## **Santa Has His Own Runway In Allora**


Thank goodness Santa will be guided into Allora via his Runway in Norman Street.

## **Trafficking charges after police** seize cannabis worth \$11 million

Toowoomba detectives have charged a man trafficking with drugs dangerous after police seized cannabis with street value of nearly 11.2 million dollars earlier this month

Around 4.50pm on December 7 officers from the Toowoomba Tactical Crime Squad intercepted a utility

on the Warrego Highway, near the intersection with Postsman Ridge Road at Helidon.

It will be alleged police located a large cardboard box in the rear seat containing 20 bags of cannabis, with police also finding an additional four boxes containing 78 bags of cannabis in the rear of the

In total approximately 44 kilograms of cannabis was seized with an estimated street value of \$264 000.

The driver and sole occupant of the vehicle, a 37-year-old New South

Wales man was arrested.

Investigations by police lead them to a storage facility in Toowoomba where detectives executed a search warrant on December 8. Police allegedly located five boxes containing approximately 59 kilograms of cannabis with an estimated street value of \$354 000.

December On detectives from Toowoomba Tactical Crime Squad executed a search warrant on a Willow Springs, Clifton property with police allegedly locating 3015 cannabis plants, of varying sizes and worth an estimated 10.5 million dollars, in a wellestablished cannabis crop.

The acreage property had an extensive green house and drying shed with sophisticated lighting, irrigation and ventilation systems. These plants have since been destroyed.

The 37-year-old man has appeared in the Toowoomba Magistrates Court charged with one count each of trafficking dangerous drugs, producing dangerous drugs, supplying dangerous drugs, offence to buy or possess schedule 4 medicine, and three counts possess dangerous drugs and two counts of possess anything used in the connection of crime - Drugs Misuse Act.

He has been remanded in custody to appear in the Toowoomba Magistrates Court on February 14.





Southern Downs Regional Council advises the community that the recently refurbished Allora Reservoir is back on line. Christmas Ideas

The reservoir has been offline since 2018 and has recently undergone a \$383k upgrade as part of Council's ongoing commitment to maintain water infrastructure and provide quality water to residents and businesses.

Works included a new roof, access platform and ladder, relining of the internal walls and improved safety features. The fully-funded Council project commenced in May 2021 and was completed in September

A Council spokesperson advised that residents may experience some pressure fluctuations and/or discoloured water, however this will disappear after the water has run through the tap for a short while.

## **Official comment: Proposed Covid-19 Mandates in Queensland**

Southern Downs Regional Council acknowledges correspondence received from members of the community expressing their dissatisfaction with the Queensland Government's proposal to exclude unvaccinated people from certain venues.

Wednesday, 15th December 2021

Council appreciates the complexity of this issue and on 23 November, Mayor Vic Pennisi wrote to the Queensland Premier Annastacia Palasczuk seeking clarification on the proposed State Government COVID-19 regulations effective 17 December 2021 and asking the Premier if there was another way of dealing with this issue.

Council strongly supports the need to keep the Southern Downs community safe and will continue to act on the advice from the Chief Health Officer, however is concerned that proposed changes will cause division in a community already working hard to recover from drought, bushfires, floods and the effects of the global pandemic.

Council has no intention of imposing similar mandates to those proposed by the State Government on Council facilities unless it is required to do so by the State Government leaving Council with no choice in the matter. Council is obligated to follow any directives issued by the Chief

## **Digging Deep For Soil Management**

The final round of the Australian Government's Smart Farms Small Grants program has now been finalised, with \$13.8 million funding 32 grants and over 200 individual activities to improve soil health and soil management.

Minister for Agriculture and Members for Maranoa David Littleproud said the grants will help farmers and land managers change the way they look at their soil and improve how they manage it.

"Good soil management leads to increased agricultural productivity and profits" Minister Littleproud said.

"This funding round focuses on soil extension activities, which give farmers and land managers practical tools and information they need, including increasing uptake of soil testing and better soil data, which will allow them to make evidence-based decisions for future growing seasons.

The successful grants include activities such as

engaging soil extension officers; conducting soil management workshops, seminars, roadshows, or field days; creating communications products, webinars or online materials; and/or establishing trials, demonstrations and monitoring sites.

"Soil extension activities will improve and increase soil sampling and testing. They will help farmers get the most out of the National Soils Monitoring and Incentives Pilot Program which will be a win for the farmer and a win for soil science," Minister Littleproud said.

"Australia can lead the world in measuring soil carbon accurately and effectively and use carbon in the soil to enhance our reputation for the most sustainably produced food and fibre in the world.

"This is part of the \$214.9 million National Soil Strategy, Australia's first national policy on soil which sets out how we will manage our soil for the next 20 years and will support Aussie

farmers and the sector in reaching its Ag2030 goal to grow agriculture to \$100 billion by 2030."

Under this round, multiple activities could be applied for in the one application. Grants are for between \$100,000 to \$250,000 per set of activities and will be delivered over two years. Applicants could apply for a maximum of \$2 million per application if undertaking multiple activities.

The Smart Farms pro-

gram is a key agriculture portfolio initiative under phase two of the \$1.1 billion National Landcare Program.

More than \$54 million will be available under National Soil Monitoring and Incentives Pilot Program to encourage farmers and land managers to undertake more comprehensive soil testing in exchange for sharing their data with the program. This program will open in Q1 2022.


