Southern Downs Regional Council is offering free water efficient showerheads and sprinklers through its residential water saving device exchange program to help the community continue to reduce water consumption and be waterwise.

Director of Environment and Planning Scott Riley said the program is a timely reminder to residents connected to the reticulated network to not become complacent about the importance of sustainable water saving practices.

"Approximately 40% of household water is used outdoors and showers account for around 34% of household water usage, so it's good practice to swap old showerheads and sprinklers for our free water saving devices

The new Dignity Vending Machine is located outside the female toilets at the Warwick Library and dispenses free #PinkBox


Period Packs, containing six tampons and two pads.

Over the past four or five years former Elphinstone State School students have discussed holding a reunion of some sort.

With 2023 being the Diamond Jubilee year of the school closing, a group of past pupils Ian Sobbe, Kerry Cranitch, Neville Wright and Tim Bourke have formed a committee that will organise the reunion

Looking back at the School's history -

Elphinstone State School was first opened in May 1888 by Miss Kate Connolly in a barn owned by Mr Bourke of "Woody Camp".

The school was moved to its final location in 1919 on the corner of Dungannon Road and Cranitch Road.

The final school building, used from 1927 to 1963, had originally belonged to the first Goomburra School.

The school was shut in 1963, with students transferring to schools in Clifton, including the then recently opened Clifton State High School.

The school building was moved to Allora, then to Talgai Homestead and then to the property of Sam Rodgers of Hendon.

Mr Sobbe said there have been preliminary discussions with the Education Department regarding erecting a sign in front of the old school site on the corner of Dungannon and Cranitch roads to memorialise the school.

The school's second last principal, Mr Peter Cullen is still alive and although he is unable to attend the reunion, he has written about his memories which will be read on the day.

Mr Sobbe said there are plans for boards to be in place for attendees to put up their old photos and any memorabilia. There will also be ample opportunity to share

The reunion will be held at Rudd's Pub in Nobby on Saturday. 18 November from 10am.

The Back

Farming Systems Discussion Forum to share research findings



Grain growers across the region can expect to benefit from key insights such as most profitable crop and fertiliser choices, as the latest research into northern farming systems is released at next month's discussion forum at Pittsworth.

The Queensland Department Agriculture and Fisheries, NSW Department

Primary Industries and CSIRO have come together with the Grains Research and Development Corporation (GRDC) to hold a forum at Pittsworth which will discuss the outcomes of an intensive 8-year research journey, delving deep into the intricacies of farming system options across the region.

Principal development extension officer at DAF Jayne Gentry said that the performance of farming

system options across the region will be the key point of discussion at the forum.

"Our research has compared crop intensity, crop choice, higher fertiliser rates, increased use of grain legumes, and pasture phases in northern farming systems.

"We're hoping to facilitate conversations that allow practical on-farm applications of the research outcomes across a range of areas," she says.

This free event will be held at Pittsworth Motor Inn, 51 Helens Street on Wednesday 4th October from 8.30am to 1pm.

Son of Spartacus heralds NIOA's next generation "We put Spartacus with Holly

The first bull calf by record sale-topping sire Yarrawonga Spartacus S316 (P) has arrived. heralding a new generation of champions for NIOA Santa Gertrudis.

The calf, out of Riverslea Holly (P), was born (Eds: Wednesday, August 30) at NIOA's Talgai Homestead-based stud at Allora.

Holly, purchased by NIOA from Riverslea Santa Gertrudis in 2014, is also the mother of NIOA Marksman, the 2018 Sydney Royal Easter Show Grand Champion.

Spartacus was introduced to the NIOA bull battery last November after NIOA paid a then Australian record breed price of \$250,000 at the Bassingthwaighte

family's Yarrawonga Gertrudis annual sale.

He is the grandson of 2014 Brisbane Ekka Grand Champion Yarrawonga Corvette H730 (P), described by the Wallumbilla stud as "without doubt, the best bull that Yarrawonga has produced".

NIOA Santa Gertrudis general manager Shannon Gardner said the son of Spartacus had all the credentials of his champion bloodlines.

"He's got quality written all over him," he said. "We have been focussed on developing genetic depth in our herd and have been very excited about what the Yarrawonga bloodlines would add to our breeding program.

NIOA Santa Gertrudis has welcomed the first bull calf by Yarrawonga


