

Allora Homestead celebrates 40 years

An extra special celebration will take place at Allora Homestead on Friday, 21 July at 10.30am as residents, quests and staff gather to celebrate the aged care home's 40th anniversary.

Wednesday, 19th July 2023

Allora Homestead has supported families across the generations to age-in-place where they have established connection and belonging.

Southern Cross Care Queensland (SCCQ) Residential Manager Maiella Baker has served at Allora Homestead for 38 years and has supported individuals and their families at one of the most significant times of a person's life.

"There has been a kaleidoscope of change, challenges and triumphs," Majella

"There's been heartbreak, joy, but most of all, it has been so rewarding. In many ways, we've walked side by side with our residents and their families, until they reach the end of this life's road. It's truly very special and a privilege."

Maiella said Allora Homestead holds such an important place within the Southern Downs community for people who are

"I see that continuing into the future with Southern Cross Care because of what they believe in and stand up for," Majella said.

SCCQ has had the privilege of being part of Allora Homestead's history for two decades.

In 2003, the Allora District Co-operative Hospital Society Ltd transferred ownership of 'Almmerah' nursing home (now known as Allora Nursing Home). 'The Homestead' and 'Jubilee Gardens' a settlement of 10 independent living units on the same site.

SCCQ CEO Jason Eldering said the anniversary of Allora Homestead held significance.

"It's quite an occasion when we can join together to celebrate the 40th anniversary of a service which has been dedicated to serving the community, and Allora Homestead is doing just that," Jason said.

"It's a testament to the community's strength and what it can achieve collectively.

"This is a true celebration of the community inclusive of all those supporters who have gone before us at Southern Cross Care and helped support people to age in a place where they are known and loved."

Allora Homestead is one of 13 aged care homes owned and operated by SCCQ. Eight are located in rural and remote locations helping people age in place where they have established connections and belonging.

Out of control grass fire destroys caravan



A local resident at Currans Road, Deuchar was forced to call the Fire Brigade on Thursday afternoon when a small rubbish fire he had initiated spread to surrounding grass and quickly got out of control, destroying his nearby caravan.

Warwick Fire & Rescue Station and Massie & District Rural Fire Brigade attended the fire but were unable to save the caravan as it was well alight when they arrived.

The fire was quickly brought under control by the fire services, who were quick to respond to the 12.50pm call.

No one was hurt during the incident.

The resident attempted to put out the grass fire with a garden hose but it quickly spread engulfing the

caravan and jumping the fenceline into an adjoining property.

The fire highlights the risk of burning rubbish during these times of dry grass and undergrowth in rural properties without adequate means of extinguishing the fire should it get out of

A Warwick Fire & Rescue Station officer said that any rubbish fires over two metres in height requires a permit that can be obtained from the local Fire Warden.

The previous wet winter has created enormous amounts of fuel for grass fires as the favourable conditions allowed the growth of grass and bushland to prosper.

Days of high wind conditions also add to the risk of starting fires in the

Spray Drift Management Tool Now Available

Growers nationally will now be able to access a Spray Drift Management Tool (SDMT) that allows for the recalculation of spray drift buffer zones, thanks to support from the Grains Research and Development Corporation (GRDC).

The tool was made available in NSW during 2021 and 2022 as a pilot project, however its availability has now been extended Australia-wide thanks to an Australian Pesticides and Veterinary Medicines Authority (APV MA) permit. It allows applicators to use the SDMT for selected products in cereals and fallow situations.

The extension of the SDMT permit means it can now be used by all Australian grain producers as well as group and aerial pesticide applicators.

GRDC chemical regulation manager Gordon Cumming said the permit and SDMT allows a move away from "worst-case scenarios" currently printed on chemical labels.

"Most labels have a buffer zone statement, which can range from zero to 400m, and everything in between," Mr Cumming said.

"This defines the downwind distance within which pesticide application must not occur between the outer edge of the boom and the sensitive area.

"For example, when spraying a wheat crop with a canola crop downwind, you can now calculate a reduced buffer zone distance with several drift reduction strategies.

"These strategies might include a reduced product

rate, using a coarser spray quality, lowering the boom height or only spraying when there is a reduced wind speed present.

"If you punch those things into the calculator, you might find that you can reduce your buffer zone from 200m to 80m, or spray up to the fence line, instead of having to come back another day when the wind is coming from a different direction." Mr Cumming said.

This latest permit (PER 93132) allows applicators to access and use a modified version of the SDMT for 37 selected products, in cereals

and fallow situations.

When accessing the tool, users must subscribe to APVMA news updates and the pesticides newsletter to ensure they use the latest version of the modified SDMT and are asked to retain a copy of the output to include in spray records.

Both APVMA and GRDC have stressed the permit does not allow "off-label"

Wattles 1998 champions to reunite


Club will celebrate their 2023 Old Boys Day this Sunday at their Clifton based home ground Platz Oval.

Warriors Win Tenth Ragh Family Trophy

Wattles back-rower Ty Gardner played a superb captain's knock against the Southern Suburbs Tigers at Toowoomba's Gold Park on Sunday to seal a vital 32 - 14

The result saw the Warriors secure a tenth success securing the prestigious Ragh Family Trophy since its inception in 2005.

Gardner, who was named Player of the Match. led the Stillwater Pastoral Company Wattles high performing forward pack from the front, gathering a brace of tries for his trouble.

Front-rower Jacob Mouatt came off the bench and made a telling impact, also collecting two tries in arguably his best game of the season

Wattles debutant back-rower Alex Donn crossed for the initial green and gold try in the thirteenth minute, but Souths fired back with two touchdowns to lead 10 - 6.

Tyson Stevens levelled the ledger ten minutes from half time before both sides slugged it out until Mouatt crossed to allow Wattles an important 14 – 10 lead at the break

The Warriors struggled in the opening half, but team skipper Gardner was impressed with how his troops took a grip on the match in the final forty minutes.

Mouatt ran in his second touchdown in the opening minutes of the second stanza, while Gardner crossed for his two tries in the later stages.

Coach Travis Burns was more than pleased to have his team back on the winner's dais after last week's disappointment against

Burns praised his team across the park, in particular younger brigade members winger Jake Meddleton and fullback Joe Willett.

Reserve Grade - After inflicting an eight try to one walloping over Souths in their previous clash in April, the top of the table Warriors struggled against the home side Tigers on Sunday, despite scoring four tries to three in an 18 - 18

Souths leapt to a 12 - 0 lead by the 27th minute, before Wattles wily finisher Warren Draper crossed to keep his side in touch.

Centre Tim Hentschel touched down for the Warriors minutes before the break, the home side holding a 12 - 10 advantage.

Souths led 18 - 10 with eighteen minutes remaining on the game clock, before centre Braydon Wilson collected a try in the second stanza and Draper snatched his second mid-way through the half.

Wilson was in great touch throughout, as were halfback Michael Duggan, hooker Michael Marshall while fullback Alex Morris, centre Caleb King and forwards Tom, Jack and Tim Duggan were among those to shine.

Wattles try sharpshooters Wilson and Hentschel are currently level at the top of the competition try scorer tally with fifteen each.

Wattles 18 (Warren Draper 2. Tim Hentschel, Braydon Wilson tries; Alex Morris goal) drew with Southern Suburbs 18.

Under 19 - Barnstorming centre Aiden Suhan led the Tigers a merry chase contributing five tries to Wattles total in a one sided 76 - 10 win.

The Black Toyota, Wattles Warriors were unstoppable amassing fifteen tries over the seventy minutes of play.


