

Early votes can be lodged in person at the Warwick Town Hall from next Monday.





Murals Tell The Story of Birds On Allora Mountain

Allora Landcare Group (ALG) has completed the Information Shed at the Reservoir on Allora Mountain. This has taken the form of sheeting to enclose the shed on three sides, each sheet painted with murals of the birds to be found on the Mountain. Over eighty bird species identified, been thanks to Frank Coman, a Brisbane scientist and bird lover who comes to the area regularly to photograph fauna, especially birds. Frank generously gave ALG permission to publish a full colour book of his photos, called 'A Pictorial Guide to the Birds of Allora Mountain Flora and Fauna Reserve'. The book will be officially launched and for sale in the near future.

SDRC wants your feedback on water restrictions



Time is running out to have your say on water restrictions. The Southern Downs Regional Council is reminding residents, businesses and community groups to provide feedback by Sunday 25 October on how the Council can adjust the water restrictions framework in the future Drought Management Plan.

Southern Downs Mayor Vic Pennisi has been pleased with the community's interest and response to date and said that Council wanted to hear from more interested parties.

"We want to encourage everyone to have their say because the more ideas we can integrate into the draft Drought Management Plan, the more reflective it will be as to how we tackle drought

as a community in the future," Mayor Pennisi said.

Traditional public consultation and face-to-face meetings are not viable due to COVID-19 social distancing guidelines but residents, businesses and community groups can have their say by:

- Completing an online survey at www.sdrc.qld. qov.au or www.survey monkey.com/r/JPDQC33
- Emailing a written submission to waterfeedback@ sdrc.qld.gov.au or
- Calling Council directly on 1300 697 372

Feedback received during this consultation period will be incorporated into the Draft Management Plan. The community will have a second opportunity to comment once the draft plan is completed in November.



Wednesday, 14th October 2020

The Australian Government is extending the temporary JobKeeper Payment to the end of March 2021. From 28 September, businesses must meet the turnover test and submit their declarations by the 14th of each month.

There will be two new payment rates – one for those who work more than 20 hours per week in the relevant period, and another for those who work less. The employee eligibility date has also changed to 1 July, meaning some businesses could claim for more staff.

It's part of our plan to keep business in business, and Australians in jobs.



Aussie Egg Farmers Not Chicken



In striving to be the world's best, Australia's egg farmers aren't afraid to have a crack — with the industry leading the way in producing more with less.

Minister for Agriculture, Drought and Emergency Management Littleproud says "Eggs are in 95 per cent of Australian households and are a staple in the national diet.

"Maintaining a fresh, reliable supply of an average of more than 17 million eggs a day is a credit to the hard work of our producers, all those along the supply chain and of course the millions of layer and pullet hens in the national flock.

"I commend the egg industry's efforts during the pandemic and welcome the findings of recent CSIRO research that showed providing safe, nutritious, affordable and secure food staples, like eggs, was more important than ever." Mr

Litleproud said.

According to the CSIRO Australian Egg Industry Community Research Report, 75.8 per cent of respondents said that the pandemic made them more aware of the importance of food security, with 86.2 per cent agreeing that producing eggs was an essential service.

FAST FACTS

- · In 2019-20 Australian egg farmers produced more than six billion eggs.
- · Australian egg farmgate production in 2018-19 was valued at \$828.2 million.
- · A laying hen today lays 38 more eggs per year than a hen did 20 years ago, and it does so despite consuming five per cent less feed.
- · That equals an extra 800 million eggs each year across Australia's national flock, produced with 42,000 tonnes less grain and an emissions saving of 30,000 tonnes of carbon.

Information For Horse Owners

The Department of Agriculture and Fisheries are reminding horse owners that they need to complete movement before moving a horse in Queensland.

- · A movement record can be written or electronic and must be completed every time a horse moves from one property to another.
- Horse owners need to include details of the horses being moved, where to and when.
- · These records allow us to trace horse movements in the event of an emergency animal disease.

A serious exotic or emergency horse disease would seriously impact Queensland's horse industry, much like equine influenza did in 2007 before it was eradicated.

Keeping a record of your horse's movements is a simple step that will help eradication and tracing efforts in the event of an outbreak.


General Manager, Animal Biosecurity and Welfare and Chief Veterinary Officer Allison Crook said horse owners must keep a record every time a horse moves from one property to another.

"How you keep that record, whether a written hard copy or electronically is up to you, but you need to record specific details including which horses are being moved, where to and when, Dr Crook said.

"Some horse events also require a horse health declaration, which can be used as a movement record. and also confirms horses attending events are healthy and are practising good biosecurity.

"Horse owners moving from the cattle tick infested zone to the free zone must also include details of how they have inspected or treated their horse for cattle ticks." Dr Crook said.

Connolly Reunion

More than 250 people including one from America and one from New Zealand attended the Connolly family reunion held in Warwick. They were the descendants of Denis and Timothy Connolly, sons of Timothy and Cate Connolly of Ballydehob, County Cork, Ireland. Denis Connolly arrived in Australia in 1862 and married Johanna Callaghan in 1866. They were the parents of probably the only Allora born knight, Sir James Connolly of W.A., and lived at Allora, Sandy Creek and Elphinstone.

Timothy Connolly and his wife Catherine settled in Warwick in 1877 and were the parents of former Warwick mayor Daniel Connolly.

Allora P.O.W's Home

Two Allora lads, Gunner Les Cooper, son of Mr. W. P. Cooper of Elphinstone. and Private Stan Carlyon, second son of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Carlyon of Drayton Street, Allora, arrived home recently after being prisoners of war in Japanese hands since the fall of Singapore over 3½ years ago. Both worked with F Force for seven months on the building of the Burma Thailand Railway.

Pte. Carlyon said that one of his worst experiences was the forced march from near Bangkok to the Thai Burma border, when they did 185 miles on foot at the rate of about 15 miles a night. They received no food on the march each night, only a bottle of water at the half way point. They were fed poorly during the day and, with duties to be carried out, had very little sleep.

Gnr. Cooper said that he had put on 2 stone in weight since liberation. He said that at no stage did they have any

Allora's Past 150 years ago October

Police Court

A claim was made in the Ipswich Police Court for the return of a mare or her estimated value of £7 be paid. The plaintiff deposed of having come into the possession of the mare by swapping a horse for her with one Henry Gwynne of Allora. Subsequently he had lost her about 15 months ago, and finding her in possession of the defendant applied for her return, which he refused to do. Henry Gwynne deposed of having bought the mare out of the Allora Pound in 1868 and sold her to the plaintiff. Judgement was made that the mare be returned to the plaintiff or her value of £7 be paid.

Jeremy's View

How to play chess

I really enjoy playing chess, and Mum and I play almost every day. I've provided a quick summary of the different pieces and what they can do. Pawn - The Pawn is the weakest piece in chess when it is a Pawn's first turn it can move two spaces (but on any

other turn it can only move one space). It can only move forward (not capture forward) and it can only capture diagonally. If a Pawn gets to the other end of the board you can trade it for another piece (like a Queen).

Rook - A Rook is the second best piece on the chess board. It can move forward backwards and across.


Knight - The Knight can move in a L shape (three forwards 1 across) Bishop - The Bishop moves diagonally.

Queen - The Queen is the strongest piece on the board it can move diagonally, forwards, backwards and across.

King - The King can move forward 1, diagonally 1, across 1, and backwards 1. If you capture the enemy King you win and if there is nothing in-between the King and the rook you can swap positions. Mum isn't very good at chess and I always win. I like playing chess with Dad because he is a really good player. I also have a book about chess with all the moves and I like to watch chess videos on YouTube.
