Emergency services were called to Warwick Allora Road, just south of town, last Tuesday afternoon, 25 July at around 1.30pm.

A Queensland Fire and Emergency Services spokesperson said three crews attended the scene from Allora, Warwick and Charlton.

had come off the road, spun around and gone through a

A Queensland Ambulance Service spokesperson said she was taken to Warwick Hospital in a stable condition with no obvious injuries but experiencing all over the body pain.

Emergency Services (QFES) personnel were sent to a grassfire along the Hendon-Victoria Hill Road at Talgai on Thursday afternoon last week.

QFES said three fire units were despatched but the fire was under control when the first of them arrived

Crews stayed on the scene until all traces of the blaze were extinguished and only grassland was destroyed.

Locals had been alerted to the blaze by a huge plume of smoke.

75 years ago, "Allora Guardian" August 1923

Rifle Shooting - Six members from the Allora Rifle Club journeyed to Brisbane to try their luck at the annual Queensland Rifle Association meeting held at Enoggera last week. The conditions were, at times, difficult for good shooting but Allora shooters had a very rewarding meet. Veteran shooter, Tom Maher, was successful in pulling off the Halliday Match over 300 and 600 yards with a score of 68 out of a possible 70. This score being the highest for this match since it was started, earning a prize of £10 and a medal. Mr Maher was unlucky with three bad shots in the first round of the King's Aggregate leaving him five points from the leader in the final.

Other Allora shooters amongst the prize winners were J.W. McCombe, P. Gartner, W.A. Moulday, G. McMillan and J.R. Smith

Goomburra Snowfall - In common with many places on the Southern Downs, Allora had its share in the snowfall that occurred on Sunday last. At Goomburra however, the snowfall was more pronounced and after the shower in the afternoon, the hills were white with snow. The appearance of the country under these conditions being described as most entrancing.



## **Classy Clement steers Pittsworth to victory**

On the back of a five-star performance by classy five-eight Brenton Clement the Pittsworth Danes rained on the Stillwater Pastoral Company Wattles Warriors run to the finals on Saturday night at Club Pittsworth, outscoring the visitors six tries to three to win 32 – 16 in front of a packed home crowd.

Two second half tries by Clement helped lift his side out of the Warriors reach and seal a success that opens an avenue for a Danes finals series run.

His outstanding performance saw Clement collect Best and Fairest Player honours, the inaugural recipient of the John Bermingham – Jamie Johnston Memorial Medalion.

It was a night to remember for the Danes, their annual Back to the Danes night highlighted by the first-grade win which along with vital premiership points allowed the Pittsworth club the first presentation of the Jack Duggan – Gary Sutton Shield.

While the Warriors were considered pre-game favourites, especially after the form they showed in their recent 12 – 10 win over the Warwick Cowboys, the clash with the Danes was considered a danger game.

Pittsworth coach James Quinn was ecstatic with the result and performance of his team

They claimed first points through a try by back-rower Mitch Revell, and while the Warriors replied with two tries by hooker Zac Stevens and centre Austin Jennings to lead late in the first half, it was Pittsworth that held a 16 – 12 halftime advantage.

Round 13 - This Saturday has the Wattles Warriors heading west to take on the Junior Boars at Goondiwindi's Gilbert Oval.




