
How Matthew Claimed the Crown

Asserting his dominance from his first throw, the gentle giant of Australian athletics opened his Eugene campaign with a throw of 64.97m to take the lead, before being relegated to third after the completion of the second round. Matthew hovered in place contention before a clutch final-attempt saw him unleash 68.43m to claim the crown.

"I'm very happy with this today and it's a great way to end the year. I thought I was in good nick but it was good to connect and put it together on the last meet of the year when a lot of other people might be fried or over this season," Denny said.

Denny defeated global heavyweights. secondplace getter and former world champion Kristjan Ceh (Slovenia, 67.64m) and reigning Olympic and world champion Daniel Stahl (Sweden, 67.36), giving him a boost of confidence having narrowly missed out on a podium at the World Athletics Championships in Hungary, last month.

"I was pretty keen to make amends for Budapest, so I'm happy with that. To get the win on one of the biggest

comps of the year makes the fourth-place a little less sour in my mouth to say the least," Denny said.

"Nothing has really changed in regards to my focus for next vear. I want to win (the Paris Olympic Games) and be on top, but this confirms my thoughts that I can mix it with the boys and take on those guys who are supposedly unbeatable. It's either catch up or get left behind, and I don't want to get left behind. I want to compete and I respect these guys, but it's about being able to step up when it counts."

Local Nuffield Scholar seeks a fair energy transition for farmers and regional communities

Sally Higgins (daughter of Sue and Phil Higgins) has been awarded a Nuffield Scholarship for 2024, supported by Agrifutures.

The Nuffield Scholarship is a prestigious international scholarship to emerging leaders in agriculture. Each scholar receives a \$35,000 bursary to invest in travel and research. They visit, learn from, and collaborate with some of the world's leading agricultural businesses and research institutions. The research is driven by farmers, in collaboration with their respective industries a proven recipe for success, which helps scholars learn and their industries prosper.

From now until December 2024, Sally will travel across the world, exploring the most effective government, industry and farm business models for prioritizing land uses that meet multiple objectives. Sally will explore how Australian agriculture can best plan and prepare for the large-scale land use changes resulting from climate change and the transition to net zero.

"The transition to net zero emissions is a live debate in Australia," Sally says.

"I am passionate about making sure that farmers and regional communities like Allora fairly benefit from the development that will occur. We need to make sure that we deeply consider the important role land plays in food production as well as the need to implement landbased climate solutions."

For Sally, this topic hits close to home, with the construction of several renewable energy projects across the Southern Downs region.

"Allora has historically been a farming region but increasingly, our farms are becoming dynamic systems of multipurpose landscapes where traditional farming commodities co-exist with carbon farming, biodiversity, agritourism, and renewable enerav".

Taking over grandparent's cattle and cropping farm two years ago has been a period of "rapid learning" for Sally and her partner Gus Somes.

"The farming community of Allora is a big part of what gets me excited for my future career in agriculture. There are so many incredibly smart, innovative and resilient farmers in our own community. I look forward to continuing to learn from them along this journey."

Update on Cunninghams Gap reconstruction

Final preparations are underway ahead of repairs to a two-kilometre section of the Cunningham Highway at Cunninghams Gap, which was extensively damaged by the 2019 bushfires.

The work, which will be completed by the Department of Transport and Main Roads, will occur from Monday 9 October through to Friday 8 December 2023. Road users could experience intermittent delays of up to 30 minutes when travelling through Cunninghams Gap between the hours of 6am to 6pm, Monday to Friday, excluding public holidays.

Scaling and stabilisation works will continue over the coming months on the slope above the road. This work will be undertaken by highly skilled rope access technicians.

Activities to be undertaken below the road during this time will include vegetation removal, earth-

works, drainage and construction of retaining walls.

Further traffic changes can be expected throughout the project including in early 2024, with 24-hour, seven-day-a-week stop/slow traffic conditions

for up to three months.

Earlier this year, extensive engagement was undertaken with local businesses and neighbouring communities to gain a deeper understanding into travel movements through the Gap. The information provided was very valuable and has resulted in a review of some elements of the project to minimise disruption to road users.


sister of St Joseph with a special Mass on Sunday in Allora with all welcome to attend

Sunday Fires Keep Brigades Busy

Rural Fire Services were busy on Sunday afternoon after a series of fires broke out along the Cunningham Highway.

Fires were reported at Gladfield, Maryvale, Tregony and the top of Cunninghams Gap.

Queensland Fire and Emergency Services despatched several crews from Maryvale-Gladfield, Freestone and Allora Rural Fire Services to combat the blazes.

The fires created a serious smoke hazard along the Highway and Transport and Main Roads personnel were called out to assist with traffic control.

By nightfall, the fires were under control and since that time, Queensland Parks and Wildlife Service teams have been monitoring them.

Fire Safety Advice



Every year QFES responds to fires that threaten people, property and the environment. Some of these fires escape from smaller fires that are part of permitted activities and some are caused by irresponsible behaviour.

If camping, before you light a fire - check for current fire bans.

- Check with local council if a permit is required to camp or have campfires or barbecues, or if there are any local restrictions which prohibit the lighting of fire, the positioning of the fire, and if it must be contained within a brazier, fire pit or similar device.
- If you are camping in a National

Park check the Queensland Parks and Wildlife Service website for any restrictions on lighting fires.

- Make sure you put your campfire out with water when you have finished with it. Water will extinguish and cool a fire to much safer temperatures to avoid burns.
- Fires left to self-extinguish and those extinguished with sand or dirt can spontaneously re-ignite and retain higher heat levels for longer periods, which can result in serious burns.
- Leave stones in place to mark the fire location to make them easy to spot and encourage others to use the same place.

If people are careful with fire, the loss and damage can be greatly reduced.

MLA launches new bushfire preparation/recovery manual

Ahead of this year's summer bushfire season, Meat & Livestock Australia (MLA) has created a new resource to help livestock producers prepare and recover.

The new manual: Bushfire preparation and recovery: A manual for livestock producers reinforces the fact that bushfire preparation needs to occur more than once a year or just at the start of summer.

Dr Michael Laurence, Program Manager of Animal Wellbeing at MLA said it was essential for producers to ensure they were 'bushfire ready' every summer. "The best way to prepare for fire is to do a reasonable amount of work regularly, throughout the year, every year," he said. The manual incorporates

lessons from the Black Summer bushfires of 2019–20, which deeply affected producers and had a significant impact on the agricultural community, with thousands of farms affected by losses of livestock, land and property.

The manual includes a template to help producers create a farm fire plan for their property. It also details practical, implementable steps producers can take for year-round fire preparation and planning and what

to do when a bushfire is approaching a property, including organising emergency feed and evacuating livestock to a safe refuge area.

In addition to the Bushfire

manual, a Bushfire hub has been created on the MLA website which includes the manual, videos and support services to help producers prepare and recover from a bushfire.

When a storm is coming

The Bureau of Meteorology always issues warnings when storms are likely and once you know one is on the way it's wise to act appropriately.

Before a storm approaches:

- · Tie down or store away any outdoor furniture or other items in the yard, such as trampolines
- · Move vehicles undercover
- If the forecast has been for a potentially severe storm, tape your windows in an X pattern with strong packing tape to reduce the chances of windows breaking during strong winds
- Ensure your pets are safe, preferably inside your
- · Unplug all electrical appliances
- · Stay tuned to your local radio station for storm updates

Stay safe during a storm event


When a storm hits,

- · If you are outside, find a safe place to shelter from the storm - not under trees.
- When at home during a storm, stay indoors, away from windows and glass doors.
- Stay tuned to radio or TV for updates
- · If you're driving, stop somewhere away from power lines and trees and if possible, under shelter
- Never enter flooded waterways
- If an emergency arises, call triple zero - 000 for Ambulance, Fire Brigade or Police

After the storm passes

- Once you are certain the storm has moved away:
- Ensure everyone is safe including your neighbours
- Be aware of any fallen powerlines and stay clear
- · Check for any damage
- If you need assistance, contact the SES on 132 500
- If there is property damage, take photographs - they will be useful if you are making an insurance claim






