

nity Auction Postponed

The Allora Show Society has taken a significant step in postponing their famous annual auction until the October long weekend.

Formerly the Allora Apex Auction, it has been a landmark event with its own special character since its inception over two decades back.

The now defunct Allora Apex Club introduced the auction to the Allora and Southern Downs event schedule before it was passed on to the Allora Show Society.

New Allora Show Society President Glyn Rees, who was appointed after the recent resignation of former organization President, said "the Allora Annual Auction is among a number of events dear to the hearts of the Allora and Southern Downs community, also including the Allora Annual Show, the Allora Campdraft and the Allora Heritage Weekend '

The decision by the Show Society Management committee certainly wasn't taken lightly according to Mr Rees. "At a time where there appears to be a number of influencing factors, it was considered the best action to take."

The Auction enjoyed the three-day Queen's Birthday long weekend for many years, and while it's not all that necessary, the three-day long weekend in October will be advantageous to organization and enhancing the event.

Mr Rees said "while some sectors of the local community disagreed with the postponement,

there were many that felt it was "wise" or "good" decision."

"It's our responsibility to ensure the safety of our volunteers and the general public on the Showgrounds and currently there is major construction of a near 2.800 m2 under cover area that won't be completed before the Auction date "

A move to October will see the under-cover area completed and the grounds recovered serving to enhance the Showgrounds facility for the Auction

A postponement will also allay concerns about the availability of volunteers needed to run an event the size of the Auction.

A recent Show Society auction workshop saw plenty of enthusiasm for the event which was to take place in just under four weeks, but concern remained about volunteers on the ground in the lead up to and at the event.

"The enthusiasm is more than commendable, but there are other factors that were considered and had to be considered at length."

Mr Rees said the Showgrounds had an enviable record hosting events of all sizes over many years and the postponement decision will ensure that standard is maintained

In recent weeks the Allora Showgrounds along with Show Society and community group volunteers have hosted the Working Kelpie Council National Kelpie Field trials and this past weekend the Queensland Fire and Emergency Service charity bike ride - Bike 4 Burns, a charity bike ride that raises funds for the

New Speed limit at level crossing on Warwick-Allora Road

The speed limit at the level crossing on Warwick-Allora Road between the Splityard Creek Bridge and the Evans Road intersection will change this month in response to community concerns

The speed limit will reduce from 100km/h to 80km/h at the level crossing.

Southern Queensland Regional Director Kym Murphy said a speed limit review had been completed and determined a change was necessary.

In addition to the speed limit reduction on Warwick-Allora Road, new railway signals will be installed on Evans and Hutley roads.

"We've listened to the community and the Speed Management Committee has undertaken a speed limit review at the level crossing.

"The review process considers a range of factors such as road function, roadside environment, road construction standards prevailing traffic speeds and crash history." Ms Murphy

The committee includes representatives from the Queensland Police Service, Southern Downs Regional Council and the Department of Transport and Main Roads.

Motorists are urged to observe the new speed limit signs and to be vigilant around level crossings.

Volunteering Queensland report that 3 million people - over 75% of the population volunteered 900 million hours in 2020 - that's an average 5.7 hours every week to help others. The volunteer workforce is three times the size of the Queensland Government and nearly as big as the private sector. The cost to replace the labour of this workforce in 2020 would have been approximately \$37.1 billion.

However there are still many challenges facing the volunteering sector. 38% of volunteer-involving organisations saw a decrease in their volunteer numbers, with time and health reasons being the main barriers to people being able to volunteer.










Get the good oil on sunflowers at GRDC workshop

Sunflower growers, agronomists and farm advisers will have an opportunity to hear from some of Australia's leading crop management specialists at a workshop to be held at Pittsworth next month.

Presented by the Grains Research and Development Corporation (GRDC) and the Australian Sunflower Association (ASA) the workshop will offer the latest information on plant growth and development, agronomy, pests, weeds and disease, harvest, storage and marketing.

Relations GRDC Grower Manager - North. Richard Holzknecht, said the workshop being held in Pittsworth would also include a section on the shared experiences of growers and agronomists.

Kevin Charlesworth, chair of the Australian Sunflower Association, said the sunflower industry had a positive future and attending the workshop would provide both experienced and future growers with insights into marketing profitable

has been some significant developments in sunflower marketing in recent years and how growers can access these opportunities will be one of the key presentations at the workshop," Mr Charlesworth said.

The workshop will be facilitated by Kerry McKenzie from PulseAg



A fatal accident occurred to a son of Mr and Mrs Andrew Geitz of Allora. Mr Geitz and an elder son were engaged in collecting and carting pumpkins and pie melons in one of his paddocks. Several of the small children were taking short rides in the dray between the heaps. While one of the heaps was being loaded they got down and when the dray was ready to move again, clambered up the wheel to get on the dray again. The elder brother started the dray off thinking that all was clear but the wheel carried the little boy around and passed over his head. Dr Pain was summoned and speedily arrived but the boy passed away soon afterwards.
