Senior Sergeant Damian

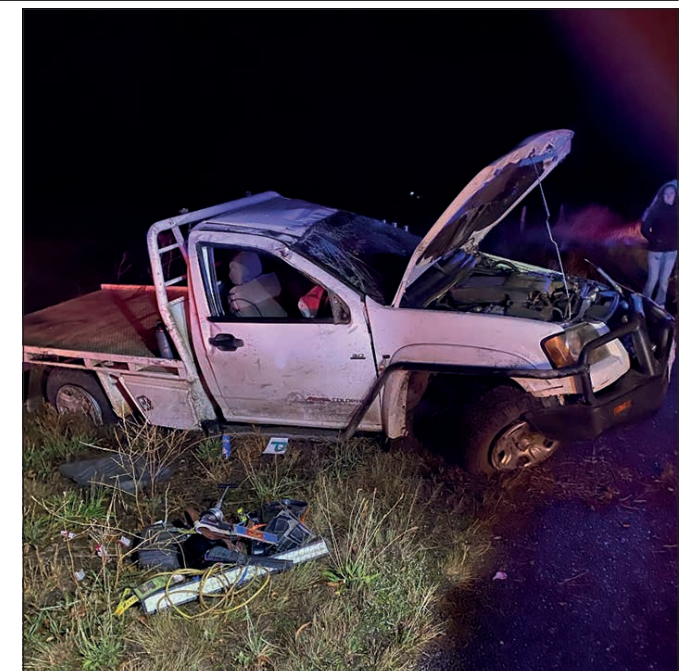
Grace of Allora Police said investigations revealed that the driver, a male from Willowvale, had fallen asleep at the wheel.

Can You Grow a Humungus Pumpkin?

Well - you're eligible to enter the Ekka's giant pumpkin competition!

Bragging rights and a pocket full of money.

More than \$3,000 in prizemoney, including a bonus prize of \$1,000 for the heaviest pumpkin over 350kg.

The prize money on offer for the Open and Youth classes is \$600 for first place, \$400 for second and \$300 for third.

All pumpkins over 80kg are eligible for the coveted title of Champion Heaviest Pumpkin of Show and \$850.

Veggie patch kings and queens and 2023 Champion Heaviest Pumpkin of the Show title winner, Downlands College, will be back in 2024 hoping to recreate their history-making win.

Last year the College was the first school ever to take top honours over an Open Class competitor with their giant 202kg pumpkin.

The minimum weight for entry into the Youth/School class is 10kg and the competition is curriculum-aligned for Foundation to Grade 8, planting the seed of knowledge about the importance of agriculture.

Minden grower Geoff Frohloff holds the Ekka giant pumpkin record of 215kg, set in 2015.

Sort-It Sally Not Happy



Southern Downs Regional Council's waste education warrior, Sort-It Sally wants to keep our region clean and beautiful, and she is calling on the community to help sort out illegal dumping on the Southern Downs.

With more than 30 wheelie bins worth of rubbish illegally dumped each month across the region, it's time for residents to see it, report it, stop it.

Sort-It Sally said reporting illegal dumping was about being a good community citizen and ensuring that ratepayer dollars are not unnecessarily wasted on paying for avoidable clean-up bills.

"Illegal dumping is messy, unsightly and wrong! It presents serious

environmental, health and safety impacts by polluting our region's pristine environment and making our picturesque landscape look untidy and uncared for," Sort-It Sally said.

Littering is the unlawful deposit of less than 200 litres of waste and illegal dumping is the unlawful deposit of 200 litres or more of waste.

Council's Regulatory Services Team has a dedicated officer investigating illegal dumping across the region, however if you witness someone littering or illegally dumping, please contact Council on 1300 697 372 to report an incident. Penalties may apply to an alleged offender if there is sufficient information to identify them.

Allora's Annual Rotary Open Swim Carnival A Huge Success

A record number of 240 swimmers participated with 61 from the Allora Swim Club with this being the first swimming carnival for some of the younger swimmers. The event drew swimmers from Cunnamulla to Toowoomba and everywhere in between representing a total of 18 clubs. Also in attendance were clubs from the Western Downs that have been impacted by bushfires in the past month. In a show of support, the

Allora Club used this event as a way of fundraising for these affected communities and \$500 was raised.

Of the nearly 200 races held on the day there were many records broken and personal bests achieved. Among these were Allora Swim Club members Alyssa White, who broke her own record in the girls 15 and over 50m butterfly, Paige Priebbenow, who set a new record in the 11yrs girls 50m backstroke, and Maeve

Moore, who broke both the 11yrs girls 50m breaststroke and 50m freestyle records. Allora Pool Leasee Andrew Fidge said "the quality of swimming talent coming through the Club and the Downs in general continues to impress. It's wonderful to see young swimmers developing their skills and enjoying the sport.

The Seamus Ryan Memorial Breaststroke Sprint is becoming a highlight of the program

in its third year, an event created in the memory of past Allora Swim Club member, Seamus Ryan. The atmosphere was electric during both races as each swimmer had their times handicapped to equalize the field. The finishes were extremely close with Mannat Pandher from The Glennie Swim Club winning the girls race and Oliver McAuley from Inglewood Swim Club winning the boys.

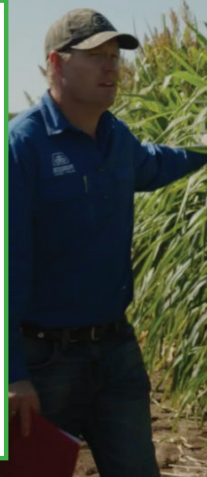

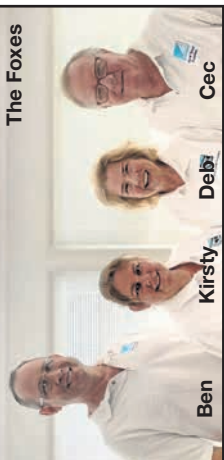

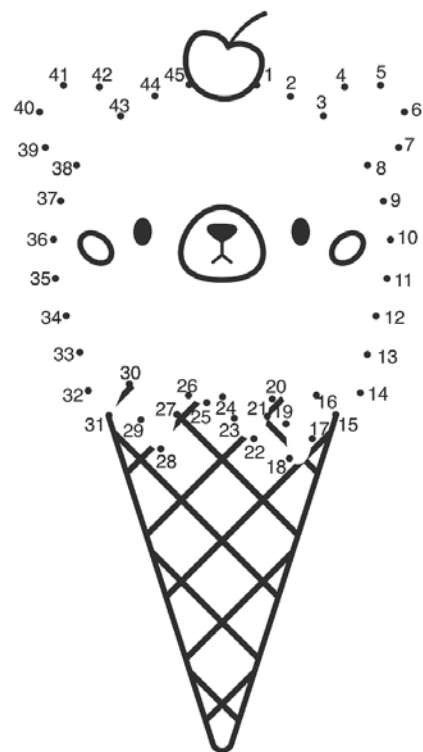
