# **Flying Fox Management Plan For The Region**

Last week's meeting of The Southern Downs Regional Council was told that Black, Little Red and Grey-headed Flying-Foxes are native species that are seasonal visitors to the Southern Downs.

The animals typically arrive in the Southern Downs in spring, occupying three roost sites until the onset of cooler weather in late autumn/early winter.

The known roost sites are currently on Council managed lands in Allora (Dalrymple Creek Park), Stanthorpe (Gleeson Park) and Warwick (McCahon Bridge Park / Cooks Park).

The population of Flying Foxes at each roost site varies throughout the season ranging from several hundred to 10,000 plus animals

While their presence on the Southern Downs can cause health and safety concerns for nearby residents with noise, smell mess, flying-foxes and are a protected species under Queensland Nature Conservation Act 1992 and Council is obligated to follow guidelines and codes of practice developed by the Queensland Government



when managing the animals' roosting activities.

Southern Downs Coun-Stephen Tancred cillor said the draft plan is part of Council's ongoing commitment to the practical management of flyingfoxes and encouraged the community to have a vested interest in the conversation.

"Flying-foxes play a significant role in the healthy functioning of natural ecosystems as pollinators of many of our native trees and shrubs," Councillor Tancred said.

"We have many popular and picturesque National Parks across our region, however we can't cherry-

pick where we want flyingfoxes to roost.

"We need to accept a certain level of cohabitation and balance the potentially conflicting issues of the environment, our urban residents and our fruit farmers.'

The draft Management Plan was presented to the Pest Management Advisory Committee on 27th November 2020 and has now been developed to the point where broader community input is required prior to further consideration and formal adoption by Council

The Council has decided on a 30 day consultation period to enable residents to peruse the 60-page document.

The Golden Wattle Cafe will be open during this time so pop in for a coffee and cake.


Plenty to see at the Show with a huge collection of pot plants and an opportunity to vote for your favourite pot plant in the People Choice Award.



# Matt Duggan Kicks Warriors to Victory

# Wattles Juniors Taste Success in Warwick



Wattles got home on the boot of star playmaker Matt Duggan in a colossal tussle at Platz Oval on Sunday, just a 77-minute field goal the difference to allow the Stillwater Pastoral Company Warriors a 23 - 22 victory over the Goondiwindi Boars. the reigning TRL Premiers.

Make no mistake the Boars rolled up to play and had the Warriors measure crossing for five touchdowns to the home side's four, the visitor's fullback Chris Woodbridge on fire with a classy try double.

But normally reliable halfback kicker, Trae Bennetto, struggled to find the black dot, successful with a single conversion from five attempts.

Wattles sharp shooter Duggan on the other hand was on target with three goals from four shots before sealing the win with the vital field goal that locked his side into second place on the TRL Hutchinson Builders A Grade Premiership ladder.

Tries by Boars winger Geoff Prince and captain/ coach and lock Travis Waddell had Wattles on the back foot trailing 10 – 0 after ten minutes of play.

But the Warriors levelled up through fullback Jackson Green and sideline flver Aaron Hooper, before forward pack giant Brendon McBryde slipped through the defence to allow Wattles a 16 – 10 half time advantage.

While the home team finished on the upside of the first stanza, three Goondiwindi second half touchdowns had Wattles back peddling by the later stages.

It was a Matthew Christensen try fifteen minutes from full time that put the game up for the taking.

Boars' finishers Luke Buckle and Woodbridge ran in tries to have the scoreboard locked at 22 all with 73 minutes gone on the Platz Oval clock, but the result was sealed five minutes later when Duggan broke the deadlock with a classic right foot drop goal from just under twenty metres out.

Aside from Duggan and fullback Jackson Green, back-rower Tyson Stevens' run of superb form continues.

In a courageous effort carrying injury, Wattles skipper/coach Travis Burns took the field against one of the competitions top line-ups. The mentor's determination is fuelled by a hunger for a Wattles top grade premiership, and Burns first in the senior ranks at any level.

The Warriors will aim up for their ninth straight win when they run on to Father Ranger Oval this Saturday evening in the local derby against the Warwick Cowboys.

Playmaking brothers Tom and Joe Morris rose to the occasion against the Boars and were among a number of classy performances.

The home side went to the break leading 16 - 10, but four additional tries on the scoreboard to one by former NRL star Rick McGrady in the second half saw the Warriors in the boxed seat for victory.

While co-mentor Lonergan was very happy with "a good win", he congratulated his side on weathering the storm of "a really tough first 20 minutes which could of went either way."

"Goondiwindi scored first and we really had to work hard to get back in front, it was a good challenge for

us." While the Boars had certainly pressured the premiership leaders, next weekend's challenge against Warwick may well result in the 2022 TRL Reserve Grade Minor Premiership in Wattles trophy cabinet.


