Thanks go to our local gardeners and to the Council for keeping our town looking its best.

Out of interest, Southern Downs Regional Council currently maintains about 160 parks and reserves across the region, with many parks fitted with state of the art, Australian standards compliant equipment for better and safer playgrounds. These play stations have child friendly designs that appeal to all ages with some also offering disability friendly equipment.

Dead and Dangerous Trees To Be Removed

A number of dead, dying or dangerous trees across the Southern Downs will be removed in the coming weeks to improve road safety. The Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) has identified various trees around the region that need to be removed or pruned to increase safety for road users. Trees earmarked for removal could be dead, dying, structurally unsound, or may overhang the road and risk dropping limbs that can endanger road users. The safety assessment also identified some large trees that pose a hazard to road users because of their location beside main road with high speed environments. An environmental report recommended removal of the trees but stipulated the use of a qualified wildlife spotter and wildlife rehabilitator prior to removal at select locations. Where

Motorists are asked to be aware of single lane closures during the removal process, which will be scheduled to avoid peak traffic times wherever possible. Southern Downs Regional Council and RoadTek Warwick will progressively work around the region, starting in the coming weeks and aiming to finish before the end June




