Allora Police Report

RESULT OF GECK STREET THEFT

Following on from the previous fortnight's report regarding a car entry and theft occurring in Geck Street, Allora on Saturday morning 7th October. As a result of investigations conducted into the complaint, on Tuesday morning 10th October, Allora Police executed a search warrant on a Forde Street residence to successfully locate and recover the stolen designer handbag and laptop computer. The owners were very happy to have them returned (and still in good condition). Police inquiries are continuing however, with respect to the suspected involvement of several juveniles in the initial theft.

GRASS FIRES ON NEW ENGLAND HIGHWAY

On Tuesday afternoon 17th October, local Police and Fire Services were called to attend a series of small fires commenced just north of town on the New

England Highway nearby to Batterhams Road. In total, 5 fires were detected on the western edge of the roadway, spread out over a kilometre or so. Due to timely attendance and intervention by Emergency Service crews, major crop loss was averted and no other property damaged. Police are investigating on the basis the fires are considered suspicious. While several people have approached Police with the description of a vehicle seen in the area at that particular time, Allora Police are urging anyone with information or potential dashcam footage to contact them on (07) 4666 3222.

SCOOTER INCIDENT

On Wednesday afternoon 18th October, "attendees" to a local Allora hotel establishment were provided free entertainment when they observed an off-duty Allora Police Officer intercept a young couple riding an unregistered scooter into town, with the intention of buying "supplies" (liquor, that is). The pair were intercepted and spoken with in Herbert Street. The owner and

controller of the vehicle was ticketed a total of \$1178 for riding an unregistered & uninsured motor vehicle which also bore false registration plates. The female passenger was ticketed \$464 and 3 points for not wearing a helmet, during a similar trip into town which had been previously reported.

VEHICLE CAUSES FIRE AT HENDON

Shortly before midday on Thursday 19th October, Police and local Fire Services again were called, to a fire initiated on the Warwick Allora Rd, just south of the Hendon turn-off. The fire was started unintentionally, when the driver of a northbound car pulled up on the roadside when his vehicle experienced a mechanical issue. The heat from the underside of the vehicle

caused the dry, roadside grass into which he had stopped, to ignite. The car soon became engulfed with the nearby grass then catching alight very quickly and running into adjoining properties. While several houses on the western side of the road were initially under threat, the actions of local Allora and Warwick Fire Services, with multiple Rural Fire Units (Allora, Massie, Freestone, Cambooya to name a few - with thanks), prevented any other property loss or injury. The rapidly expanding fire, assisted by the dry conditions and rising wind, was halted altogether, through the additional deployment of 2 helicopters and 2 fixed wing aircraft.

Local Fire Ban



Queensland Fire and Emergency Services (QFES) has imposed a local fire ban for South Western Region residents.

The local fire ban is now in place for residents in the Toowoomba, Southern Downs, Western Downs, Goondiwindi, Maranoa and Balonne Local Government Areas.

Current fire conditions are perfect for bushfires to ignite and spread quickly.

Under a local fire ban all open fires are prohibited and all Permits to Light Fire which have been issued in the designated areas have been suspended for the

duration of the ban.

Power tools may be used during a local fire ban however QFES encourages people to use these with extreme care and ensure adequate equipment is available to extinguish any fire which may start.

This may include having a person available to watch out for any ignitions that occur.

The ban is expected to remain in place until 2359hrs on Friday 27 October.

Any students raising over \$100 have the opportunity to slime the Principal.

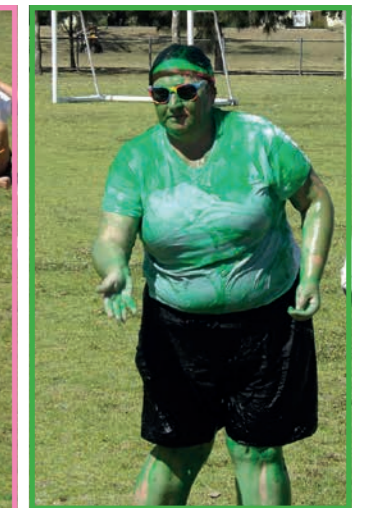
Megan was slimed 21 times by 21 enthusiastic students.

"Our rivers, creeks, wetlands and lakes also provide us with safe drinking water, enable recreational activities such as fishing, swimming, and boating, provide habitat for unique flora and fauna, and sustain ecosystems that enable our crops and stock to thrive."

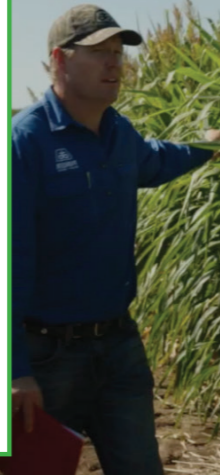

“How’s That” for K O Masters Oval

In 2021, SDRC approved a grant to the Allora Sports Club toward the cost of sinking a water bore at the K O Masters Cricket Oval in Allora. The bore was sunk at a discounted price by Sam Darr from Darr Drilling and Will Duff provided the electrical services under the same arrangement. The Department of Natural Resources approved an extension of the Sports Club’s water allocation to include the cricket ground bore.

During 2022 the Sports Club applied for a grant through the Department of Sport and Recreation to install an irrigation system to water the entire cricket oval. The grant was submitted on behalf of the Allora and Victoria Hill Cricket clubs. It had become clear that the Allora cricket oval’s playing surface was not up to the standard required and we were in danger of losing our home games to ovals in Warwick.

The Department of Sport and Recreation approved a

grant of \$95,500 towards the cost of the irrigation system and local business Warrego Water was the successful tenderer for the job. There have been a number of long delays in getting the system installed, however it is finally fully operational. The system is highly sophisticated and totally automatic, making it easier for the hard working volunteers who maintain the oval.

Allora has a long and successful association with

cricket, producing many quality players who went on to represent at district and state levels. Some of us remember playing with the first generation of May brothers, Ronny, Keith, Errol and Lindsay when the game was played with a “take no prisoners” edict. If you dropped a catch off Ronny’s bowling on Sunday you had to avoid him all the next week.

The cricket oval is perfectly located adjacent to the Allora State School and is available for use by the students at all times. It is also used for athletics, football training, jogging and walking.

The Sports Club will need an increased water


