With more than 30 wheelie bins worth of rubbish illegally dumped each month across the region, it's time for residents to see it, report it, stop it.

Sort-It Sally said reporting illegal dumping was about being a good community citizen and ensuring that ratepayer dollars are not unnecessarily wasted on paying for avoidable cleanup bills.

"Illegal dumping is unsightly and messy, wrong! It presents serious environmental, health and safety impacts by polluting our region's pristine environment and making our picturesque landscape look untidy and uncared for," Sort-It Sally said.

Littering is the unlawful deposit of less than 200 litres of waste and illegal dumping is the unlawful deposit of 200 litres or more of waste.

Council's Regulatory Services Team a dedicated officer investigating illegal dumping across the region, however if you witness someone littering or illegally dumping, please contact Council on 1300 697 372 to report an incident. Penalties may apply to an alleged offender if there is sufficient information to identify them.






