The Allora and District Historical Museum celebrated its 50th Anniversary at the weekend.

President Jim Anderson welcomed the crowd of over twenty members, exmembers and guests.

Southern Downs Regional Council was represented by the Mayor Vic Pennisi and Councillors Sheryl Windle and Marco Gliori. All spoke and congratulated the ADHS and emphasised the important role of the Historical Society. Marco was in fine form, entertaining the crowd by reciting two poems.

In attendance were formation members Lola Crookey, Trevor Neale and Ray and Olive Shooter. Then the Shooters had the honour of cutting the 50th

Celebration cake that was made and decorated by Kaye Mullins.

Trevor's uncle Roy Neale made a very large contribution in collecting stories and information.

When the 100 year celebration (1969) was being organised, it was suggested that the history of the area be highlighted by a display. Many people contributed and a display was set up in the original show pavilion. These items were then offered for permanent display.

A committee was formed in August 1969 and on 20th March 1971 the museum was opened in the former magistrates building which had been used first as a School of Arts then the Scout Hall.

Men charged after hotel brawl

Two Allora men were ticketed for public nuisance offences for their roles as the main instigators in a fight occuring outside a Herbert Street hotel on Monday night. March 8.

The incident occurred shortly after 9pm in the town's main street.

While the tickets carry an \$800 fine, the pair have also been banned by police from entering or remaining in any licensed premise within Allora for the next 3 months.

Allora Police senior sergeant Damian Grace said this sort of behaviour will not be tolerated and the appropriate steps will be taken to ensure the safety and good order of all people in and around licensed premises and the town centre.

OPERATION SLIMJIM

On Wednesday, March 17, Allora and Clifton officers assisted Warwick Detectives and officers of the Brisbane Dog Squad in the finalisation of Drug Operation Slimjim.

This final phase of the local operation included the execution of a number of search warrants over two days on a number of

residences and properties within the Warwick Police Patrol Group including properties from Allora and Warwick to Killarney.

In all, 20 persons were arrested on a total of 61 drug and firearm related offences including supply and possession of drugs, failure to secure firearms, break and enter, possession of tainted property and obstructing police.

Most are to appear in the Warwick Magistrates Court on April 19.

Allora Police would like to thank anyone who has, or continues to give, information regarding drug or other suspicious activity across the local area.

Cowboys Claim Barrett Shield Five Tries To Three

The Warwick Cowbovs received a significant injection of confidence with the Toowoomba Rugby League approaching as a result of their clean sweep of the four matches on the Barrett Family Shield program on Saturday at Father Ranger Oval.

It also highlighted an obvious form reversal compared to seven days back at Platz Oval when Wattles took the kudos for two out of three games including top grade in pre-season trials.

Supporters shouldn't form conclusions though; the Warriors line-up was short on regulars that will emerge for the season proper.

The feature game was played with the usual local derby ferocity, but when full time sounded the Cowboys had racked up their 17th shield success in the 29 years since the opening match of the pre-season tradition back in 1993 with a tightly fought 34 - 22 result. Both teams had their moments but it was the consistency and team work of the Warwick outfit that saw the Shield remain in the Cowboys clubhouse.

Warwick hooker Ben Sullivan was in his usual exceptional form and was named the best and fairest player and so presented with the Terry Doyle Memorial Medallion while Matt Duggan was dominant in the halves for Wattles. It was the third time Sullivan had won the prestigious medallion since the award's inception in 2011.

Wattles have struggled to loosen the Cowboys grip on the Barrett Family Shield over the last six encounters since 2015, with the silverware only making it into the Warriors trophy cabinet in 2019.

Allora landholder Bill Burge's regenerative farming



Southern Queensland Landscapes (SQL) Project Officers recently visited Burge Pastoral Farming outside Allora.

Passionate about regenerative farming, Bill and the team chatted all-things compost, including how SQL may be able to provide support.

Bill's regenerative farming highlights the 'closing of the loop' for nutrient cycling on-farm. Crops are regeneratively grown with minimal industrial inputs producing feed for livestock as forage or grain, the byproducts being fodder and manure which are added to a compost heap for curing

before being returned to the paddock.

Composting keeps biomass containing valuable carbon on-farm while improving soil carbon sequestration capacity. When compost is added to the soil, it supplies important nutrients, provides food for soil microbes, and creates healthier soils and produce.

The death of Mr Henry de Burgh Anderson, metropolitan inspector of the A.B.C. Bank, occurred at his home in Strathfield, Sydney. The late Mr Anderson joined the original A.J.S. Bank in Brisbane in 1880 and had had continuous service with the bank for 40 years. From 1889 to 1898 he served as the manager of the bank's Allora branch. He married Susan Kelly, daughter of John and Susan Kelly, in Allora in 1890 and their first child, Eric, was buried in the Allora cemetery in 1893. While in Allora Mr Anderson immersed himself in local organizations, being treasurer of the C.D.A. &


