that the most recent three-month outlook has many growers feeling very positive about the upcoming cropping season, especially after a string of difficult summer seasons.

"Both the predicted rainfall and temperature outlook are looking very encouraging," Mr Short said.

"The sentiment amongst farmers has greatly improved, especially after seeing some good rainfall recently.

"We've already had some strong fronts coming through over the last two months which have been helping to finish off some of the winter crops and also to build moisture for summer cropping.

Insights from ABARES suggest that better seasonal conditions are expected to see the value of farm production increase to \$61 billion in 2020-21, the third straight year over \$60 billion.

This is driven by a strong forecast rebound in grain production, up 15 per cent to \$30.8 billion.

Allora-based graingrower David Peters said that the current weather projections have him entering the summer season with confidence. "It's been an extremely

tough few years - we nearly didn't plant a summer crop last year," Mr Peters said.

"So it's great to have something to look forward

"There is a lot of optimism in the agriculture community at the moment, we're all planning for a big summer crop."

Mr Short said that the promising weather forecast has been reflected in seed demand, with Pacific Seeds seeing an increase

in summer crop orders compared to last year.

"Due to an improved water situation in New South Wales and Victoria, we've already seen very high demand for corn and equally high demand for grain sorghum in Queensland.," he said.

"People in the community have seen the threemonth forecast and are encouraged by a return to wetter conditions.

"While the weather outlook is still a prediction,



the signs are extremely promising - we can only hope it lives up to expectations and delivers a much needed successful season," Mr Short said.

Looking Back... Sullivan's Barn

Timothy Sullivan landed at Moreton Bay in 1861 from County Cork in Ireland, and in 1863 married Hannah Cronin in Brisbane. Timothy worked on Glengallan Station for 12 years before coming to the Allora district in 1875. In 1879 he selected two 40 acres blocks in the Allora Exchange Lands area and built a house near the present day corner of Haig's Road and Donegan Road. Timothy and Hannah had a family of 11 children, 7 of whom reached adulthood. The Sullivan's were a musical family and dances were held in a barn close to the house. It is said that when a dance was to be held the barn

was cleared and the piano was carried from the house to provide the music. Perhaps at one of these dances three of the daughters, Catherine (Kate), Margaret (Maggie) and Anne met their future husbands Harry Reppel, Tom Maher and Michael Fitzgerald. Two other daughters joined Catholic religious orders.

Timothy and Hannah Sullivan retired to a house in Bennett Street in Allora where Timothy died in 1913. The farm

> and the musical tradition were carried on by son Daniel, his wife Catherine, and family. The barn continued to be used for regular dances. In 1926 the Leura Tennis Club was founded using a court on the Sullivan family property "Leura". Fund

raisers and presentation nights continued to be held in the barn throughout the 1930's. A gift evening for one of the daughters was held there. Youngest daughter Winnie was a noted musician. The old house was replaced by a new house which was later moved to South Street in Allora.

Claire Reppel, a granddaughter of Harry and Kate Reppel, recently presented items belonging to the Reppel and Sullivan families to the Allora

and District Historical Society museum. One of the items was a framed collage with a religious theme done by Norah Ellen Sullivan (Sister Mary Cordelia) before she joined the Sisters of Mercy. Another item was a photo of two young ladies who are believed to be Kate and Maggie Sullivan, printed onto glass. Thank you very much to Perry Cronin for his careful reframing of these and another photo of Claire's father Frank Reppel as a young boy.


