Southern Downs Regional Council has announced its intention to make sure Council representatives are more evenly spread across the region.

Southern Downs mayor Vic Pennisi said Council is discussing the idea of loosely assigning Councillors to specific community groups and towns.

"Instead of having eight Councillors go to one function, it would be better to have one Councillor at eight functions." Mr Pennisi said.



Allora Police report - to 30/11/2020

It's been a pretty busy month for Allora Police. · As a result of a number occurrences within Allora township during

of

the week, on Saturday 28th November 2020, a 29yr old Allora man was arrested and charged by local Police with a number of offences including Breaching a Domestic Violence Protection notice, Breaching a Police Banning notice, Public Nuisance, Making threats via a telecommunications service and Obstructing Police. The charges arise from a series of incidents at the man's familial home and a local hotel from which the man was banned from attending. He has been further served with traffic infringement notices for driving his car while it was unregistered and uninsured. Due the nature of the incidents, the man has been bailed not to return to Allora township until the finalisation of his matters. He is to appear in the Warwick Magistrates Court on the 4th January 2021.

· On Tuesday night 24th November, a 66yr old Warwick man was lucky to avoid serious injury when his utility crossed doublewhite lines on the northern approach of the highway to Allora. Driving south just on dusk, the man's vehicle veered across the

continuous centre-lines and into the path of a laden, north-bound semitrailer; the front of the ute just striking and glancing off the rear tyres of the truck's trailer. While the crash caused only minor damage to the truck trailer and moderate damage to the utility, it left the truckdriver extremely shaken as he considered the possibilities of what could have happened. The Warwick man has been issued traffic infringement notice for the offence of Crossing a doublecontinuous line. Fine of \$240 and 3 points off his licence.

 Two visitors to the local area over the weekend have been issued fines of \$266 each, when found swimming after hours in the closed Allora pool, shortly before 4am on Sunday morning 29th November. It seems the pair - a 24yr old Logan man and his 22yr old brother - had attended town for a local party and had made a good night of it. Upon drinking early into the morning, the pair felt the need to cool down and so, had jumped the pool fence. Unfortunately they had not taken into account the proximity of the local pool to the Police Station and associated Police residences. They have been issued infringement notices for Unlawfully





trespassing in a business yard.

· Earlier in the month, on Friday 6th November 2020 a road contractor working on the Dalrymple Creek Road bridge at Talgai, reported four rims and their tyres taken from roadside, portable traffic-light trailers set-up on location. One of the trailers had then been tipped onto its side causing minor damage. Police inquiries into this matter are continuing, with the offence being linked to a very similar occurrence and theft from a Leslie Dam access road

site. If anyone has any information in relation to these matters, they are asked to contact local Police, Crimestoppers or Policelink. While costly overall, the damage to road traffic signs can also have an obvious and immediate impact on road safety, if drivers are not able to be forewarned of the conditions of the road ahead of them.





Warwick Saleyards Survey closing date extended

The community now has more time to comment on the future of the iconic Warwick Saleyards.

Southern Downs Mayor Vic Pennisi said that there was a very strong sentiment in the community about the future direction of the saleyards and Council was committed to garnering as much feedback as possible to assist its decision making.

"In reviewing the future of the saleyards, we will consider the facility's viability and sustainability, animal welfare, environmental issues, industry standards, biosecurity, traffic management, information technology and workplace health and safety," Mayor Pennisi said.

SDRC will be guided by recommendations from the Warwick Saleyards Master Plan, the Saleyards Business Case and the Saleyards Advisory Committee, as well





as community and industry consultation. Council has extended the closing date of the

Warwick Saleyards Survey until the end of the year and interested parties and industry representatives can have their say by Thursday 31 December 2020. The survey can be

completed on line at www. sdrc.qld.gov.au and www. surveymonkey.com/r/ SXMH8WD. Hard copies of the survey are also available at Council Administration Buildings and the saleyards. Currently the options on

the table for the saleyards going forward are: · Renovate the existing




