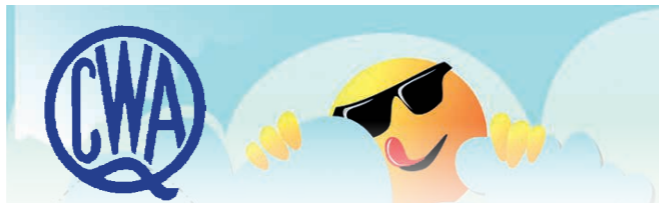

Also plenty of activities for the kids such as face painting, magic show and a crazy clown making balloon animals.

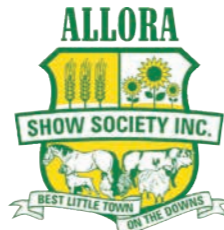


The Allora Historical Society is joining in with a huge display of antique aprons, linens, china, handicraft, photos and QCWA memorabilia.

No Power After Car Crashes Into Pole

Over 2,000 properties including Spring Creek and township of Clifton, Nobby and Greenmount were without power for hours last Wednesday after a vehicle hit a power pole on the New England Highway.

A sedan travelling southbound exited the roadway and struck the pole hole after 1pm, immediately to the south of the intersection with Gatton Clifton Road and Saal Road.

A Queensland Ambulance Service spokesperson said paramedics transported a female patient in a stable condition to Toowoomba Hospital.

It took some time to restore power as fire crews worked to control fires that



were sparked in the grass alongside the road.

Traffic control was in place due to smoke affecting visibility along the New England Highway.

An Ergon Energy spokesperson said the outage impacted customers from 1.15pm. Crew were able to restore supply to the majority of customers by 5.30pm with all customers restored by 10.45pm.

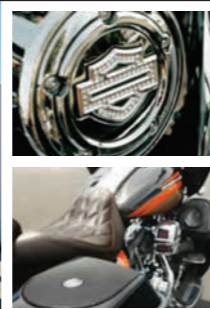

Warning About Handling Bats

Here is a timely reminder to residents of Allora as bats have been known to roost in Dalrymple Park. Darling Downs residents are being urged not to 'wing it' when it comes to sick or injured bats, after a confirmed case of Australian Bat Lyssavirus (ABLV) in Kingsthorpe. The injured animal was

found in a backyard last month, with the residents alerting appropriate authorities.

Director of Public Health and Community Medicine Dr Liam Flynn commended the members of the community for following all the right steps.

"They didn't touch or handle the bat in any way

which is really important, and means that no one was exposed," Dr Flynn said.

"A trained bat handler visited the property, collected the animal, and transported it to RSPCA."

"It was tested and found



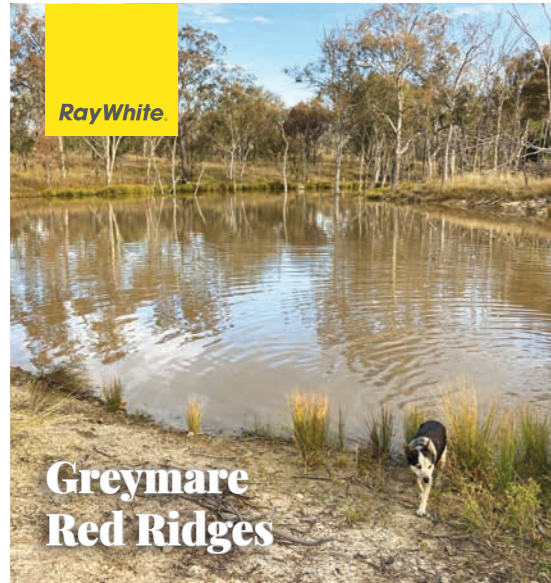
to be positive for Australian Bat Lyssavirus. This result was notified to Queensland Health and relevant follow-up was undertaken by our unit."

"Australian Bat Lyssavirus can be fatal in humans," Dr Flynn said.

"Bats should never be handled by members of the public, including if you come across a sick or injured bat, or even if the bat appears to be dead."

Only people who are trained and appropriately vaccinated should ever handle bats.

If you have been bitten, scratched or exposed to bat saliva, seek urgent medical attention or call 13 HEALTH (13 43 25 84).

A Marvellous Monarch

On Friday morning I, like everyone in our electorate of Southern Downs, woke to the news that The Queen had passed away overnight.

Although Her Majesty had been in declining health in recent times, the news that she is no longer with us came as a shock to me personally, and it appears that this feeling is shared widely throughout the world. I am sure that I am among many, many, others in feeling a pervasive and deep sadness over the news of the Queen's passing. The Queen was the only monarch that most of us have ever known, and suddenly she is no more.

My father, who was six years old when King George VI died, told me last week that he still remembers, even at that young age, the news of The King's passing, and the impact which it had on the people around him. Although our society and the world of 1952 has irreversibly changed in the intervening seventy years, my dad senses that the same instincts of loyalty and affection continue to run deep, and can be seen in the overwhelming and lovingly sad response from people everywhere and on social media at news that the Queen has died.

Yesterday my son William and I wrote messages of sympathy to the new King in a condolence book at Parliament House. Even William, at the tender age of eight, wrote a touching message expressing his sadness that he never got to meet her. I glanced through the book to see that many people, from all walks of life, truly loved and admired the Queen, and

that her long reign was a beacon of comfort, stability and certainty in our ever changing world. And I think that it was that stability, that "always being there", which made The Queen's passing such a momentous and sad event. How could something so constant and apparently everlasting come to an end?

We have lost a truly remarkable Sovereign. Throughout her seventy year reign - the longest in the over one thousand year history of the Crown - Elizabeth the Second was a tower of strength and dignity. She proved over long years that lasting and beloved leadership is not founded upon power and influence (although she nominally possessed both) but that it is about always being there and being a steadfast reference point through time and in the lives of people and nations. Throughout her long reign, The Queen faced many difficult challenges, many of which related to her role as head of her family. At these times, we have seen that The Queen was human, could change, and never forgot the duty of service that she and her family owed the people.

To me, it meant a great deal to be sworn to duty in the Queen's name. When I was commissioned as a young Flying Officer in the Royal Australian Air Force, I was proud to publicly swear an oath to The Queen and to be commissioned in her name to defend her and to resist her enemies, for the people of Australia. My Air Force commission certificate bears the signature of the Governor-General as head of state, and is stamped with the Great Seal of Australia bearing the name of Her Majesty Elizabeth the Second, Queen of Australia. And as a member of parliament, I am equally proud to have sworn an oath to her to serve the people of

Southern Downs.

I'm sure anyone who has been sworn in - from soldiers and new Australian citizens, to cub scouts and girl guides, from police to justices of the peace - would understand what I mean. It certainly meant something to the Queen herself, who set an impeccable example to us and lived always true to her coronation vows.

I wish our new King the very best as he starts his reign, and I extend my sympathies to His Majesty and his family at their sad loss.

Sorghum Cropping Opportunities

Growers eager to capitalise on summer cropping opportunities this season should be testing soil temperatures now to determine whether they can take advantage of early sowing opportunities.

The summer cropping area is expected to increase this year, with many growers missing out on planting their full winter cropping area or losing young crops to waterlogging due to ongoing wet conditions over the past few months.

The Grains Research and Development Corporation (GRDC) has invested in extensive research to improve the agronomic guidelines of summer cropping in the north and has developed ways to mitigate the high risk of heat and moisture stress during flowering.

Through numerous trials conducted by the University of Queensland, NSW Department of Primary Industries (NSW DPI) and Queensland Department of Agriculture and Fisheries, research has indicated the most effective way to avoid heat stress during flowering for summer crops, particularly sorghum, is to shift sowing windows to

earlier in the season.

NSW DPI Research Agronomist, Loretta Serafin said traditionally, optimal soil temperatures for sorghum planting have been between 16 to 18 degrees.

"The downside to that has been that growers have been unable to avoid their crops flowering at peak temperatures during summer - causing significant yield loss from moisture and heat stress," she said.

"Our research, through extensive trials, has shown there are opportunities to plant sorghum when the soil's as cold as 12 degrees as long as temperatures are rising for the following seven days.

"When testing the soil temperature, it's advised growers wait to plant until their soil is recording 12 degrees at a minimum (tested at 8am) at intended seeding depth," she said.

"Growers should also be looking at the seven day forecast for the rest of the week to help determine whether temperatures will continue to rise which is highly desirable."

"There's also an opportunity for growers to look at planting sorghum earlier and having the crop

harvested prior to winter sowing. Having the sorghum harvested earlier would give the soil profile time to fill again prior to winter sowing and growers would potentially be able to double crop the paddock into chickpeas."

Ms Serafin said while an earlier summer planting window definitely gives growers an opportunity to balance risk, it doesn't mitigate the potential for heat stress entirely.

"The important thing to note is you can never totally eliminate the risk of heat stress in summer crops - in some cases, growers will still hit a hot period when

the crop is flowering despite planting earlier but it helps to balance the risk."

"Some growers will opt to plant some of their crops earlier and some in the traditional window, which will help split the risk across the season."

"The point of this research is to give growers options with their summer cropping decisions and what best suits their farming operations."

Ms Serafin said growers looking to plant sorghum early need to consider weed management as a priority, as it's harder to manage winter weeds in a summer cropping situation.

Allora's Past 100 years ago September 1922 Phenomenon near Allora

A disturbance akin to a waterspout developed suddenly and travelled several miles over the plains between Allora and Hendon. The development commenced from a very dark cloud over East Talgai, which suddenly assumed a funnel shape which reached the ground about 20 yards in diameter. The spout in its passage over the wheat fields swept the way almost clean and lifted a heavy gate from its hinges. After travelling from about two to three miles the spout gradually lifted and finally merged with the cloud from which it had sprung.

Allora's Past 150 years ago September 1872 Warwick Police Court

Francis Brawley summoned John Garvey for assaulting and beating him on the 5th inst. The parties are labourers employed on the railway between Allora and Warwick and are neighbours living in a camp near Allora. It appeared from the evidence that bad feelings had existed between them and each of their wives for some time. This was greatly aggravated by the expressions made use of by the complainant's wife in which she taunted Mrs. Garvey on the parentage of her children. On the 5th inst. however, this culminated in the defendant striking Brawley, knocking him down and kicking him. The Bench found Garvey guilty and sentenced him to pay a fine of £2, together with £2 costs.
