

Allora Farewells Kath & Col Turner

Since arriving from South Australia in late 1995, Kath & Col became a big part of the Allora community, getting to know the locals through the Railway Hotel which they leased for 2 years.

Col who was a National Serviceman in the Vietnam War attended an Anzac Day Service in Allora and the late Heather Neale invited him to become a member of the local RSL Sub Branch. Kath joined the Ladies Auxiliary and later became Treasurer. When the Auxiliary closed Kath became Secretary of the Sub-Branch. This was to become a huge part of their lives. From 2014 many grants were applied and received to refurbish the local Sub Branch hall. Jupitors Casino repainted inside and out, refurbished the floors and built a deck off the hall. By 2016 revenue was hard to raise so they took a chance and opened a café to produce enough revenue to keep the hall



solvent. The endeavour proved to be successful. Kath and Col always had a strong belief that the Hall be retained for the local community.

Over 10 years Col volunteered to care for the gardens and clean the hall and later maintained the café on a daily basis and Kath running the kitchen. In their spare time they would be down the main street selling tickets to raise money for the Hall.

It's estimated that Kath

raised in excess of \$100,000 for the RSL Sub Branch.

Kath & Col left Allora last month and are now living in North Queensland to be close to their family.

- Checking your first-aid supplies
- Ensuring that your insurance policy is current and adequate to cover any potential damage



"Also take advantage of the eco option on appliances. Eco cycles not only save water, but also energy and money. If you're purchasing new appliances or upgrading appliances, do your research and check the water rating. The more stars the greater the water saving."

Extreme Level water restrictions of 120 litres per person per day currently apply to all treated town water supplies delivered to the household tap or supplied by a water carter.

The Australian Government is extending the temporary JobKeeper Payment to the end of March 2021. From 28 September, businesses must meet the turnover test and submit their declarations by the 14th of each month.

There will be two new payment rates – one for those who work more than 20 hours per week in the relevant period, and another for those who work less. The employee eligibility date has also changed to 1 July, meaning some businesses could claim for more staff.



Mock Wedding

The sum of £27/6 was taken at a "mock wedding" and dance held in the Goomburra Hall in aid of funds for the Red Cross Society. The function was made more interesting by the fact that the identity of the participants in the entertainment had been kept a close secret until the night of the event. Even then many of the audience were unable to recognise some of the principals.

Society of Creative Anachronisms





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
