A quick review and tidy up of meter locations will ensure Council's staff can quickly and efficiently read meters with no disruption to the property's occupants.

Water meters are placed on individual property boundaries and Council advises that meters should be free from debris, grass, garden mulch, soil and other obstacles.

Residents and tenants should also ensure that stop taps are easily located so that water can be turned off

quickly if a leak is detected to minimise water wastage, property damage and prevent an excessive water consumption notice.

A Council spokesperson also suggests that residents regularly monitor household water usage by reading their meters at a similar time each week to track how much water they are using and to identify opportunities for water savings if needed.

Water Consumption Notices will be sent out in April 2021 with the due date being 30 days after the issue date.

Anyone experiencing issues with payments should contact Council to arrange a confidential payment agreement.

Council thanks the community in advance for its co-operation in keeping meters clear and accessible.

## Dog attacks take their toll on meter readers

Two Queensland meter readers are recovering from serious injuries after being attacked by dogs on the loose.

"Dog owners need to take responsibility for their pets for the safety of everyone walking in their neighbourhood, including meter readers doing their rounds". Ergon Energy's General Manager Customer & Market Operations, Cloe Kernick said

"Dog attacks are traumatic and can have lasting effects on the physical and mental health of the victims and their families – some people are literally scarred for life.

"Every day, meter readers go door-to-door on foot as part of their job, so the risk is always front of mind for them and we hope that dog owners understand the part they play in keeping our people safe."

In January 2019, Ergon Energy introduced a safe entry policy that prevents crews and meter readers from entering yards where there is a record of dogs on site.

"While we've seen a vast improvement in the last two years, meter readers are still being bitten by dogs and we need the community's help to stop these horrific incidents.

"We've introduced a free SMS notification service for dog owners, who can register online to receive a text the day before their scheduled meter read." Ms Kernick said.

## **Allora Historical Society 50th Anniversary**

The people of Allora have a history of embracing a celebration — Royal events, royal visits, end of wars, anniversary of milestones.

While organising the celebrations for the centenary of Allora being proclaimed a municipality, it was suggested that the history of Allora be showcased with a display of memorabilia. People from throughout the district offered items for display.

The 100 year celebration included the opening of Apollo Way. After the bridge opening, a procession moved across the bridge to the showgrounds. The display was set up in the show pavilion (which has now been replaced). After the event many people offered their items for permanent display.

The Allora and District Historical Society was formed. First President — Roy Neale, first secretary — Antonia (Ding) Atkinson, first treasurer — Olive Shooter. (Ding Atkinson resigned after a couple of months and Roy Neale took over the secretary's job. Ray Shooter was acting President for the rest of the term)

The museum was set

up in the School of Arts building at 27 Drayton Street, Allora.

It was a private library run by the School of Arts committee which wound up in the early 1960's. The Allora Boy Scout group took a 10 year lease on the building. When the Boy Scouts folded the Historical Society took over the lease

The building had been formerly the Court House and situated in Raff Street.

The building was shifted to the Drayton Street site. The old court house was bought for £14 by the School of Arts committee and moved to the Drayton Street site. The quarter acre of land had been previously bought from Mrs. Emily Buxton, daughter of Mr. & Mrs. J. H. Gwynne who had the first Post Office on the adjoining block.

The original court house was built in Raff Street on the site of the present

police station in 1868. It was moved to Drayton Street for use as the School of Arts in 1884.

To celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the Allora Historical Society an invitation is extended to all past and present members of ADHS to enjoy morning tea at 27 Drayton Street on Saturday 20th March. RSVP by 13th March to Wendy adhssec@gmail.com or phone 0488 673 778.

## Food regulators abandon fruit and vegetable growers

And, the Agriculture Minister is NOT happy!



Hon. David Littleproud MP

David Littleproud says a decision by food regulators to give 100 percent pure Aussie fruit and vegetable juice a lower health star rating than diet cola is just madness.

"The Australia and New Zealand Ministerial Forum on Food Regulation failed the leadership test by retaining a nonsensical health star rating system," Minister Littleproud said.

"States and territories who supported this including Queensland, Northern Territory, ACT and Victoria have let down our farmers, consumers, and Australia's \$800 million juice industry.

"This will mean 100 per cent pure orange juice will have a health star rating lower than that of a diet soft drink.

"They have made a mockery of the rating system and have ignored Australian Government and industry concerns. It would appear as though the states that voted for this are beholden to their bureaucrats.

"How can anyone believe that the health star rating for drinks with no nutritional value should be higher than 100 per cent fruit and vegetable juices?

"This is madness and disrespects our country's vegetable and citrus growers and their communities.

"Reducing health star ratings for fruit and vegetable juices will impact demand for these products and flow-on to the bottom line for many farmers."



## Glovebox Guide to support feral cat management

A new guide has been developed to help agricultural and environmental land managers address the growing threat posed by feral cats.

Wednesday, 24th February 2021

Every day, feral cats take on average a staggering 3.1 million mammals, 1.1 million birds and 1.8 million reptiles.

Recent research from the Australian Government's National Environmental Science Program found that the pest also transmits diseases to other animals including livestock, costing the agricultural industry up to \$12 million each year.

The free guide provides information about the impacts of feral cats and lays out tools for land managers to plan their control actions in accordance with their state or territory

The guide supports the efforts of private landholders, leaseholders and volunteers manage invasive species on their lands to achieve positive outcomes for biodiversity conservation and

legislation.

Since 2014, more than \$32 million in Australian Government funding has been mobilised for projects that have a primary focus on supporting practical, onground action and action-based research to reduce the impacts of feral cats.

The guide is the latest in the series of Pest Management Glovebox Guides which includes the management of species such as feral pigs, foxes and rabbits.

## **Hostile Approach Needed To Reduce Mouse Populations**

Australian grain growers are urged to create hostile environments for mice by reducing residual food supplies and thereby optimising the effectiveness of baiting programs.

Limiting competition for bait by eliminating alternative food sources is the pivotal mouse management strategy available to growers.

Creating 'mouse unfriendly' paddocks was a key piece of advice delivered to growers and advisers during the recent Grains Research and Development Corporation's (GRDC) specially convened online mouse forum.

The Grains Research Update was recorded and is available for viewing and downloading via the GRDC website at http://bit. ly/2ZmOrln.

GRDC-supported lead mouse researcher Steve Henry from CSIRO, Australia's national science agency, stressed the importance of increasing the odds of mice encountering a lethal dose of zinc phosphide bait." If mice are hungry, they are more likely to eat a lethal dose. If conditions are favourable – mice need food, shelter and moisture to thrive –

the rate of population increase is dramatic." Mr Henry said.

Mice start breeding when they are six weeks old, and litters of six to 10 pups are born every 19 to 21 days.

Mr Henry encouraged growers to control volunteer cereals, remove grain on the ground around storage infrastructure and where possible use sheep to clean up residual grain from the 2020 harvest. Limiting grain losses during harvesting of summer and winter crops is also imperative.

Mr Henry said baiting six weeks out from sowing was advisable if mouse numbers were currently high. This allowed mice to overcome any sub-lethal ingestion and bait aversion before baiting at sowing time.

"If you still have mice at sowing, put the bait out of the back of the seeder. You will get the primary bang for your buck baiting at sowing, especially if the bait goes on freshly disturbed soil after the last presswheel."

Mr Henry said close monitoring after each bait application was critical, and it was important that growers actively and thoroughly monitored their paddocks for mice.
