Blaze started in hot motor

The major fire which destroyed a large part of the Allora Grain and Milling complex at Ellinthorpe probably had its origins a day earlier when a hot motor on a mixer started a small blaze

QFES Area Commander at Warwick. Hemmo de Vries said the fire appeared to be out when staff left on the Tuesday night, everything was good, with no sign of fire anywhere, but when they arrived at around 7am the next day smoke was coming from the roof.

"It's a fairly old building with a timber floor - if you had a hotspot with a bit of

grain nearby it might have been smouldering for hours and then all of a sudden it starts the fire," he said.

"We had to remove all the steel above the hotspots so we could cool the area. otherwise it would have been burning for a week.

"We also couldn't have done what we did without the support of the farmers who were trucking tanks of water to the site - we can't thank them enough for their efforts." Mr de Vries said.

Multiple fire units were sent to the scene soon after 7am on the Wednesday with the blaze extinguished about lunch time Thursday.

Water restrictions relaxed

With the region's dams at full urban supply capacity following last week's rain, Southern torrential Downs Regional Council voted unanimously at a Special Meeting on Tuesday in favour of relaxing current water restrictions and moving to Permanent Water Saving Rules with a residential water use target of 200 litres per person per day, effective immediately.

Under the new draft Drought Management Plan, which will be available for public comment in the coming months, residents will be permitted to use water from the reticulated network on their gardens under restricted guidelines and will be encouraged to continue practicing water wise behaviour.

Southern Downs Mayor Vic Pennisi said that the drought had taken a significant toll on the region, but was happy to see current

water restrictions eased for a resilient community who had continually risen to the challenges of Mother Nature.

"Our region is emerging from one of the most devastating and fatiguing droughts in our history, and on the back of bushfire and a global pandemic, the toll on our residents. businesses and producers has been immense." Mayor Pennisi said.

"Today we might have water, but as a drought prone region, we are always one day closer to our next drought and we need to continue to be sensible and responsible in our approach to water usage.

"Our goal as a region should be to use our water supply wisely and make efficient use of every drop so that we maintain a lifestyle that doesn't involve more water restrictions for as long as possible.

Sadly their son Robert Woodhouse Gordon died on the voyage. They left their 5 year old son in Ireland. Andrew came to Australia a few years later.



It might be rising damp. Or your exhaust fans could be dumping moisture into your ceiling cavity and it is 'raining' inside the roof space.

Caution needed on flood-damaged roads

These potholes can be deep and have the potential to cause damage to vehicles if motorists are not driving to the conditions.

TMR repair crews can only make temporary road repairs while it is raining or the road is wet.

Full repairs can only be completed when the rain subsides and the road dries

It is up to drivers to take care on the roads, drive slowly and consider what might lie under wet areas and puddles.

All drivers must drive to the conditions and heed the message of 'if it's flooded, forget it'.

Road users are also being encouraged to get in contact with council when discovering new potholes that has been caused by the weather event.






