St Pat's Students Experience Arts Fest









Free Energy Program For Southern Downs Farmers



Queensland Farmers' Federation is running a program for any farm in the Southern Downs and Goondiwindi Council areas.

This free program looks at on-farm energy efficiency and carbon program.

QUEENSLAND FARMERS'

The program is being sponsored by Acciona Energia, the company that's developing the Macintyre Wind Farm near Warwick.

EnergySQ will do some on-farm energy assessments and start working with farms on some

of their carbon emissions. Each farm that participates will get an Energy and Carbon Action Plan which will help them prioritise some actions to help reduce energy consumption and costs, as well as some guidance on opportunities to decarbonise.

How farmers participate -

 Individual participation - review bills, assessment, provide an Energy and Carbon action plan.

2. Cluster – same action as individuals but in a group of 8 - 12 farms with 3 short workshops over 6 -9 months to step through the process and compare notes

Looking Back...

100 years ago, "Allora Guardian" June 1898

New Flour Mill - The flour mill erected by Mr. Kates for Messrs. Clark Bros. started working on Thursday, 30th June, and the trial was in every way satisfactory. The machinery worked noiselessly and without vibration and Mr. Kates, who was present, expressed the opinion that the trial was the most satisfactory of any of the seven mills he had erected in southern Queensland.

The four story building was built by local contractors Sharpe & Leggatt. Adjoining the mill was a large grain shed capable of holding nearly 10,000 bags of wheat. The mill was driven by a 25HP steam engine and had a capacity of 10 tons of flour a day, working a double shift.

(It is interesting to note that in 1897, the Allora district produced 211.953 bushels from 12.892 acres of wheat as compared to Dalby which produced 41,370 bushels from 1.935 acres.

Following the death of Francis Kates, the flour mill was shifted to Clifton in 1901. A saw mill was built on the Allora site and leased to Joseph Sharpe.)

Proposed Railway Extension - A delegation representing the Victoria Hill Railway League met with the Allora Shire Council recently and put forward a proposal that the railway should be extended from Ellinthorpe to Victoria Hil. The delegation was headed by Mr. R. Frizzell and included Messrs. A. Frizzell, E. Cowley, H. Coupe, G. Pacholke, F. Armstrong, J. Pacholke and M. Keleher. They suggested that a benefited area, four miles on either side of the proposed line, be subject to a special tax of 10/- per acre. An alternate suggestion was that if the Council provided a decent road there would be no need for the railway extension.

Top Ag Honour For Taylor Family Produce

Being at the cutting edge of horticultural technology has helped lead Granite Belt producer Ray Taylor to a top agricultural honour.

The fourth-generation grower, who is the general manager of Taylor Family Produce, was honoured with the Award for Excellence in Technology at the 2023 Australian Farmer of the Year Awards.

Overseeing the production of icebera lettuce. wombok (Chinese cabbage), celery, cauliflower, and silverbeet, Mr Taylor's implementation of droughtproofing infrastructure such as dam covers, which reduce evaporation and will likely save about 5.9 million litres of water, lead him to one of the industry's top prizes.

Leader of the Nationals and Maranoa MP David Littleproud said it was pleasing to see an industry leader such as Mr Taylor honoured at last week's ceremony at Parliament House in Canberra.
