Upgrades To The Eight Mile Intersection

The Australian and Queensland governments have unlocked funding to the tune of \$25 million for the Cunningham Highway – Eight Mile Intersection Upgrade, which will go towards improving safety at this dangerous junction.

Deputy Prime Minister
Michael McCormack
said the funding
would deliver a gradeseparated interchange
at the intersection of the
Cunningham and New
England highways, south of
Allora.

"Supporting an estimated 50 jobs over the life of the project, this upgrade will reduce the risk of crashes while allowing passenger and freight traffic alike to navigate the area more quickly and efficiently,

saving time and freight operating costs," the Deputy Prime Minister said.

"This is a critical upgrade for the region, with longstanding calls locally to fix what is known as the Eight Mile Intersection.

Queensland Minister for Transport and Main Roads Mark Bailey said.

"The project will include a 66-metre-long bridge for traffic travelling from Toowoomba to Warwick, driving safety and improving capacity along this critical route for the region."

Construction on the Cunningham Highway – Eight Mile Intersection Upgrade is expected to begin in early 2021 and be completed by mid-2022, weather and construction conditions permitting.

Sports Club Steps Up To The Plate

After working for some years unsuccessfully seeking grants or other methods of raising funds to enable a bridge to be built over Dalrymple Creek on its golf course, Allora Sports Club bit the bullet and decided to finance the structure itself.

As Club secretary John Ellwood explained, what was seen as "a bridge too far", has become a reality.

On Saturday afternoon around 100 people turned up to celebrate the official opening of The "Maher - Rickert" Bridge".

With so many in attendance, a sizeable number had to sit outside the clubhouse during the speeches.

Mr Ellwood said it was a significant day in the sporting history of Allora.

He welcomed relatives of the two people honoured by the bridge name and acknowledged the large number of people and organisations who had

combined to sustain the club and make the bridge a reality.

Southern Downs Regional Councillor Marco Gliori congratulated the club and read a poem which he had written for the occasion.

One of Allora's famous sons, Tom McVeigh, also spoke, reflecting on the history of the Maher and Rickert families before giving recognition to the "Women of the West" and what he termed "Men of the West", and highlighted the work of such people in the Allora district who helped make Australia great.

Other speakers included Sports Museum stalwart Perry Cronin, well-known local Michael Maher and Greg Patterson, representing the Rickert family.

After the speeches, most of those present moved to the bridge for the ribbon-cutting.

The "Maher - Rickert" Bridge

The bridge across the Dalrymple Creek on the Allora golf course is dedicated to two of Allora's early golfing champions.

Thomas Francis Maher (26/8/1923 - 11/2/2012) and Rita Joyce Rickert (27/5/1919 - 16/9/1982)

Both Tommy and Rita started playing golf in 1934 at the Sunshine Golf Club at Hendon which was established on 15 October 1932. Tommy's father Tom senior and Rita's parents George and Eva were foundation members of the Sunshine Golf Club.

The original Allora Golf Club was established, on 25 June 1927, closing in March 1937. The Sunshine Golf Club then became the Allora Golf Club, although it continued to be known fondly as the "Sunshine Links" until it closed in the late 1940's. The Allora Golf

Club re-formed on this site in 1995.

Tommy Maher won the junior championship in his first year of golf at the age of 10. On 15 August 1939, as a 15-year-old and playing off a handicap of 9, he entered the Queensland Country Championships at Royal Queensland Golf Club, the voungest player to contest the title. A record number of 50 golfers entered the 36 hole event and Tommy finished thirteenth. Tommy won his first club championship in 1938 and went on to win many local and dictrict golf championships.

Rita Rickert won her first club championship in 1938 at the age of 19, winning it again in three of the next four vears. Rita also won many local and district golf championships and would later become a champion lawn bowler.



SDRC REGULATIONS - DRIVEWAYS, GRIDS and GATES

Constructing a driveway or vehicular crossing in urban, rural and commercial areas, is associated with building works and must be approved by Council.

Wednesday, 25th November 2020

Vehicular crossings associated with building works must be designed and constructed to ensure:

A safe and accessible footpath environment

 Safe and unobstructed vehicular access to the property

· No impact on Council's

- stormwater drainage system

 No damage to vehicle or road infrastructure
- Minimal loss of on-street parking spaces, and
- Continued amenity of the neighbourhood

If you need to install a grid or a gate on a road reserve, you will need to apply for approval.

Once a gate or grid is in place, their maintenance is the responsibility of the the person who has approval for the gate or grid.

Council has records of all licensed gates and grids on Council roads.

The installation or removal of gates or grids has to be undertaken by a private contractor, Council does not undertake this work.

After removal of a gate or grid the property owner retains ownership of the gate or grid.

Southern Downs Regional Council can supply all the information you will need before commencing work.
