
Message from THE SDRC MAYOR

Foundation Farm To Be Launched Near Allora

Toowoomba-based seed research and production organisation Pacific Seeds is ready to launch its new farming innovation hub Foundation Farm on the outskirts of Allora.

An official, invitation only launch will take place on 12th February, ahead of a series of Summer Field Davs starting a few davs later.

The farm is located about three kilometres south of Allora on the Warwick-Allora back road.

It is designed to facilitate the testing and proving of new technologies, methods and systems prior to their implementation on farms.

Pacific Seeds says through Foundation Farm, it will work with like-minded organisations, researchers and growers to drive efficiency, sustainability and ultimately profit for Australia's agricultural industry.

Soon after the launch. the company will begin a series of Summer Field Davs which will be open to the public, although preevent registration will be necessary.

February 16th to 19th

The afternoon sessions will be across the first three days, with morning sessions for the four days.


Lunch and drinks will be provided after each of the morning sessions.

Accepting the Award on behalf of the Society and the residents of Allora and District, John Cowley said the event had been a true community effort.



Latest rates notice explained

In supporting the community through COVID-19 at an estimated cost of more than \$1.4 million, Southern Downs Regional Council made a number of significant changes to how rates and charges were issued in 2020/2021 to provide additional financial respite to ratepayers.

With the issue of the half yearly rate notices currently underway, the Council has confirmed that the extended 60 day discount period is again being offered with a 7.5 per cent discount applying to all rates and charges paid by the due date.

While at its Ordinary Meeting last week, Council voted to resume charging interest on outstanding rates and charges, Southern Downs Mayor Vic Pennisi said that the introduction of two six-monthly notices in 2020/21 provided a financially accommodating system to ratepayers during uncertain times.

"Recognising the impacts of recent challenges due to ongoing drought, bushfire recovery and COVID-19 uncertainty, Council reviewed and overhauled the way rates and charges were issued across the region this financial year," Mayor Pennisi said.

"Council moved from a single annual rate notice to a more financially accommodating system of two six-monthly notices and froze rates for the first half of this year with the 1.9 per cent COVID-19 concession.

"The tough decision was made in December by Council to remove the temporary COVID-19 relief concession in recognition that we still have the job of delivering essential

services and infrastructure for the benefit of the community.

"Council is tasked with providing services such as water, waste, pools and libraries, while also maintaining our footpaths, parks and gardens.

"This Council has a very real understanding on investing in our aging infrastructure.

"Providing for the community and meeting expectations is not easy and not cheap.

"The funds received from ratepayers are directed and invested directly back into our community and its needs and we will continue to prioritise between needs and wants so that we can get the balance right," Cr Pennisi said.

Ratepayers who are having difficulty paying their rates and charges are being encouraged to contact the Council to arrange a confidential payment agreement to pay off their rates in smaller more manageable amounts.

Southern Downs ratepayers also have the option to receive their rate notices electronically.


The Stanthorpe Show

and the remainder of the Warwick Salevards Master Plan including financial statements as part of a future report to Council. This report is expected to be considered at the Ordinary Meeting on 24 February 2021.

In 2019/20. Council received a request to release the Master Plan document but considered that certain aspects of the document were 'commercial in confidence' including some financial details. However after a comprehensive consultation process with the office of the Information Commissioner, only the first 29 pages of the Master Plan were released to the community in September








IN MEMORY OF KOOKIE



Leader of the LNP David Crisafulli is also expected to make an appearance during the weekend.




