To everyone out there please don't be afraid of what has happened but bear in mind - P.D.S. it is my quote!



• \$1.4 million to help Southern Downs Regional Council to move a range of industries from using precious urban water supplies to groundwater, including local processing and industrial businesses • \$4.54 million to increase Leslie Dam's usable water capacity by upgrading its pumps and water treatment systems, increasing usable storage capacity by an additional 1700 megalitres • \$700,000 to support Southern Downs Regional Council investigations into local groundwater supplies for Warwick, Allora and Stanthorpe, and to support

Premier Annastacia Palaszczuk said while recent rain had provided much needed relief to the Southern Downs region including good inflows into

Leslie, Connolly and Storm King Dams, it hasn't been enough to solve long-term water security issues. "In late 2019, in response

to low supplies in the region's dams. mv Government committed to plan for a new pipeline from Toowoomba to Warwick," the Premier said.

"This commitment was in addition to \$15 million in emergency assistance provided to cart water into Stanthorpe.

"It's great news that water carting is no longer needed with Storm King Dam now at 100 per cent capacity but our commitment to provide water security to the wider Southern Downs region still stands.

"That's why today I'm announcing the next step in providing water security for the region with a \$20 million Southern Downs Drought Resilience Package.'

Water Minister Glenn Butcher said the immediate measures could deliver an additional 13 months of water supply for the Southern Downs communities and industries.

James Lister Speaks Out

The following comment has been issued by Member for Southern Downs James Lister in relation to the Prime Minister's announcement Monday on a Royal Commission into veterans' suicide:

"As a veteran myself. I welcome reports that the federal government will be instigating a Royal Commission into veterans' suicides, but I want to see more details on the identity of commissioners, commission powers, and terms of reference before I make my final assessment.

"Speaking as an individual veteran and MP rather than as a member of a political party, I want to see broad terms of reference, the ability to summons and compel witnesses to testify, and mechanisms which will enable an uninhibited search for truth, leading to a reduction in veterans' suicides. I don't want to see a witch hunt - but I do want instances and patterns of failure to be identified, leading to meaningful recommendations which will save and enhance veterans' lives in future.

"There are four things that I want to see in particular:

1) The terms of reference must not be limited in any way which may inhibit the full and free investigation of any matter at any time which could in any way be relevant to veterans' suicides;

2) there should be no



limitations whatsoever as to who may be called as a witness, and the commission must have the authority to compel witness to appear and to cooperate. Any obstruction of or failure to fully and faithfully assist the commission should constitute a contempt punishable by imprisonment;

3) there must be no grounds (including security and self-incrimination) upon which witnesses may be excused from answering questions, although incamera hearings and assurances that testimony given under compulsion cannot be used against witnesses in subsequent prosecutions should of course be available where necessary: and

4) a presumption in favour of granting leave to counsel for any interested group or individual to appear before, examine, and cross examine commission witnesses should apply.

"I believe that with these four requirements satisfied, we may be assured that maximum benefit for veterans and their families will result from the commission.

Crash Under Investigation

While forensic police are continuing their probe into last week's fatal crash on the New England Highway at Allora, speed was a factor. The Officer in Charge

at Allora Police, Sergeant Damian Grace. who attended the scene on Sunday night, 11th April, said speed is definitely a factor in causing the final impact.

The vehicle, driven by 21-years-old Toowoomba man Thomas Coyne, left the highway, rolled and struck a power pole, causing the pole to snap.

"What is under investigation particularly is what led to that crash factors under consideration potentially fatigue being

or inattention combined with driver inexperience," Sergeant Grace said. "The deceased was a

'P-plater' who had held his licence under six months.' he said. "In this instance the

driver was wearing his seatbelt, but the level of damage upon impact was too great. "The vehicle was also an

older model with no airbags, but even they may not have been of any great benefit." Sergeant Grace said

while a crash such as this is most likely avoidable, drivers are directed to be mindful of the Fatal 5 - Drink/Drug driving, Speed, Fatigue, Driver Seatbelts and Inattention/Distraction.



Looking Back...

Charlie Bishop

The Allora Sports Club has plans to name each of the holes on the golf course. The idea has been put forward to name the 7th hole after Charlie Bishop. The hole is adjacent to the small island in the creek that Geoff Slatter named "Bishop Island" because Charlie often fished there.

Charlie was one of Allora's real characters Charles Gustave Phillip Bishop is supposed to have been born "near Toowoomba" on the 4th January 1899, although there is no record of his birth in Queensland or the marriage of his parents Charles Bishop and Lillian Hutchins. Charles Bishop senior was a sanitary contractor for the Allora Council.

Both parents gave permission for Charlie to join the A.I.F. on the 13/8/1917 at the age of 18 vears and 9 months. He served with the 15th Battalion in France from April 1918 until the Armistice. He sustained an accidental fractured skull and cerebral concussion in France after the war was over. Charlie was returned to Australia in 1919 but went AWOL in Cape Town on the journey home. He spent a short time in the lock-up before being put on the next ship home. His mother died and was buried in Allora in 1926 but her obituary does not mention Charlie's father.

Charlie lived with Sis Serjeant in a ramshackle

hut in Forde Street on the present site of "The Homestead". It had formerly been Mrs Frederick Weber's cottage. Tom McVeigh tells the story of visiting Charlie and Sis in a "Planned Giving" campaign for the Catholic Church. Tom mentioned Sis as Charlie's wife but Charlie laughed and said "we're not married just shacked up together." There are many amusing stories told of Charlie Bishop. The best is of when he worked as offsider to Gus Kaiser on the night cart. One morning the lavatory cart overturned on the way to the sanitary depot at Müller's Corner, a right angled bend, before the corner was cut off Jack McDonnell's paddock (now Ross Neale's). Charlie was seen searching amongst the upturned truck. Gus asked him what he was looking for.
