

The best in the world, with some right here in Queensland, will show their skills in this precision aerobatic sport performing a set of manoeuvres in front of the judges and the spectators.

All the action kicks off this Friday 19 August. Then the following Friday August 25 the semi-finals will be held with the finals on Saturday August 26. Gates will open from 8.15 each day.

more than half a million dollars into








Welcome to Allora's new addition to the cultural scene - it's the Art Market now located at 72 Herbert Street.



Farmers Urged To Help Stop Labor's Fresh Food Tax

Leader of the Nationals and Member for Maranoa David Littleproud is urging farmers and families in Maranoa to help stop Labor's fresh food tax, by registering interest to have their say online.


Consultation has now opened into Labor's Sustainable Funding to Strengthen Biosecurity – Have Your Say - Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry.

Mr Littleproud said farmers and families in 2024 would be impacted by Labor's new tax, which would push up the price of fresh food.

"In my electorate of Maranoa, 6982 farmers are likely to be affected by this new tax, which comes into effect on July 1, 2024," Mr Littleproud said.

"Farmers make up 10.6 per cent of workers in my electorate of Maranoa. Farmers are critical to our region as they support rural communities and provide us with fresh, healthy and affordable food.

"The new tax on farmers will inevitably be passed onto consumers, which means even higher grocery bills for those in Maranoa.



The new tax is a biosecurity levy on farmers, set at a rate equivalent of 10 per cent of the 2020-21 industry-led levies.

Mr Littleproud added it had been almost three months since the Budget and there was still no new information into the



A Rooster hat trick brings home Boars bacon

They call him Austin 'Rooster' Jennings, and on Sunday he ran in three tries to help propel the Wattles top graders to a 34 - 32 victory over the Goondiwindi Boars at Gilbert Oval. a win that has locked the Stillwater Pastoral Company Warriors in the top five.

In what has been a nervous couple of weeks, the Wattles continue their hold on the fourth rung of the TRL Hutchison Builders premiership ladder after finishing ahead of the gutsy Boars outfit.

The Round 17 fixtures resulted in each club pocketing a win and a draw scoring 88 points apiece overall from the three fiercely contested fixtures.

The A Grade clash finished in a supreme nailbiter after the home side Boars scored virtually as the full-time siren sounded to ease within two points of the Warriors and trail 32 - 34. with a conversion attempt to come after the hooter.

The auicksilver centre's length of the field effort in the 21st minute could be considered a game changer, but full marks to the Boars. they fought their way back to nearly claim game honours when young Under 19 star Trae Bonnetto touched down with seconds on the match clock.

Goal kicking played a vital role in the result. and Wattles halfback Brayden Paix's five from seven successes proved invaluable after the eighty minutes

The match was decided in the final minute when Wattles Mick Marshall crossed, converted bv






At the recent DDRSA Short Course Championships, he broke 6 age records plus two open age
